

Council Finishes Year's Business By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council met on a rainy, windy Monday night. All councilors and mayor were present though several were not feeling well.

Nearly half the two hour meeting was taken up by H.G.E. engineer Matt Gray. His presentation concerned the water system master plan Revised Priority I budget. This included several changes from city council's previously approved budget but the bottom line cost remains \$1,542,240. Gray also had a short list of additional project components he presented to the council at a cost of \$46,000. Councilor Ralph Donaldson was interested in how much money the city could get from granting agencies. He advised letting city manager Dotti Myers find how much the granting agencies will give Port Orford. Donaldson made it clear that water rates would not be determined by any vote the council took that evening. Councilor George Kennedy made a motion to approve the Revised Priority I budget with the additional components. The motion passed 5-1. Donaldson then made a motion to authorized the city manager to advise H.G.E. to go out and seek funding for the project and that this in no way financially obligates the city council. It passed 5-1.

Ralph Donaldson gave a brief public works report. He said the city owed the public works department a debt of gratitude for the many extra hours they have been working during the recent storms. He thanked Janelle Haller for donating strip heaters to the Youth Center. He announced the city has hired a new public works director. His name is Jerry McNurlin and he will begin work on December 26. Donaldson said Alan Wagner continue with the city as assistant director of public works at his current salary.

The mayor filled several vacancies on city commissions. Midge Hayes was named to the watershed council. Ed McQuade was appointed local zone manager for the Enterprise Zone. Ellen Warring and Justin Bauman were reappointed to the planning commission. Don Chambers and Janelle Haller were appointed to fill two vacancies on the planning commission.

The council discussed the BMI draft ordinance on cross connections. The councilors had many concerns about this draft ordinance including if it is mandatory and what is required. A motion was made to table discussion of this issue. Dotti Myers will check with the city manager of Brookings to see how they are handling this as well as finding out the

minimum the city can do under the mandates of the cross connection ordinance.

The council approved a contract to hire a RARE intern with the cost to Port Orford not to exceed \$2,200 with the rest of the cost coming from grants. This person will work on the city master recreation plan.

The council approved a motion requesting ODOT locate a Wayfinder's Sign in Port Orford.

The council set dates for evaluating the municipal judge, police chief and city manager. The judge and police chief will be evaluated before January 31, 1997 and city manager between March 1 and 18, 1997.

Dotti Myers gave a brief management report. She said the city had raised \$10,000 more than anticipated from traffic fines. She recommended hiring a second police officer in January with another grant from the Federal "COPS" program.

The council will not hold a workshop meeting this month. Therefore unless an emergency comes up this was the last council meeting for Delaine Kennedy as mayor and George Kennedy and Martha Weaver-Britell as councilors. Their terms

Highlights of this year's house include the upstairs children's bedroom where the North Curry Families' and Children's


Center decorated a tree and displayed throughout the room an extensive collection of dolls and other toys.



Heritage Society

"Curious about our Lifesaving Station at Port Orford Heads?" asks Viola Cuatt, president of the Point Orford Heritage Society. According to Cuatt, everyone is welcome to attend the open house scheduled for December 14th between 1pm and 5pm. When society members will be available to answer questions and give tours. In early 1997, the Point Orford Heritage Society plans to open a museum, interpretive center and gift shop in the former Coast Guard station. In the meantime, the historic site, now a state park, is under restoration. "Come see what we've done!" Cuatt warmly invites, proud to show off the accomplishments of society volunteers and state parks personnel. With seed grants from the City of Port Orford and donations from businesses and private citizens, the Heritage Society is right on track with the improvements needed to open the station to the public.

Port Orford's Coast Guard Lifesaving Station was essential to the local economy for many years. Primarily protecting fishermen and providing lifesaving services on the remote south coast, the coast guardsmen stationed at the Heads also saw dramatic action during WW II when a Japanese submarine torpedoed an oil tanker and launched the first plane to drop a bomb on American soil. "The State Historic Preservation Office experts say that our site will be listed in the National Register. Probably in early 1997," Cuatt claims.

Meanwhile, a trip to Port Orford's former Coast Guard Station is a beautiful excursion for a Saturday afternoon. The public is invited to join Heritage Society members for refreshments and tours between 1pm and 5pm on Saturday, December 14, 1996. "Let's celebrate the season and remember our heritage of good faith, family and friends," President Cuatt concludes.






Sablefish

The Pacific Fishery Management Council adopted an equal allocation management plan for the 1997 Primary Fixed Gear Sablefish Fishery. All LE GF Sablefish-Endorsed Permits have three weeks to fish up to the same limit, estimated to be 33,500 lb. At the end of the fishing period, the landings will be totaled, and there will be a mop-up fishery

Equal limits management is a significant departure from how the fishery has been managed in the past. It addresses safety and better marketing conditions; yet the Council expressed concern about the reallocative effect of equal limits. This has been a hotly contested allocation battle between two industry groups. The Council continues to be under heavy pressure to base any long-term management plan on historical landings.

If this equal limits plan is to remain on the table for future consideration, the Council and NMFS must hear from supporters of the plan. We have to off-set the tantrum and heavy lobbying being done by that segment of the industry determined to have historic catch be the only basis for an allocation plan.

There is a second reason NMFS and the Council need confirmation that they made the right decision; the industry group supporting historic landings allocation has declared their intent to sue the Council due to the reallocative effects of the '97 plan. The most valuable thing we can do in support of equal limits is to rein-

force to Council members that they made the correct decision.

Let's get together and strategize how to be effective in supporting equal limits management for the 1997 Sablefish fishery, and develop a strategy for long-term management of the fishery.

There will be a meeting on December 14, from 10am till 2pm at the Port Orford City Council Chamber. This meeting will be to develop a strategy to use to support the Pacific Fishery Management Council in their decision for the 1997 Sablefish season. The meeting will also be to develop a strategy to send a message to the Pacific Fishery Management Council that all groundfish management should be uniform; Sablefish managed with monthly trip limits, adjusted during the year as necessary.

Presently, groundfish management is based on a year-round fishery. A twelve month season for Sablefish would require very small monthly trip limits to be set. What is a better length of season for the Sablefish fishery? Before discussing uniform management of groundfish, there needs to be complete analysis of how groundfish is presently being managed, any changes being considered or developed for groundfish management, and the direction the trawl fleet is moving on how they want the fishery managed.

Attend this meeting: Help ensure a long term Sablefish management plan we can live with.
