Commission Ignores Public By Evan Kramer



The Port of Port Orford Commission met on Tuesday, May 15 before an overflow crowd at the dock office.

Commission chairman Scott Macdonald called the meeting to order and thanked the budget committee for their work.

The minutes of the previous three meetings were approved and then it was time for persons to be heard which is also known as public comment. Most of the comments were related to a letter dated May 15, which had been circulated in advance regarding the management agreement between the ports of Port Orford and Gold Beach.

Gifford Barnes told the commissioners he was coming on the commission and that he was on the committee to send out ads for a new port manager and they hadn't been sent out. Macdonald told him there had been some problems and it was decided to hold off on advertising.

Barnes said the Port was going in the hole \$6,000 a month and he couldn't see how we could pay port manager Mike Nielson the kind of wages he was getting. Barnes

said he wanted a port manager who was here. Macdonald countered that in his opinion without Mike Nielson we're (the port) in deep trouble. Cheryl Douglass asked the commission how they knew there's not anyone out there who can do the job. Blaine Simonds told the commission we need a full time Port manager and asked what has Mike Nielson brought in. Nielson said the money from Oregon Economic Development Department to repair the hoists and fuel system hadn't come in yet and the contract was at the attorney general's office. Nielson said he had been focusing on the dock project and that once that is complete other things can be worked on like the financial situation.

Beverly Walters referred to a May 2, 2001 article in the Gold Beach Reporter about the Gold Beach port commission meeting. She said the article quoted Nielson as saying he had handed the Port of Port Orford a check for \$315,000. Walters noted that the story on this was different in Port Orford than Gold Beach. Walters went on to say, "we need a full time on site port manager."

Scott Macdonald said he votes his conscience and said the commission sees things the public doesn't see. He said he had "all the confidence in Mike Nielson." Jean Kilburn told the commission two of them wouldn't on the commission as of

July and didn't they think the new people should have a say so. She told the commission this was a critical decision. Macdonald told her there are lots of things people don't see and the commission had ended up with the best case scenario. Macdonald said Nielson's best points weren't served here at the Port. (He spends most of his time working out of his office at the Port of Gold Beach).


Jane Cramer thanked the commission for being so receptive to the public recently referring to the strategic planning meetings.

Chris Aiello had two questions and he demanded direct answers to them. He asked the commission if they were committed to advertising for a port manager and was told no by Scott Macdonald. He then asked Mike Nielson if what he had said in the Gold Beach paper was true or not about the \$315,000 check. Nielson said he had been misquoted. (Nielson was quoted in the Reporter as saying, "I delivered them a check for \$321,000. I've earned my keep.")

Beverly Walters suggested hiring Nielson as a lobbyist and another person as a manager. Chris Aiello said Nielson was more valuable on the outside and we needed someone less expensive. Mike

The Port Orford Chamber of Commerce will sponsor the team trophies and we would like to thank them all their help.

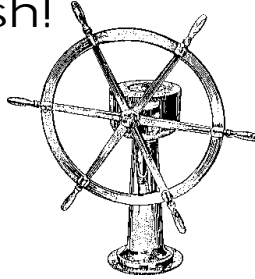

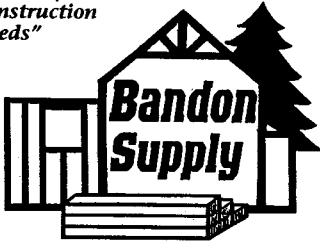

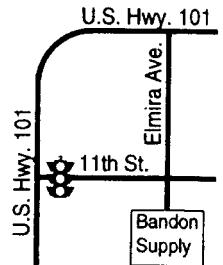

Dylan is famous for reinventing himself with regularity and this year added to his list of accomplishments by winning an Academy Award for best song. He won it for his song "Things Have Changed" in the movie *Wonder Boys*. Unlike other rock stars of his generation Dylan continues to work regularly and plays in over 100 concerts a year. He likes to play with other big name entertainers and in the past several years has headlined concerts with the Grateful Dead, Paul Simon and Van Morrison.

Cheryl Thorp Resigns

Curry County Commissioner Cheryl Thorp resigned from her position on May 18 in a brief letter sent to County Clerk Rene Kolen. Thorp's resignation became effective on Monday, May 21. Thorp was elected in November 1998. Thorp had previously announced that she was resigning effective July 1 but pushed up that date because of health reasons.

The next step in replacing Cheryl Thorp is in the Curry County Democratic central committee's hands. They are meeting on Wednesday, May 23, to interview the candidates who have submitted their names to replace Thorp.

Shaffer said the interview process will be a public one but she didn't know if the public would be allowed to ask questions. She continued that after reviewing the responses to the written and oral questions a new commis-

Commission Ignores Public Continued from Front Cover

Nielson said "there is no management vacancy." Scott Mecum asked why the notice to terminate. Nielson told him he thought the project would be complete in 90 days.

The commission next discussed the dock project/Army Corps of Engineers. Commissioner Chris Hawthorne said he and Commissioner David Darnell had met with people from the AOEC May 9 at the port. They were told there is a natural scouring going on but the dredge barge Sandwick can't get in tight enough to move the sand out. The AOEC representative mentioned pulling out some of the rip rap in the area of the proposed public fishing dock. That means the four pilings would have to be pulled out and the proposed fishing dock would need a new location. Scott Macdonald said the port had an opportunity to greatly increase our dredged area but the rip rap rocks are in the way.

Scott Mecum told the commission someone is going to lose their life at the end of the jetty. He said the shoaling off the end of the jetty will cause us to lose a boat and that this problem needs to be addressed

soon. He wanted to make public notice of the problem.

It was brought up that both the ports of Gold Beach and Bandon have small dredges. Mike Nielson said each port would have to do maintenance dredging.

The next item on the agenda was the management agreement with the Port of Gold Beach. Chris Hawthorne made a motion to send the letter to the Port of Gold Beach commission requesting that the notice of intent to terminate be rescinded. This in response to the Port of Gold Beach port commission letter to the Port of Port Orford to terminate the intergovernmental agreement between the two ports dated March 20 and effective June 20. Commissioner Dave Knapp seconded the motion. Hawthorne said, "I personally asked Mike to stay on." He said he was happy with Mike's abilities and that Nielson had come to the port when we were in "dire straits." The vote was 3-0 in favor of the motion. In addition Chris Hawthorne presented a proxy vote from absent commissioner David Darnell in favor of the motion. Scott Macdonald had said earlier in the meeting when referring to this management agreement letter. - we've already discussed it. Commis-

sioner Leesa Cobb was not present at the meeting.

Next topic of discussion was the Strategic Plan. The commission and public have been presented with the final draft of the plan and it will be presented again at the June port meeting for adoption. More public comments on the plan are encouraged on the plan. Mike Nielson said there is no deadline for public comments. The 2001-2002 port budget committee had approved the budget and it will be presented to the commission at the June meeting.

Chris Hawthorne made a motion to pay the bills when funds become available. It passed 3-0 and the meeting was adjourned.

On Thursday night, May 17, the Port of Gold Beach Commission met. The letter from the Port of Port Orford commission was not on the agenda and no action was taken on the matter. Gold Beach port president Scott Boley said a committee of two commissioners from each port would meet and discuss the management issue. He stated that the Port of Gold Beach has an exclusive management agreement with Mike Nielson.
