## **Community Health Grant By Evan Kramer**



I attended the meeting last Thursday concerning the North Curry Community Health Grant (also known as the wellness and preventative health grant) held at

the A-Frame cabin in Buffington Park. Grant Program Coordinator Cathy Boden lured me to the meeting when she told me they would be serving John's tofu paté. The meeting was an opportunity for people to comment on what has already taken place and add their suggestions for this year and next year's activities.

Gerry Livingston wrote the grant on behalf of Curry Health District three years ago specifically for North Curry County and Curry Family Medical Clinic. The grant is focused on four major health problems in this area. They are lung disease, heart disease, diabetes and cancer. The grant was for \$400,000 and to cover a three-year period with \$150,000 budgeted the first year, \$130,00 the second year and \$120,000 the third and final year. The federal Rural Health Outreach Program awarded the money.

The grant just wrapped up its first year and is now in its second year. Several

very successful events were held last year sponsored by the grant including the free women's health clinic and the free men's health clinic. What surprised some people was the men's health clinic outdrawing the women's. The men's clinic drew 100 participants. The health grant and co-sponsors the Port Orford Arts Council and the Rotary Club put on the Dance into Health Kudana African Marimba Band dance at the Community Building in September. The building was packed and the buzz is everybody wants them to come back to Port Orford. Cathy Boden is busy working on bringing them back to Port Orford this year.

The calendar of Health Grant events got off to a successful start this year on Saturday, January 6, when 75 people attended the Massage Fair at the Senior Center. Other events planned for 2001 include a free women's health clinic which will be held on Wednesday, May 19 at the Curry Family Medical Clinic. The free men's health clinic takes place on Wednesday, June 13, at the Curry Family Medical Clinic. Also in June the grant will sponsor a Health Fair at the annual Coos-Curry Electric Co-op meeting which will be held on Saturday, June 23, at Pacific High School.

The grant sponsors a monthly hike which they have named "Exploring our Back

Yard series. The next one conveniently takes place this Saturday, February 10. Hikers assemble at the A-Frame cabin in Buffington Park at 10:00am and then carpool to Grassy Knob for a hike. Cathy Boden told me there were twenty one people at the hike in January with two thirds of them from out of the Port Orford area.


Another aspect of the grant is the ongoing Walk-On which people can participate in whenever they desire. This is a 6.6-mile walk through Port Orford. This is a sanctioned Volkswalk and once you start at the Visitor Center at Battle Rock Park all you have to do is follow the fish and if necessary consult with the Walk On map available at the Visitor Center and Fun Zone.

The grant was written so that none of the money goes into Curry General Hospital administration. A large part of the grant money goes to pay for a percentage of the doctor's salaries at Curry Family Medical in an effort to stabilize the clinic and increase the patient load. The Health District was obligated to provide some in-kind contributions.

When the grant runs out at the end of the three years it does not contain a virus that will then cost the taxpayers money.

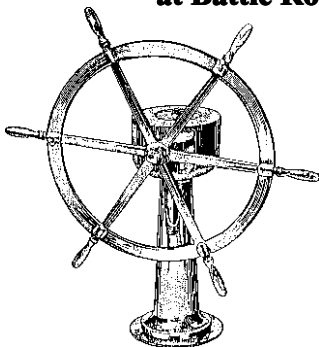
**Recycling Newsprint**

Newsprint is one of the easier papers to collect for recycling and to be processed into paper that can be used again. Newsprint is the softer paper on which newspapers such as the Port Orford News or the Oregonian are printed. Newsprint is also used to print all the advertising flyers from hardware and grocery stores because it is less expensive paper.

These flyers, which appear in your post office box each week, can be easily recycled. When you go the Post Office, simply drop all store flyers, plus unwanted newspaper, into the specially marked waste can. Please put only newsprint in the middle can, just to the right of the high table. A community volunteer will collect the newsprint and take it to the large bin in the parking lot at Ray's Food Place.

## **The Garden by Graeme Graydon**



I've been a gardener all my life, not the greatest, but I had some ideas about what works and what doesn't. I had experimented with bio-dynamic, raised beds,

companion planting, composting and planting by the moon, but when I was asked to create a big vegetable garden – late in the season at an altitude of 4000 feet, high in a National Forest, I was out of my depth, thinking that it couldn't work. It was so late that I had to take whatever seed was left – at one dollar for 10 packets, and I managed to scrounge the last 80 tomato plants in the Rogue Valley – plants that no one else would buy. It so happened that I read a book “Perelandra”, by Machaelle Small Wright, just at that time. It tells of her saga from a novice gardener to a wildly successful grower, using a simple muscle-test that gave her “yes” or “no” answers to any question about her garden. Just what I needed. This was the one time that I would have to work with Nature – I cer-

tainly couldn't do it my way. It would mean that I wouldn't do anything without clear direction, from the test.

I sat on a stump, surveying a freshly tilled expanse of rich earth with my first question. What shape would the garden be? (Machaelles' garden had spiraled from a center point into a big circle). Using her technique, I found a center-point and marked it with a stake. The layout that evolved was not what I had expected – a 3 foot wide, raised circle in the middle with a wide path around it, from there, four radiating paths that led to the corners of a large diamond shape, with parallel, raised beds of differing lengths within the diamond. I was “told” to put in a Critter Garden. Whenever I planted, some of the same seed was put into it with the clear understanding that whatever grew there was food for anything that crawled, flew or wiggled. Marigolds were required for specific places for those bugs who thought that the Critter Garden was beneath their dignity. Everything I did in that garden was the result of asking clear questions and getting clear answers.

“Is it OK to plant these carrots in this bed?” – then, test – (it takes both hands), muscle strength or weakness determines

“yes” or “no”. But I still had a mind of my own – I would have good cause later on to remember thinking, as I sowed long beds of sweet corn, “It's too late for you to do any good, I just know that in my boots.” I was also to remember shoving 20 seeds of the same corn into the Critter Garden saying, “Now grow you little buggers, GROW!”

It was time for a fence. I needed a fence. Well, I sat there on my stump and suggested all kinds of fences with no approval. Then it slowly dawned on me, you don't want to have a fence? No Fence! I just about had a fit. Build no fence. Hey, what the heck, I had already thrown out everything I believed in, I was already in up to my neck, what else could I do – but accept – no fence.

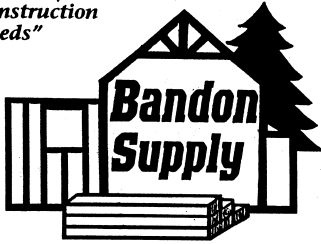

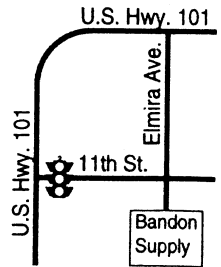

I read with interest the article on the front page of the Port Orford News that the Sheriff of Curry County was planning on asking for “A levy to hire six patrol deputies.” I did not see anywhere in the article that there was a possibility that the Sheriff had received a Grant to hire more deputies. Is this true or false that a Grant has been issued.

The Sheriff also stated, “I heard people from the north county say throughout the years, nobody cares about us”. We really did get that feeling when the two deputies in the north part of the county were going to be moved to the jail as jailers. At that time it was stated that deputies would have to come from Gold Beach or Brookings to answer calls in the north part of the county, and that this would take one-half hour to an hour to answer a call.

It appeared that this was because the north part of the county did not vote for the former Levy. This was later cancelled and we did not lose our deputies. What will happen if the Levy is not approved this time?

**Property Number Display**  
Released by the City of Port Orford

Without going outside to look, think about how the front of your home or business appears. What color is the paint: maybe it needs to be touched up. How about the size and number of windows; they probably need washing. Are the flowers in bloom or are the winter weeds still present? What about your property number? Can it viewed from the street, especially at night? Are the numbers large enough for quick, clear identification by Police, Fire or other crew in the event of an emergency?

Property numbers are a vital piece of information in an emergency situation; they are also a requirement. City of Port Orford Ordinance No. 186 states “property numbers are to be placed where clearly visible from the street on or near the building.” Property owners in violation may be fined for non-compliance of the ordinance. Notices are being mailed to owners of property which have been identified as not clearly displaying property numbers.

Now you can go outside and look at your property. Before you make plans to repair the paint, clean the windows and pull the weeds, make sure your property numbers are properly and clearly displayed.

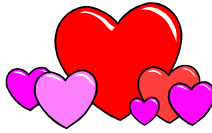
