Curry County Fair Opens By Evan Kramer

This weekend the action on the south coast takes place at the Curry County Fairgrounds in Gold Beach. Gates swing open for the Curry County Fair and Rodeo at 10:00am on Thursday, July 24. Thursday is Senior Citizen Day and seniors are admitted for \$3. Friday's big event is the NPRA sanctioned rodeo at 7:30pm. Tickets for the rodeo are \$.5. Saturday features the fair parade starting at the Port of Gold Beach and proceeding through downtown Gold Beach on Highway 101 to the fairgrounds. The parade begins at 11:00am and is always a lot of fun. One year I participated in the fair parade and won a fourth place ribbon in the political category. Of course there were only four entries but what the heck I got a big colorful ribbon. There are many parade participants this year including two bands providing live music. One is Billie's Brass Band. This is a 22 member marching band from Portland. The other band in the parade is the Southern Oregon Scottish Bagpipe Band in their Anderson Tartan Kilts. They are from the Rogue Valley and have been in existence since 1931. Billie's Brass Band will also appear at 1:00pm on outdoor

stage for a show. The Scottish Bagpipe Band will appear on the green at 2:00pm. State Senator Veral Tarno will be a parade participant as will Mark Creighton, a candidate for Sheriff in next spring's primary. The Vietnam Veteran's of America Chapter 757, will be represented in the parade by a color guard consisting of four flag bearers and two riflemen, followed by a truck carrying 42 POW/MIA flags representing 42 Oregon POW/MIA's that are missing and that the Pentagon has declared dead.

The NPRA rodeo returns to the main arena on Saturday night. The Curry County Fair is now on the Diamond Circuit which means that rodeo contestants aiming for championships must attend this fair as part of their circuit. Bo Pinz of Idaho will provide the livestock for the rodeo. Cyndy Wellman, of Gold Beach will sing the national anthem and accompany her singing with hand signing of the words before the rodeo begins.

The fair closes at 5:00pm on Sunday but not before the beautiful animal contest in the barn at 10:30am and sound of metal against metal at the demolition derby in the main arena starting at 3:00pm. Another highlight of Sunday's fair entertainment is the first public presentation of the play "The Boy Who Talks With Whales". The play is directed by Carol

Malley and features the acting talents of ten young people from Port Orford and Langlois. They've all been busy practicing the play at the Community Building. The play will be presented at the outdoor stage starting at 2:00pm.

Admission rates for the fair are \$5 for adults, \$2 for children 6-12, under 6 are admitted for free, a family pass is available on Sunday for \$10 and a season ticket for adults is sold for \$12. Tickets for the rodeo and demolition derby are not included with general admission and are an additional \$5.

Special rates are available for the amusement rides on Thursday and Sunday. For \$10 you can purchase an armband which will allow you unlimited access to the Butler Amusements rides in the midway all day.

The County Fair is like homecoming week in Curry County. It's a chance to see and visit with friends and relatives from Langlois to Port Orford to Gold Beach and Brookings. It's also an opportunity to see how talented your friends and neighbors really are. Many will enter their prize flowers and vegetables in the floral building. Others will display their artwork and photography in the Docia Sweet Hall while others haul their animals down



Community Building Design

Over 30 people attended *Creating Our Community Activities Center: Part II* on Thursday night, and the overall response to schematic design drawings for renovation of the Community Building was very favorable. Major features in the proposed \$1.7 million, 21,000 square foot Center include the addition of a 4200 square foot library, an upgraded, moveable stage, meeting rooms, office space, covered outdoor atrium, and fireplace lounge. James D. Tronson, AIA, presented drawings and a 3-dimensional model that showed the relationship between the existing buildings and the new Center. Mr. Tronson estimated that construction would take 12-14 months once the project begins. Ed and Nancy Dowdy, co-chairs of Port Orford's Community Resource team (CRT) volunteered to head up a fund-raising committee for the Center. Some concern was voiced that the final plans reflect the visual character of Port Orford. One neighbor wanted to make sure that soundproofing would be added and that parking management be considered. The City Council will discuss the Community Building at its next meeting.

Fishing Boat Winchuck Burns

The fishing boat Winchuck caught fire on Thursday afternoon, July 17 and by 6:30pm that night was completely destroyed but still smoldering.

The thirty-six foot long, seventeen thousand pound boat had been moored in the Port Orford harbor while owners Merle and Judy Hassett and Bob Walker made repairs to it. The boat was twenty five years old. The Hassetts and Walker had owned it for one year but had just brought it down to Port Orford on Monday.

The fire began a little before 3:00pm and began as an electrical fire in the starter. Judy Hassett spotted smoke coming out of the boat. When Bob Walker got out to the boat and opened the door of the cabin the fire flashed causing him to be singed. The fire then quickly spread. The Winchuck burned loose from its moorings and floated south to the jetty, pushed by northerly winds, where it rested and what's left of it still rests.

Merle Hassett told me the Coast Guard was called and their advice was to "let it burn". 100 gallons of diesel fuel was on board all of which was consumed by the

fire. There was no fuel or oil spills related to the fire.

The Port Orford Fire Department responded to the fire a little after 3:00pm. The fire department's efforts to put the fire out proved futile. They got as close to the boat on the dock as they could and attempted to put water on it with the deluge gun mounted on top of the truck. The water didn't reach the boat.

The spectacular fire brought out hundreds of area residents and tourists. Most viewed the fire from the overlook but others joined the fire department, sheriff's department and ambulance crew on the dock.

Because of malicious rumors, speculations and misinformation concerning our activities on our property in Sixes, we wish to advise our friends and neighbors of our true intentions.

1. We are converting some pastureland into cranberry bogs.
2. We are working very closely with government agencies to ensure that all activities are prudent and legal.
3. We are well aware of wet land areas in parts of the acreage. A consulting firm is delineating these for the Department of State Lands and the Army Corps of Engineers.
4. Designated wet land areas will be treated according to state and federal regulations.

5. We have no plans to drain or damage the ponded wetland area through which Sixes River Rd. passes.

Some people, including a neighbor we believe to be upset because I will not sell him part of my property for less than I purchased it, have contacted regulatory government agencies about our activities. 



KSBA expects to make a final technical visit to the tower in a few weeks to install several thousand dollars worth of electronics and they expect that full quality and power will be established at that time. This station will be the first translator in a string of repeaters down the coast and so is planned to operate at a high level of

signal quality. Various topographics problems of terrain and sighting have created some complex engineering problems which I am assured have all been solved.

Remembering Eric Reutercrona

Valerie and I received a call Tuesday night from Sue Chesselet. She called to tell us she had read an obituary for Eric Reutercrona in this week's edition of the Port Orford News. Sue had recently asked me if I had heard from or talked to Eric Reutercrona. I told her I hadn't heard a word. Valerie had tried to contact Eric some months ago via e-mail but hadn't received a response. She had also called but no one answered the phone. Eric had moved to Warren, Texas a couple of years ago with his new wife, Suzanne.

Eric had a lot of good friends in Port Orford including Valerie, Nancy and myself at the Fun Zone. We used to visit him frequently at his home in Geer Circle

when his wife Hazel was alive. Eric was devoted to her and made her care at the end of her life his top priority. But he still made a little time for himself. When he was in the mood Eric would treat us with some impromptu music by playing a few selections on his electric organ.

One thrill Eric truly enjoyed was when he was named grand marshal of the Port Orford Jubilee Parade three or four years back. He got to ride in a Coast Guard





What is Web TV?

Web TV is one attempt to make the Internet available to everyone at low cost and without having to learn to use a computer.

Web TV consists of a box that you attach to your existing television set and plug into your phone line. A separate keyboard is sold as an option and you will really NEED it so be sure you get it at the same time. The whole package (both pieces) should cost about \$300-500 and

allows you to surf the World Wide Web as well as send and receive Email.

In addition to purchasing the hardware, you also need to sign up with two services. You must set up an account with the Web TV people. This account costs \$9.95 per month. You also need an account with a local Internet Service Provider (ISP) such as @Harborside. This account typically costs about \$19.95 per month.

I got a demo of one of these units last winter and it looks like a workable solution for simple, low-cost Internet access. For more information, call @Harborside at 469-8844 or 1-800-680-8855.


