## Congratulations Graduates By Evan Kramer

Congratulations to the 1997 graduating class of Pacific High School. Their graduation ceremony will be held this Friday evening in the gymnasium at Pacific High School starting at 8:00pm. The gym will fill up, so get there early for a good seat. Following the ceremony the graduates will participate in an all night drug and alcohol free party sponsored by Project Graduation. The party ends up at 7:00am the following morning at the Langlois Lion's Club for breakfast and distribution of presents.

Class Valedictorian Alice Sweeney was in the Fun Zone recently and I asked her the secret of her success, which includes a 3.98 grade point average, the highest in the class. She told me the "secret" was turning in her assignments. Now if I'd only followed that advice thirty years ago several of my high school teachers including a particular geometry teacher would have been a lot less aggravated. Then again there was Mr. Occhipinti, who taught ancient history. There was **no** question that the student was to turn in all assignments, talk only when you were called upon and take all tests and quizzes. Alice's advice may sound simple but

usually those are the suggestions that work. I spoke with Echo Pruitt, another member of the class of 1997, and asked her to describe her fellow classmates. She described them as a really talented group in many areas ranging from academic to creative to athletic. She added that the teachers at Pacific High School have said this is one of the best classes they have ever had. Echo is on her way to the University of Oregon in Eugene.

Many of the 35 members of the 1997 senior class will scatter far and wide after school lets out. School Superintendent Richard Wold told me eighteen of the thirty-five seniors are planning on attending college. Their choices range from the University of Oregon to Western Oregon University to Pacific College in Forest Grove. Ten of the seniors are going into the workforce, three are not graduating, two are entering the military service and have enlisted in the Marine Corps, one is traveling and one is entering a trade school.

The school year is over for the seniors this Friday. However, school lasts a few more days for the other students in the 2CJ district. The school year ends for the rest of the high school students at Pacific on Wednesday, June 4, at noon and for Driftwood and Blanco students on Thursday, June 5, at noon.

The new school year resumes the day after Labor Day, which means September 2 this year. Enjoy your summer vacation.

### Flower and History Hike

Want to see the Kalmiopsis flower in bloom? And the rare Brewer (Weeping) spruce? If so you'll want to join the Curry County Historical Society on a hike into the edge of the Kalmiopsis Wilderness on Saturday, June 7 starting at 9am in the parking lot behind Brookings-Harbor High School.

The two rare plants will not be the only things to see. Many other plants, including the carnivorous Cobra plant, (*Darlingtonia californica*), and many others will be observed as we amble along the old "cat" road. The historic Gardner Mine and other spots will also be seen.

Fred Bowen, retired Gold Beach High School biology teacher, and Walt Schroeder, amateur historian, will lead the hike.

The trail to the Kalmiopsis and Brewer spruce site is a relatively easy one with low gradient. Those who wish will back track to their transportation. The more adventurous will take a primitive trail up over the hill to see beautiful Vulcan Lake. The trail out of Vulcan is a good one but steep in places. Bring a sack lunch and liquids to quench your thirst.



I saw this as an opportunity by giving the owner a choice. Special Needs Pet Service provides transportation to and from Veterinarian appointments. (Bandon Veterinary only) and requires only a small fee to cover gas and mileage - fee waived under certain conditions. I will also pick up and deliver cat or dog food. Please arrange to have someone there to help load and unload you pet or carry pet food into your home.

I strongly believe having your pet around during recovery or when going through tough times is good therapy. I’m living proof of that. My hope is that Special Needs Pet Service will be helpful even if you only call to ask for advice regarding your pet’s welfare.

Business hours are from 1-7pm daily. If you reach the answer machine please leave a message and your call will be returned.

are being changed without the knowledge of the citizens of Port Orford?


