Council In Agreeable Mood By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council met on Monday night. Newly elected Mayor Gary Doran, Councilors Ruth Jamieson and Jim Campbell and reelected councilor Ralph Donaldson were sworn in by city recorder Norma House.

New public works director Jerry McNurlin gave a brief report. He has been on the job ten days and made a point of saying the city public work's crew is very dedicated.

Gayle Wilcox gave a fire department report regarding development of a policies and procedures manual. She said the department is gathering information from other departments and expects to have their manual complete by March.

Auditor Rob Wall presented the council with the final draft of the 1995-96 Port Orford audit report. He noted considerable improvement in the city record keeping process over previous years. He said the primary deficiencies were related to budget matters. Specifically he referred to seven instances of budget appropriation overexpenditures in five funds totaling \$19,778. He also encouraged closer monitoring of travel expenses by council members. Councilor Donaldson asked Wall about the sewer and water rates

audit and Wall responded that he would have it by March. Councilor Robert Warring made a motion to approve the audit report submitted by Wall and it passed unanimously.

Planning Director Butch Parker updated the council about planning commission business. He referred to the owner of the Agate Beach RV Park who has asked for and received a change in zoning from commercial to residential from the planning commission. Parker asked the council if they wanted a public hearing on this matter. The council didn't feel one was needed and passed a motion approving the planning commission's action unanimously.

Next up on the agenda was Paula Cracas, a resident of Port Orford who lives at 824 Washington St. She started having problems with her sewer system in October of last year and found out then that she was not hooked up to the city sewer line but instead had a septic tank and leech line on her property. She said she has been paying sewer fees since she purchased the property in 1989. She asked the council for the city to hook her property up to the sewer system and waive the hook up fee as well as refund the money she has paid into the sewer system for over seven years. City Manager Dotti Myers recommended that Cracas pay the sewer hookup fee but Myers wondered at which rate she should pay. Sewer hook up fees have risen considerably since 1989. Robert Warring made a motion to connect the Cracas property to the sewer system at no cost to her but also not give her a refund on what she has paid already. The motion died for lack of a second. The council decided to connect the sewer system to her house and determine the price later. One other thing that came out in the discussion was that the sewer line had not been put in on Washington between 8th and 9th Streets. That work was proceeding on Monday afternoon.

Mayor Doran appointed Tim Sparks to continue as council president. He named Jim Campbell as public safety liaison, Ralph Donaldson will remain as public works liaison, Carl Eskelson will remain as watershed and solid waste advisory and Robert Warring will continue as OCZMA and SeaPac liaison. Four people were authorized to sign city checks including Dotti Myers, Gary Doran, Tim Sparks and Robert Warring.

The mayor did not make a choice of a fire chief for Port Orford. The council had been given a petition signed by 15 fire department members supporting one candidate but other letters had been submit-




