Fire Board Vacancies By Evan Kramer



Because of actions taken at the Tuesday, May 30, Port Orford Rural Fire District Board of Directors meeting there are now four vacancies on that

board. Board members Gayle Wilcox, Richard Mijs, Vern Larson and Frank Smith all resigned at the brief meeting held at the Elk River Fire Station. Smith served as chairman of the board and Larson as treasurer. Secretary, Brice Wagner was the only one of the five-member board who did not resign.

Resolving the situation is now in the hands of the three-member board of Curry County Commissioners. They met on Monday morning and as part of their agenda announced the four vacancies on the Port Orford Rural Fire Board. The Commissioners will appoint four persons to fill the openings. The important thing to notice is they are on a fast track to fill the four vacancies. Applications to serve on the Rural Fire Board must be received by the County Commissioners no later than Tuesday, June 13, at 5:00pm. Your letter of interest in filling one of the openings can be faxed to the Commissioner's office at 247-2718 or mailed to them at PO Box 746, Gold Beach, Oregon 97444. The Commissioners will fill the vacancies at their Monday, June 19, meeting, which begins at 10:00am. It will be held in the Commissioner's Hearing Room, 94235 Moore Street, Gold Beach.

Both Richard Mijs and Gayle Wilcox submitted a joint statement of resignation and after that Vern Larson submitted his reasoning for leaving the board and then resigned. Frank Smith was the fourth board member to resign. He did not provide a written statement but instead spoke briefly before resigning.

Smith told those gathered at the Elk River Fire station that it was Port Orford Fire Chief George Gehrke who had asked him to fill the vacancy created when Bill McMullen resigned. Smith talked about a \$1500 repair job to an engine that should have gone out to bid. He said he was put in his place and told it should go to Foster's Garage. Smith said he never had a secret meeting with board members Vern Larson and Brice Wagner. Smith said he had never disrespected any of the firemen. He continued that "being not appreciated is tough" and finished by saying "I hereby submit my resignation."

Mijs - Wilcox Statement

We, Gayle Wilcox and Richard Mijs, regretfully submit our resignations as Port

Orford Rural Fire Board Directors. We find that we can no longer be affiliated with the current Board of Directors for the following reasons:

- The majority of the board does not give the Fire Chief and his department the respect and consideration due to these dedicated people in the their community service role.
- The majority of the board has created such an atmosphere of distrust between itself and the Port Orford Volunteer Department that the members have called for the resignation of the said majority.
- The majority of the board has created an atmosphere of distrust in the Cedar Terrace area of its district, if not within the entire district.
- 4. The majority of the board has engaged in un-posted and illegal meetings.
- Members of the board have publicly demeaned the members of the Port Orford Volunteer Department and its Chief. These same members have consistently failed to protect the safety of the Fire Department.
- 6. The Chairman of the Board has

Installation of new officers will be June 30 at the Boat Works in Bandon.


The Fishing Derby went real well. There were 56 youngsters fishing on May 13. A good time was had by all and some big fish were caught.

Each child will be assisted by our hatchery staff, and will be allowed to catch up to three nice trout to take home. We will allow only two anglers to fish at a time, so each child will get a good chance to catch their fish and have a lot of fun!

You may have to wait a while for your turn to fish, so it might be a good idea to bring a snack and something to drink. This event will be held rain or shine, so be ready to fish in any weather!

We provide rods, reels, hooks, bait and plastic bags for kids to use while angling during this event, and we highly encourage our young angling friends to take their catch home. We will also give away great prizes to every angler, just like last year. Prizes include fishing tackle, rods and reels, mail boat trips and much more. Parents are invited to take photographs and movies, but we ask that you stand back away from the pond so the fish will stay active for anglers.

Scholarships







scheduled meetings without informing all board members.

- The May 9 meeting of the Rural Fire Board was conducted disgracefully and inconsistently. The public in attendance was treated rudely and with disregard and disrespect. They were not allowed to speak and threatened with arrest if they did so. The chairman of the Board did abuse the 911 systems by using it to call law enforcement to have the Assistant Chief removed from the meeting for speaking publicly. The Chairman subsequently charged the Assistant Chief with disorderly conduct. (A misdemeanor punishable with a \$2000 fine).
- 8. The decision of Board Chairman Frank Smith to hold all further Board meetings at the Elk River Fire Station jeopardizes the safety of the majority of the district. It requires the members of the Fire Department who wish to attend meetings to be at the far end of the district rather than more centrally located.

9. As Board Directors, regardless of how we vote or what we say, we are equally responsible for the actions of the Board. As we cannot support or condone the actions or behavior of the Board, we will no longer be able to accept the responsibility of Board Directors.

It is with regret we resign, but not only are we completely ineffectual in our positions; we feel our continued presence on the Board lends it credibility and legitimacy undeserved. This decision has been carefully considered. While we do not wish to abdicate our commitment and responsibility to our constituency, we find we cannot fulfill our commitment and responsibilities.
