

**Playing in Port Orford's  
Back Yard**

### Port Orford's Backyard By Evan Kramer



What to do on Sunday? I could mow the lawn and trim the hedges and trees and continue to do battle with rampant blackberry vines or I could take a hike.

That choice was easy enough and I went for the walk in the woods. Malcolm Young and I headed out Sunday morning to play in Port Orford's backyard. Since I had been hiking in Port Orford's "front yard" coastal state parks and beaches recently I thought a walk in the Siskiyou National Forest to the east of Port Orford would be a nice change of pace. We headed southeast on Elk River Road for Iron Mountain – a place I'd hiked to once before several years ago with the Audubon Society. The Forest Service might think their roads are well marked but we got lost briefly once but were found through the use of a map and compass. Much of the road to Iron Mountain is gravel but is in pretty good shape (watch those large rocks in the road) except for one bad slump in the road that almost scared me off. You don't need a four-wheel drive for the excursion.

We finally found the parking area for Iron Mountain and by then all three of us

including Myrtle the dog were eager to get away from the truck and talk a walk. We set out for the Iron Mountain forest lookout but trudged right past it and kept walking for a couple of miles. I couldn't figure out what happened to the high spot that the former fire lookout was located on. On the way back I noticed a small trail jutting off to the north and an innocuous looking Forest Service sign signifying the trail to the lookout. Talk about steep – taking that short hike is a real aerobic workout especially since the trail is on a bed of loose rock. Once on top the view was worth the effort. Other than one nearby mountain to the northwest the view offers a fantastic 360-degree panorama of the Siskiyou National Forest. It's easy to see why they chose this spot for the location of a fire lookout.

The trail we walked was on the crest of the mountain and there were no streams or any standing water on it. Fortunately I brought about two quarts of water which kept Myrtle from overheating even though it was a very mild day with cloud cover some of the time. One of the most special things we saw besides three tall radio towers located along the trail were many bear grass plants in bloom. The plant sends up stalks about eighteen inches to two feet above the leaves. At the tip of the stalk is a bulb that as it blooms produces dozens of small white delicate flowers.

According to the book **Plants of the Pacific Northwest Coast** bear grass got its name because bears eat the leaf bases in spring. There were many other wildflowers in bloom in this area including a lot of irises. We saw few birds other than a large group of turkey vultures on the road up to Iron Mountain.

It may be 15 miles the way the crow flies to Iron Mountain but by car or truck it is a 30 mile drive from Elk River Road and Highway 101, the first half of which is paved and the rest gravel. Considering it was two days before the first day of summer there were few other people playing in Port Orford's backyard. There were moments of silence when the quiet was truly wonderful. No cars, planes, radios nor wind. Just quiet.

The Siskiyou National Forest comprises 1,200,000 acres to the east and south and a little to the north of Port Orford. It is divided into several ranger districts including the Powers District, which covers Iron Mountain. The Powers District takes in 140,000 acres. I called the Powers office to get a little more background on Iron Mountain and their operation in general. I spoke with Robin McAlpin, Operations Manager, Powers Ranger District. He was the one who gave me the acreage figures and confirmed

**Grand Opening Ceremony**

Umpqua Community Development Corporation (CDC) held a grand opening ceremony for their Cedar Point Cottages development on Friday afternoon. It is located on the east side of Arizona Street south of Paradise Point Road. The project consists of 10 separate single family houses and one community building/laundry. There are 8 three-bedroom houses each approximately 1,100 square feet in size and 2 two-bedroom handicap accessible houses at 900 square feet each.

The houses will be rented to families earning 40-50% of the Curry County median income. There is already a waiting list to rent the houses. They will be rented to people on a first come, first served basis. Renters will have to pass a financial and criminal check. Rents for the three bedroom units will be \$403 while the two bedroom units will go for \$343 a month.

Umpqua CDC official Betty Tam thanked builder-developer John Zia for the great job he did on the project. Some of the special features Zia incorporated into the houses are cathedral ceilings, radiant heating, decks in back of the houses, refrigerators and stoves, and full-length mirrors on the closet doors. The parking for the development is all outside with no garages but each unit comes with a 4' x 8' attached storage shed.

Zia said the construction cost of the project was \$625,000 with the land costing \$100,000. His workers were putting the final touches on the project Friday afternoon.

Several members of the Port Orford city council and planning commission attended the ceremony including former councilor Carl Eskelson. He was largely responsible for the development being counted as eleven hook-ups to the city sewer and water system. At one point in

the planning phase the developer wanted to call the ten houses five duplexes with five hook-up fees but Eskelson was insistent on each one being counted individually. This resulted in the city receiving \$44,000 in sewer and water hook-up fees for the project.


Betty Tam said the houses would be not be occupied until at least mid-July because the new and enlarged city water line to the development on Arizona Street has not been put in yet. Johnny Alexander said on Monday morning that bids would be opened on Thursday, June 24, for the water line project. He said the water line from Arizona Street and Geer Circle north to the Cedar Point Cottages would be changed from a 4 inch to a ten-inch water line. He expected the water line project to be finished by mid July.

## **Street Teacher By Graeme Graydon**



Before going to India, I was warned about the beggars who were everywhere on the streets. I had never come to terms with people who wanted a "quarter for a cup of coffee." A friend of mine planned to take a pocketful of nickels with him, I didn't know what I was going to do. For a week in New Delhi, no one bothered me but I watched parents get their children ready, not for school, but a morning's beggings. Bright, playful kids acting starved and miserable. One morning, I set out with 3 bananas in my pocket. As if on cue a boy came up to me, torn clothing, dirty, one hand holding his aching belly with such a look of misery on his face. I placed a banana into his little, outstretched hand. He looked at it in disbelief, his act forgotten, then he grinned sheepishly and tucked the banana away out of sight. As I walked away, I was already uncomfortable. Yes, I had proved my point but something didn't feel right – I ate the remaining bananas. The lesson

wasn't over yet. My friend, with the hoard of nickels couldn't give one away without being swarmed by a following of persistent, raggy, kids expertly targeting their prey.

A couple of days later, walking near Connaught Circle, I was approached by a young man. He was neatly dressed – a soft grey shirt and trousers, quite handsome, well groomed, he could have been a college grad at a tennis party. Our eyes met and he greeted me respectfully in perfect English. This one was special. But my mind was saying 'Watch out – this could be a trick.' Sure enough, without a word he held out his arms. The hands were missing, his forearms ended in stumps. I had not noticed. Shocked, I looked into his dark eyes again – such dignity and calm. But my mind won again – he was a beggar and I don't give to beggars. Besides, I'm just about broke myself. I shook my head sadly and walked away. If I had spoken it would have been – "I'm sorry, you see, I have this rule, and I can't give to you." Confused and disturbed, I turned a corner and moved out of his sight. Moments later I stopped, overwhelmed by a feeling that still has no words. It was as if "I" was trying to wake

"me" up. If that man wasn't worthy of my charity, who could be? I looked at my beautiful hands. How could I not give him every penny I had on me. Go back to him, find him! Move! Now! ## Logging Operation By Evan Kramer

Last Thursday afternoon Katherine Wiggins, Oregon Department of Forestry Forest Practices Officer took Jay Stoler, Jim Britell, Councilor Norm Leeling, Nathaniel Wander and myself to the Sorenson logging operation on the 140 acre Wilken tract. We drove up in her van and began our tour in the middle of a big clear cut on a large flat section of the property.

Wiggins talked about the cost of reforestation of the property and estimated it at \$450 per acre for the six-year period of time. That's how long State Forestry is involved in the process starting with the notification from the property owner through the logging of the property, replanting and final inspection six years after logging was completed to ensure that trees are growing on the property. The Bussmann property on North Fork Hubbard Creek will be up for its six-year inspection next year.

Wiggins gave us some mixed messages about what part of the property would be logged but we straightened them out. First she told us Sorenson Logging was only going to log the flat portions of the property and stop at the slope breaks. However, the group of us learned the difference between a slope break and a steep slope break in a hurry. Wiggins took us on a hike down to the North Fork of Hubbard Creek. We started walking

down a slope break and then hit a point where the slope break steepened noticeably. This was the point at which **no** logging will occur, not the beginning of the slope break.

Wiggins spoke about a home site and clearing nearby that was causing some sediment increase in the North Fork.

We spoke with Bob Wyatt who works for Sorenson Logging. He told us the company had logged 25 acres so far. He estimated 15 acres would remain unlogged in Riparian Management Areas (RMA) leaving a total of 125 acres of harvestable land. Wyatt told me on Tuesday that Sorenson Logging is finalizing plans that will keep the company from bringing logging trucks over the sensitive "crossing" area and redirect over a different area.

Wiggins took us to an area known as the "crossing", which was a road over a culvert through which, flowed the main stem of North Fork Hubbard Creek. She showed us an example of what changes had occurred. We saw a series of pink ribbons marking off the original RMA, which were 20-25 feet from the creek and a new set of ribbons marking the revised RMA. The RMA is now approximately 100 feet wide and offers a lot more protection for the main fork and the tributaries. This is due to the city and private citizen efforts including letters and meetings with the Department of Forestry and Sorenson Logging.

I asked Wiggins after we had returned to City Hall where the money to fund the Department of Forestry comes from. She replied it comes from a tax on harvested timber. She had talked earlier about doing more tours of the logging site and can be contacted by phone at (541) 267-4136 or by e-mail at [kwiggins@odf.state.us](mailto:kwiggins@odf.state.us).

Wiggins sent me an e-mail last week in an attempt to correct a couple of statements I made in articles about the Sorenson logging. I referred to the Sorenson logging permit. According to Wiggins "there is no such beast." She goes on to state "when a landowner wishes to commercially harvest timber, the only requirement is **notification** to the State." Wiggins goes on to state "Once a notification is filed and a 15 day waiting period completed, then logging can start except for areas affected by written plan requirements."

Wiggins has been very cooperative with the city, press and private citizens and is taking a hands-on approach to this logging operation.

the former fire lookout. Then we got on the subject of Forest Service trails. I hadn't seen a sign at the beginning of the Iron Mountain trail indicating a fee was required but McAlpin told me all major forest entrances/trailheads require a fee of \$3.00 per day per car. This is part of the Forest Service's Trail Park Pass demonstration system. McAlpin said the trailheads are marked that are part of this demonstration but as I said I didn't see a sign though he did tell me many people steal or destroy the signs.

Trail Park passes are not available for sale in Port Orford. They are available in Gold Beach at the Rogue River Outdoor Store and the Forest Service office. McAlpin said the Forest Service is looking for a store in Port Orford to sell the passes. I don't want to take on another cause but the trail park pass program is a major inconvenience to the public and a source of very little revenue to the Forest Service. McAlpin did add that you don't need a pass to walk on decommissioned logging roads or cross-country.

As Woody Guthrie said, "This land is your land, this land is our land..." Go out and enjoy our land.
