

Race Future in Doubt By Evan Kramer



The Port Orford Chamber of Commerce held a press conference on New Year's eve at the Wheelhouse Restaurant to discuss the future of auto racing at Cape Blanco State Airport.

The Chamber had received a letter from Lindy Zimmerman, Department of Transportation, Aeronautics Division on September 24, 1998 stating "no further race activity will be allowed on the airport." The Chamber responded to Zimmerman's letter with a letter asking Zimmerman to reconsider and allow the racing to continue. They included a letter from Gary M. Dietel, Physical Engineer, about the condition of the airport runway surface. He states in that letter "Structurally, lightweight race cars pose no threat to the runway surface." Dietel recommended planning for future pavement reconditioning.

Chamber member John Ineson led the press conference off with an overview of the history of the Team Continental racing events, which have been an annual event since 1993. He said the Chamber and Team Continental have one more year left on their five-year permit. He

said the Chamber and Oregon Department of Transportation Aeronautics Division are co-petitioners for the alternative use of the airport.

Sixes Fire Chief Joe Yost told the press that two people in his fire district have applied to lease and build hangers at the airport. They are George Welch and Paul Liddy. He said Welch wants to build an airplane kit manufacturing plant.

Ineson said the races bring 600 people into town over the Labor Day race weekend.

County Commissioner Bill Roberts attended the meeting on behalf of the county. He referred to the five-year contract. He urged the Chamber to get set up for this year and then work on a plan for the airport. Joe Yost asked if industry at the airport would bring more into town than the races. Chamber member Frank Smith agreed that industry would bring more into town. Yost is a member of the Cape Blanco Airport Association, which has adopted the airport.

Ineson said Aeronautics decision to cancel the races was being influenced by pilots. He said the Chamber has worked closely with Aeronautics for six years. He spoke about the September letter from Lindy Zimmerman of Aeronautics in which the Chamber had been given no

advance notice or hint about the plans to cancel the races.

Ineson urged members of the public who want to see the races continue at the airport turn in letters of support to the Chamber office or write directly to Aeronautics

Bill Roberts observed that the real goal is to use the airport as an airport. He said the County Commissioners would be more than happy to contact Aeronautics on behalf of the Chamber supporting the Labor Day races.

Zimmerman's September 24, 1998 letter to Chamber member Jim Campbell notifying the Chamber that race activity would no longer be allowed stated the reason as "deterioration of the operating surfaces of the airport, and the hard use caused by the races." John Ineson said Aeronautics had not substantiated or proven these claims.

Joe Yost said the race cars are digging up the surface of the runway in the turns and that the surface is deteriorating.

John Ineson said that the Cape Blanco Airport Association had never approached the Chamber with their problems with race usage but the Chamber would be delighted to meet with them.

Letter to the Editor,

The small community of Port Orford has an amazing ability to grab major news headlines. The Wayfinder wall controversy, the sewage treatment outfall subsiding into the ocean and now the cancellation of the sports car races at Cape Blanco State Airport as reported in the Sunday Oregonian January 3.

After fifty-five years of neglect it is a testament to the original engineering that the Cape Blanco runway is in such good condition. It is evident though that a limited faction is claiming that sports car racing, for four days once a year is putting the surface in jeopardy. To quote from a letter provided by a civil engineer after on the ground inspection.

"The surface is in excellent condition and the past activities have not and the proposed like activities would not pose any significant problems to the runway surface. The structure was designed to withstand pounding and severe lateral loads (touchdown shearing action). Structurally lightweight race cars pose no threat to the runway surface."

However it is claimed by one of those in opposition to future autoracing at this site

that damage is visible from the air, amazing eyesight. It is claimed by another member of this small faction that, though there is no documentation of this event, a jet plane flew in but would not return due to pebbles worked loose from the runway by the action of the race cars. When racing was first started at Cape Blanco it was found that the surface was so covered by years of debris that traction was very difficult. The whole surface is therefore brushed and washed before and after every meeting. The runway and taxiways are the cleanest they have been in decades.

All of those involved in the presentation of the sports car racing at Cape Blanco State Airport believe that the facility is a great asset to our community and look forward to it being developed to its full capacity. Meanwhile though the majority of our community are aware of the considerable financial benefit and the great deal of enjoyment that the auto races have provided. Team Continental have always eagerly anticipated their annual visit to our area and the great welcome we have always given them. Many have returned at other times in the year to enjoy the southern Oregon Coast.

Changes at Texaco

On December 1, 1998 we (Davis Oil) purchased the station and property from Monty and have since then began making some modifications to the building to better serve the people of Port Orford.

For many years we have has a strong demand from people in Langlois to Gold Beach area to install a "Pacific Pride Commercial Cardlock" on the Southern Oregon Coast. We have listened to the public's demand and we are now able to fulfill their wish. When the Port Orford project is complete, we will have remodeled and updated our Texaco building with a new office and storage areas. Also we are a building a brand new ground-up Pacific Pride cardlock. This will be a 24hour, 7 day a week fueling location for all commercial users who qualify.

It will be complete with high speed pumping units, state of the art electronics and create a new, clean, well-lit addition to downtown Port Orford. The Texaco fueling station will not be disturbed and it will continue to run normal. Later this year we plan to update the Texaco station with new fuel pumps. 

Race Future in Doubt continued from front cover

Bill Roberts spoke about the importance of maintenance continuing at the airport. Frank Smith estimated the donated labor to upgrade the airport over the past six years to be worth \$60,000.

Team Continental 1999 race chairman Dave Kimes spoke about the \$12,000 his group has invested in the airport. He said Team Continental's goal is to build a pure racetrack (not at the airport). He said the deterioration at Cape Blanco Airport had been caused by grass growing up through the surface. Kimes said Team Continental has lost money on the races every year and reiterated their need for a full time facility in the area on about 60 acres. Bill Roberts asked what the races generate the community. Kimes said the real winners are the local businesses. He estimated race car participants spend \$250 per day for all their expenses. He said there were 200 entrants in 1998 representing 137 cars with an average of four people in each crew.

Kimes suggested a Port Orford Racer's Association. He said if we had a permanent facility we could have races more than one weekend a year. Team Continental will cancel the 1999 races no later than January 9 if the Division of Aeronautics has not changed their decision. The reason for this is Team Continental needs to complete their 1999 race schedule.

In the early 80's I was awarded a contract with Heart-ABC to do a series of 10 TV segments on "Herbal Medicine in your Kitchen." The series would form part of a presentation aimed at the educated woman who was unable to leave her home. I had absolutely no experience in front of a TV camera, but they like my material and I guess my New Zealand accent, and they billed me as star and coproducer. I gave it a good go, but after 3 hours and 4 unsuccessful attempts, I wasn't making it. A voice crackled "Take Five," and I was led off the set by a friend Alyce Finell, producer and Emmy winner. She said that I was doing very well, but that my energy had fallen off-and we all needed to take a break. She put a saucer of red powder in front of me-"Now you're going to take some of your own advice, here's some Cayenne Pepper-you know what to do." There was no spoon so I took a large pinch of the pepper in my fingers, dropped it in a glass of water, swirled it and drank it down, then I went to the men's room and returned to the set. This would be the last chance to get a good segment today.

As I stood waiting for the countdown, I became aware of a warming sensation way below my belt.

Lights! Camera! Action – and I was into my presentation on garlic. But the warmth became an incredible burning and then a fierce fire. I realized what had happened-I had handled Cayenne in my fingers and then went to the bathroom without washing my hands first.

Oh Man – there was nothing to do but keep going. I had fire in my pants, my energy level soared, I came alive-this was a new me-and it was over in no time.

The voice crackled "In the can," which means that's the one we keep, the crew broke into cheers and applauded, Alyce hugged me and then collapsed into laughter when I told her what had propelled me into stardom.
