

## Robert Warring Improving By Evan Kramer



Robert Warring's medical condition has improved dramatically since last week. He was released from the Intensive Care unit at Sacred Heart Hospi-

tal in Eugene last Friday. He was moved to a regular room to continue his recuperation from, among other things, pneumonia and kidney failure. I spoke with Bob on Monday afternoon and he was talking about getting released soon (possibly by Thursday). He made it clear he is really looking forward to getting out of the hospital. He'll be going to stay with his friends John and Margaret Jones in Bridge for a couple of weeks to recuperate before coming back home to Port Orford which is high on his agenda.

#### **Boat Back Home**

The Coast Guard life-saving boat has come back home to Port Orford. The 38-foot long boat had been on display at the Port of Bandon until Wednesday of last week. It was finally moved to Port Orford on Wednesday and is now parked in back of the Coast Guard barracks building at the Port Orford Heads State Park. Several area fishermen assisted in the tricky and difficult move of the nearly 10,000 pound

wooden boat including Dave Knapp, Scott Macdonald, Darrel Cobb, Buck Dezern, Doug Karl, Tyler Long, and Mike Richter.

The life-saving boat isn't exactly home, as during its years of service it was stationed in Nellie's Cove down the hill from the Coast Guard headquarters. When an emergency call came in the men stationed in Port Orford had to run down a series of 500 steps to get to the boathouse and then out into the ocean. Eventually the Point Orford Heritage Society and Oregon State Parks will work out an exact location for the boat. Frank Cramer. was instrumental in bringing this historic boat back Port Orford where it belongs. He negotiated with the Port of Bandon for its return to Port Orford and was involved in the moving operation on Wednesday.

#### First Storm

The first storm of the fall/winter season hit Port Orford last Wednesday and shook things up down at the Port of Port Orford. The effects of the high winds and storm surge cost Laskey-Clifton three days progress on the new dock. According to Tom Wright, Laskey Clifton project manager they lost a day for the storm, a day for the high surge and a day repairing the damage. He estimated the company only lost one hundred yards of

fill material due to the storm. Company employees were busy working on Sunday making up for lost time. They installed several pieces of sheet pile and have now made considerable progress on the first four cells of the new dock, which is where the temporary boat hoist will be, located. The temporary boat hoist will be placed on cells #3 and 4. Wright said Port employees will be trained on operating the hoist on November 8 and 9 at a cost to Laskey-Clifton of \$2200. He emphasized Port employees will be operating the temporary hoist and not Laskey-Clifton employees.

The old wooden dock may be reduced in size but it is still a functioning dock and Port. On Tuesday morning Port employee Larry Dell said there were eighteen commercial boats out fishing for salmon and bottom fish.

The first storm of the year also caused severe wave overtopping of the dunes (or what's left of them) at Agate Beach bordering Garrison Lake. As a result the lake rose at least two feet and was awash in massive amounts of kelp, drift wood, foam and salt water and sea gulls. Public Works director Jerry McNurlin said he saw evidence of saltwater in Garrison Lake as far back as the Highway 101 bridge.

### **County Prenatal Care**

Curry County has one of the lowest early prenatal care rates in the State of Oregon. In 1998, only 57% of pregnant women received care in the first three months of their pregnancy. This is down from 78% the year before!

### What is prenatal care?

Prenatal care refers to specific health care women and their growing babies need throughout a pregnancy. During each prenatal care visit, a pregnant woman can expect her blood pressure and weight to be taken, the growth of her baby to be checked, and lab tests may be done. Her provider will also discuss the importance of maintaining a healthy diet and refraining from drugs, alcohol and smoking.

Women who don't get early prenatal care are much more likely to have babies who are sick, have a low birthweight and need additional medical that is often very costly. Starting prenatal care early – **as** 

### soon as you think you might be preg-

**nant** – gives women the best chance of having a healthy baby. Every pregnancy is different and every pregnancy needs early prenatal care because it can discover small problems before they turn into big ones.

#### What about cost?

Finances are often a concern with any pregnancy and a major reason why women postpone early prenatal care. For those who qualify, the Oregon Health Plan (OHP) covers physician services, prenatal and newborn care, checkups, prescriptions and hospital services. Most importantly, the OHP will cover services from the time in which a pregnant woman's application is datestamped. Meaning, you do not have to wait to receive your OHP care to receive pre-natal care! The income allowance is more generous for a pregnant woman and there is no monthly premium for pregnant women covered by OHP.

### Where can I find support?

For more information please call the Health Department in Gold Beach at 247-7011, extension 265. Oregon Health Plan applications and application assistance are available at Curry General Hospital, Adult and Family Services, and at the Public Health Department. All of these agencies are committed to helping pregnant women and encourage contact for more information regarding the services they offer. As a community we must remember it is never too early to start loving a child.



The RAD Outdoor Club (Recreation +Adventure =Developing Jobs for Teens) provided an opportunity for a Pacific High School Student in the recreation field this summer. MarVi Shumaker-Pruitt took the challenge of participating on a four day commercial raft trip down the wild and scenic stretch of the Rogue River with Ouzel Outfitters. The RAD Outdoor club is part of a program that is being offered by North Curry Family and Children's Center, and Pacific High School where students learn and practice outdoor skills by participating and leading outings for themselves as well as others in the community. Club members showing a mastery in skills and a commitment to the club are offered job experiences in the outdoor recreation field. MarVi worked hand in hand with three other professional River Guides leading a group of ten customers down the white water river. She helped greet and prepare the customers for their trip, helped pack and load the boats, learned how to read water and maneuver the different rafts through class IV white water, as well as helped cook and do other camp chores. This column was created to help keep taxpayers up to date with new improvements and changes since the passage of a \$1.5 million general obligation bond last May. Bond funds are earmarked for building and equipment updates only. Bond dollars cannot be used to pay expenses, staff salaries or benefits.

Hospital contractors currently are 90 percent finished with the roof replacement project, the number one priority of bondfunded capital improvements.

The district continues to offer mammography patients from Port Orford and Brookings a complimentary brunch and free van rides to the hospital's new, state of the art mammography unit. The new machine replaced the former mobile unit that broke last summer. Bets Byrtus, coordinator of Curry General Hospital's

Breast Health Network, says the hospital regrets the inconvenience, but stresses that the importance of early detection has not diminished. To make a mammogram appointment, phone the radiology department at (541) 247-6621 or 1-800-445-8085, extension 117.

The Curry Breast Health Network has hired Gerri Livingston of Brookings, a longtime health services advocate, to run a new early detection incentive program made possible by Avon's Breast Cancer Awareness Crusade and the National Alliance of Breast Organizations.

The Curry Health District recently received notice of federal funding to improve health services in the North County area, including outreach programs and patient education projects. Funding is for \$150,180 for the first of a possible three-year period. Details will be announced later.

Curry Family Medical staff welcomes Liza Sampson, M.D., family practice resident from Billings, Montana. She will work in the clinic and see patients from November 15 to December 12.

Closure of the Brookings Clinic was effective October 31. While the District hopes it will be temporary, an immediate closure was necessary because continued operation would have been a financial burden to the Curry Health District. The clinic was opened as an emergency measure in July to provide services for more

than 700 patients on the Oregon Health Plan. The patients were left with only one other Brookings area doctor when contractors for the Oregon Health Plan ended their contract with Randy Garcia, M.D. The popular clinic was more than paying for itself until a lawsuit from another Brookings physician, Dr. Mark Silver, forced the closure.

A citizen's group – The Port Orford Family Health Care Advisory Council held its first session Wednesday, October 27. The group heard techniques and tips for recruiting and retaining health care providers. The speaker was Scott Ekblad with the Oregon Office of Rural Health Care at Oregon Health Sciences University. Ekblad has managed the state's rural recruitment service for more than seven years.

The hospital laboratory recently acquired a new Y2K-compatible computer to replace a model that would not comply.

The hospital is accepting and reviewing proposals for a proposed assisted living center in Gold Beach that would help balance finances throughout the district. A request for proposal is being developed to obtain bids for the project.

#### **Final Election Results**

08/28 Initiative Petition 1 (Fee based access to public lands) was passed 4,920 to 1,964 (71.68%). This means the voters must approve fee-based projects.

Acting City Administrator Martha Weaver-Britell said the City's North Fork Hubbard Creek water supply survived this first storm. The water treatment plant was temporarily shut down because of increased turbidity but was back on line by the weekend. She made a point of telling me the logging on the Sorenson 140-acre tract did not necessarily cause the increased turbidity. State Forest Practice's officer Kathy Wiggins walked the Sorenson logging site on Friday and told the City it looked good and the protective measures Sorenson put in place were holding up.

Weaver-Britell said KCM/Tetra Tech has not begun the geotechnical research in the ocean off Agate Beach. The company they hired to provide the boat and divers, Advanced American Diving held off last week because of ocean conditions. This work when completed will send a signal to DEQ that the City is making progress in replacing their drain field.

## The Grump Graeme Graydon

Living in a close relationship is a lot like

flying a small plane. You just can't point the nose of the plane towards where you want to go and expect it to stay on track.

you have to make continual adjustments. The plane will stay on course only if you keep working at it. I suspect that my experience of the ups and downs, of happy and not so happy — are not completely unique to me. I'm not the only man in this town who thinks that he is responsible for just about everything in his marriage.

Having hit a pocket of this particular turbulence again, I woke yesterday in a grumpy mood unable to see the bright side of anything, having spent a restless night listening to some part of me criticize and find fault with the rest of Me. the One who is doing his best, dancing as hard as He can, but, according to this other self, not making a very good job of it.

Monique didn't even ask if I wanted to "work" on why I was so grumpy - she insisted. "Work" means using the tools that we have been taught, to uncover whatever it is that is producing the "not so happy" - and the main tool is to name the emotion and then look for where we have felt that same emotion before. It has noth-

ing to do with blaming anyone - after all I had the grumpies, which was my choice - grumpiness was my reaction. I could choose to be a little bit grumpy or very grumpy. It didn't matter, it was still being a pain in the behind and she had a vested interest 'in helping me out of it. Who wants to live with a Grump?

This kind of work is never easy for me. -I don't like to admit painful feelings, but we steadily traced them, back to a beginning moment almost sixty years ago. My little mother who had been 'installing Black-Out curtains (as a precaution against enemy air attack) hit her thumb with a hammer. The wound caused her to pass out and then shortly after, in frightful pain, she unloaded some of her deeply concealed emotional pain. In her anguish she looked 'into the sky and cried out: "All men whant you for, is..." And then she broke into sobbing. I couldn't move, I felt completely powerless. She must mean my father who I worshipped, and I included myself for - was I not a man? Decades later, from scraps of family lore, I guessed that her innocence had been shattered by her own father. From those few half-understood words, which weren't even directed at me, a program was embedded deep in me of attitudes and beliefs of myself as a man and of the women who I would love. A program which had nothing to do with me - was downloaded into my files, which would influence every moment of any relationship I would ever have with the female gender.

It amazes me that every attitude or opinion that I have ever had about such things as other races, other religions, clothing, hairstyle, food, rich people, poor people, has been coloured by someone else. It astounds me to consider that my Truth, my Rules for me, were all influenced by something that had little or nothing to do with my choice, years ago, - and will remain that way for the rest of this life pushing and pulling at me, until I go for the "Happy" and do something about it.\
