## Good Vibrations

This past weekend a successful music and camping fair billed as a **Family-A-Faire** was held at Arizona Beach Campground and RV Park. Posters and tee shirts for

the event advertised the location as Port Orford, Oregon. Not bad for a town that often gets ignored on the state highway road signs. The three days of music attracted around three thousand people though attendance figures will be hard to determine because there were some "gate crashers" who made their way through the woods and onto the property without a ticket.

Three Port Orford musical groups played at the Family-A-Faire festival including String Fling, Antique Dog and Jack Ponting. They played on the smaller stage in the beach camping area to the west of Highway 101. Unfortunately the acoustics weren't very good in this location and the wind was howling at times. The beach camping area was jammed with every variety of campers from tents to a school bus with two Volkswagen buses serving as a "penthouse" on the roof, to rental RVs. Something we saw in British Columbia last year were lots of

rental RV's - more than you see south of the Canadian border.

One of the more whimsical parts of the festival were the "human puppets". There were seven or eight bigger than life puppets that the puppeteers would get into and wear. Some were up to ten feet tall when worn. Several of the puppet masks were made of wood and a few were made of paper mache. The puppeteers circulated through the event and lent a festive feel to the gathering including a parade on Sunday afternoon with many of the children in attendance.

Steve Bruce, one of the organizers of the Festival, said they had only three months to prepare. Steve is the one who first came to Arizona Beach and camped out and from there got the inspiration to have a music festival at this location. Dan Clements from Resonant Wave Productions talked about having another festival next year, as did Steve Bruce. Clements talked about the many problems they had with the two ticket agencies signed up to sell tickets and it sounded like if there is a second festival there will be changes in that department.

The festival was held at historic Arizona Beach RV Park. Mark Rechberg and his wife Jackie bought the Park last year and this is his second summer season as

owner. He said the park is 70 acres and has 135 spaces. They have storytelling every Saturday at the park and just recently Rechberg had a small lake constructed. He plans on stocking it with fish and thus enabling campers at his park to go fishing.

Arizona Beach Campground bills itself as "historical" and for good reason. It was home to the Arizona Inn until 1959 when it burned down. The Inn was built in the late 1800's by Jesse Carey. Arizona Beach has been a stagecoach stop, cattle ranch and campground. The cattle ranch was known as the Sparkling Cove Ranch. The milking barn from that ranch is still in use today and that is where the storytelling takes place.

Rechberg talked about having other festivals at his park including blues or jazz festival in the future. On Tuesday we spoke about the festival and he told me, "It went really well." He continued that people had been saying, "It's the best concert they'd ever been too." Rechberg said there hadn't been one fight and referred to the people at the concert as the politest people. He said he would be willing to have the festival back next year with a few things changed. He said the State Police and Sheriff's Department hadn't reported any problems to him.



### Through a Glass Darkly By Graeme Graydon



It has become fashionable for celebrities and cultural heroes to conceal their eyes with dark glasses. I'm noticing a lot of young people picking up the

fad, I'm sure that they feel real cool with the slight menace, tough aloofness and self-concealment that goes along with it. Dark glasses have their place - driving or flying into the sun, doing anything around sun-lit snow, ice or water. They seem harmless enough, but yes, they do have a dark side.

Our eyes are incredible instruments governed by exquisite muscular coordination. The muscles are in a constant dance of contraction and release, adjusting for changes of light-intensity, focus and direction. Like any other muscle group in the body - they must be exercised. Dark glasses take the load off the muscles, they don't have to work so hard - they get lazy and out of shape - causing vision problems. The good news is that they can be exercised back into line again, usually quite easily.

However, there is a more important but little-known factor. In the back of the eye, there are features called rods and cones. It has been found that one of their functions is to collect ultra-violet light and convey the stimulus directly to the immune system via the pineal gland. People who continually block ultra-violet in sunlight may be doing themselves a disservice.

The great philosopher, physician and musician, Dr. Albert Schweitzer, was once puzzled by the appearance of a rare form of cancer in the native people at his mission at Lambarene, French Equatorial Africa. He noticed it shortly after the tribesmen started to wear dark glasses as status symbols. He concluded that the glasses had caused some kind of deprivation leading to the disease.

An American, Dr. John Ott, (who later perfected time-lapse photography for Disney), became depressed and exhausted when he was at his prime. He was forced to take a break at the beach where, on the first morning he broke, or lost, the dark glasses that he always wore. For three sun-drenched days, he could feel his body recharging, and he never wore his glasses again. Years later, he made a significant discovery which was totally ignored by

the scientific and medical community. It was noticed that a small rural school had the highest rate of leukemia in the United States. Government scientists descended on the school to investigate, but they couldn't find a hint of what could possibly be causing the problem. After they had given up, John Ott came on the scene. He quickly found the cause and within weeks, proved the cure for the mysterious outbreak. The school had been remodeled - one of the improvements, was to provide a superior lighting system. To this effect, heavy drapes were placed over the windows and an extensive array of fluorescent lighting was installed. Ott had the curtains removed, the lights turned off- and the epidemic subsided immediately. As could be expected, the American Cancer Society declined to follow up on his report. It seems that we need sunlight in our eyes as part of our daily nutrition - which is not too surprising really.



### Fire Season Begins June 20th

The Coos Forest Protective Association announced today that fire season will officially begin at 12:01 a.m. Wednesday, June 20th. The start of fire season activates restrictions on both public and industrial forest use on all private, county, state and Bureau of Land Management lands as well as rural fire districts within CFPA's protection boundaries.

The start of fire season means the end of unregulated outside burning for people residing in Coos, Curry and western Douglas County. Written permits and on-site inspections will be required for all types of outside burning, including debris burning and the use of burn barrels. Permits are free of charge and may be obtained as follows.

Residents living in rural areas can call their local CFPA office during normal business hours, seven days a week, at one of the following numbers: Coos Bay,

267-3161; Reedsport, 271-2224; Gold Beach, 247-6241; Brookings, 469-2302; Bandon and Port Orford, 347-3400; Bridge and Powers, 572-2796. A Fire Warden will typically come to the burn site to perform the inspection and write the permit.

County residents within an incorporated city should call their local departments for burning restriction and permit details.

Industrial fire regulations will also go into effect. Industrial Fire Precaution Level (IFPL) 1 prohibits smoking while working on or traveling through an industrial operation. Specified fire tools and suppression equipment must be maintained at all operations. A three-hour fire watch is also required at all industrial operation sites unless waived or modified in writing by a Fire Warden. Non-industrial firewood cutters must have an 8-oz. fire extinguisher and a shovel. Power saws must be equipped with an approved screen.

As fire season progresses, additional closures and restrictions may be imposed as weather conditions become more severe.

Ref: Management Agreement, Port of Gold Beach/Port of Port Orford

Dear Commissioners,

On May 15, 2001, Commissioners of the Port of Port Orford elected to forward a letter requesting that the Port of Gold Beach rescind a "Notice of Intent to Terminate" Resolution #2000-7 for joint management of Ports. As you may or may not be aware the Port of Port Orford is experiencing serious financial instability.

On behalf of those citizens who have signed the attached petition and what we believe would be a majority of taxpayers and commercial users of the Port we hereby request that you proceed with termination of Resolution 2000-7. It is our opinion that a full-time dedicated manager is mandatory to the survival of this Port District. Part-time management would only serve to prolong or delay the recovery process. This Port's demand for





### **P.O. Water Report Available**

The City of Port Orford is mailing its annual water quality report to consumers. This report describes the City's water quality, and explains what the various laboratory test results mean to the City's customers.

The US Congress requires drinking water providers to give their customers important information about their water, including where it comes from, what is in the water, and how the water quality compares with federal standards. The City of

Port Orford Public Works Department routinely monitors for contaminants in City drinking water according to federal and Oregon State laws.

Port Orford obtains its drinking water from the North Fork of Hubbard Creek, which is a surface water source about 1.5 miles east of town. An additional 76-acre parcel of land just above the City owned reservoir helps to ensure the quantity and quality of City drinking water. Copies of the Source Water Assessment of the Hubbard Creek Watershed, which identifies the drinking water protection area,

are available at City Hall.

If you have any questions about this report or concerning your City supplied drinking water, please contact City Hall at 550 20th St or call 541-332-3681.

**Salmon Recovery Act**

On Wednesday, June 13, Representative Peter DeFazio applauded bipartisan legislation that the U.S. House of Representatives overwhelmingly approved for the restoration of Pacific salmon and steelhead.

“It’s essential for the federal government to be a partner in salmon recovery,” said DeFazio. “This legislation provides necessary support to the local landowners, conservation groups, and industry leaders that have committed to the challenging process of restoring salmon population in our area.”

The legislation, HR 1157, “The Pacific Salmon Recovery Act,” authorizes \$250 million a year for three years for the restoration of salmon and steelhead habitat in California, Oregon, Washington, Alaska and Idaho.

Virtually every salmon stock in these regions has been added to the endangered species list. Each new listing under the Endangered Species Act presents new challenges for water management and irrigation, agricultural development, road construction and maintenance, power generation, forestry, and even waste disposal. The disappearance of salmon and steelhead could have almost unlimited impacts on the future development of our Western states.

HR 1157 enjoys bipartisan support in the House as well as support from a diverse



## Letter to the Editor,

Notice to postpone the regularly scheduled Port Commission meeting on June 19 (the third Tuesday of the month) to June 26, has prompted a review of Port Policy and O.R.S. requirements. Port Policy under "Commission Duties and Responsibilities" clearly states that "Regular meeting dates may be changed by majority vote of the Commission". O.R.S. 192.630 clearly states that such vote 'cannot be conducted in private'. All meetings must be open to the public unless in an emergency.

Rescheduling of the regular port meeting may be in violation of authority by this action. Further O.R.S. 192.640 requires that public notice be given that is "reasonably calculated to give actual notice". Posting a two line notice in 'tiny' print in the Post Office or the Port Orford Library door does not follow the spirit of the law and fulfill the requirement to give "reasonably calculated notice".

A proxy vote cast at the regular Port Commission meeting on May 15, 2001 may be in violation of current State Law which states, "A vote by proxy is not authorized by State Law" quoted from the Attorney General's Public Records and Meetings Manuel, Page C-6 O.R.S. 192.610 to 192.690 which also makes provisions for legal remedy in such matters of violation.

Some suggestions for the promoters would be selling tickets locally; lower priced one-day pass tickets, a posted and advertised schedule of when the various musical groups are going to play, and more community involvement from volunteers to vendors.
