Hamming it up in Seaside By Evan Kramer

Valerie and I loaded the van up and headed north to Seaside, Oregon last week. We planned on attending the SeaPac 1997 ARRL (American Radio Relay League) Northwest Division Ham Convention on Saturday and Sunday. It was the first time we had driven that far north on Highway 101 for six years and there have been changes. We stayed in Newport, which I barely recognized, on the way up but didn't take the time to visit the aquarium. The aquarium is the city's big tourist attraction thanks in large part to Keiko (Free Willy).

The ham convention was held at the Seaside Convention Center and vendors and ham operators setting up swap meet tables took up every square inch of space. We were told over 3,000 people were signed up for the convention including a few familiar faces.

On Saturday night at the convention banquet and award ceremony the master of ceremonies rolled back the years. He had people who got their ham licenses from the different decades stand up starting with the 90's to much applause and working his way back to the 30's. Former

Curry County assessor Al Devore stood up and took his bow at that point. Only one person stood and heard the appreciative applause from the audience for his having been licensed since the 1920's. We also saw Port Orford residents Dan and Mary Lou Hill at the convention. One thing about Oregon, no matter where you go, you see someone you know.

I'm not a ham radio operator but Valerie is (AA7FB) and she has an extra class license. The ham operators in attendance at the convention are a knowledgeable and well-trained group of people. In case of emergencies like earthquakes, fires, or floods when electric power and phones fail, the more of these people around and on the air the better off we'll all be.

We left the convention on Sunday and headed north on our way to Poulsbo, Washington, for a visit with Valerie's cousin Rob Weiss. On our way toward the Seattle area we drove to Long Beach for a look and walk around this festive ocean front town. They even had a small playland style amusement park for children and the place was packed with tourists. We both enjoyed the free museum packed with old time coin-operated devices. Sure brought back memories!

Poulsbo is located a little northwest of Seattle on Liberty Bay. It is a city founded

by Norwegians who found a similarity in the fjords of their native land and the waterways of Puget Sound. The city maintains a Scandinavian theme in their historic waterfront downtown. One of the main reasons to visit cousin Rob was that he and his ten year old son Maury were featured in a father and son art show at Checkers Espresso in downtown Poulsbo on the Havne Veien walkway.

Rob works in watercolors and focuses on scenes of lighthouses and other water and ocean orientated themes. Maury works with ink pens and is interested in anything to do with "sea creatures." Most of the paintings were for sale and as each sold a red dot was put next to the title card. Maury was winning the battle of the red dots at the time we saw the show.

The local paper ran a story about the art show including a large color picture of Rob and Maury on the front cover. It was fun to see them staring from newsracks throughout the town!

We left Poulsbo after our visit and drove to Bainbridge Island and the Washington State Ferry Terminal building at Winslow. I was eager to ride across Puget Sound to downtown Seattle on one of the ferries since different types of transportation is one of my main interests. The ferry we

Drivers who have wished to be a part of the action in the arena during all of the smashing and crashing of a Demolition Derby have another opportunity this year at the conclusion of the Curry County Fair and Rodeo on Sunday, July 27.

Entry packets are available at the Fair Office in Gold Beach.

Drivers who don't already own a car that they have threatened with destruction may get one sponsored by a local wrecking yard.

South Coast Auto Wrecking in Bandon is among those offering to provide, as sponsor, use of a "junkyard special."

The winner of the Demolition finale is guaranteed \$600 plus a grand trophy. Second place finalist will win \$250. The cash prize money and trophies, provided by the sponsor, Northwest Sports, will be

awarded to the top three finishers in each heat event, and also to fourth place in the finale.

An entry fee of only \$35 is required, if submitted by the July 15th deadline, after which it becomes \$45.

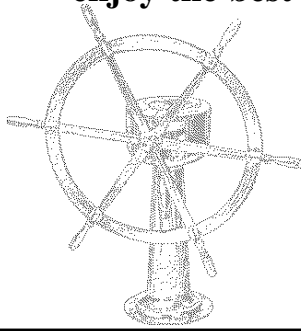

Sign-up will be at 6:00 at the big stump on the beach at the bottom of the Battle Rock foot path. All action will take place on the beach. Contestants will "rescue a man and a woman from a shipwreck". Two dummies representing the shipwrecked people will have to be loaded into a breeches buoy and brought to safety. This may not be as easy as it sounds. The "people" to be rescued are frightened, so they might be clumsy or uncooperative. The breeches buoy is carried across a distance of 100 feet by team members running through the sand while heaving on a rope. The team with the best rescue time wins.

This event is a fun way to remember the brave members of the Lifesaving Service who risked their lives to save the lives of others. We have two popular reminders of this era in the remaining buildings at the former lifesaving station on Port Orford Heads, as well as the propeller from the "Cottoneva" which ran aground

right here on Battle Rock Beach in 1937. All hands were saved in that wreck by means of a breeches buoy which brought the sailors to safety on the beach.

rode on was named the "Spokane" and it was one of a series of three that are the biggest class Washington State operates. The capacity for the ferry is 2,000 people and over 200 cars. The ride takes 35 minutes from Bainbridge Island to the downtown Seattle ferry terminal.

Their fare collection system is interesting. The westbound ride is free. For the return trip the charge is \$3.50 (without car.) It seemed reasonable to me considering the large and comfortable seats on the ferry, which put the airlines to shame.

The ferry terminal is as close to downtown as possible and after debarking we walked around the area around the terminal. We headed off to the Pike Place Market and joined the massive throngs of people at this very unique market and public space where fresh fish and vegetables and fruit are the name of the game.
