Arts & Seafood Festival This Weekend! By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford Arts Council started life as the Humbug Mountain Arts Council in 1977. Actually they began existence in 1976 but didn't receive their non-profit status until the next year. Among the charter members of the organization were Alan and Brenda Mitchel, Pat Franklin and Shirley Van Loo. They were chartered to promote the arts, sciences and humanities in our community.

Back in the early days the Humbug Mt. Committee leased the Heads Wayside State Building which is now known as the Coast Guard Lifesaving Station. They held art classes and shows in the building as well as film series focussing on art and foreign films, lectures, storytellers and even a one man Greek play. The Committee relinquished their interest in the building in 1985. The Port Orford Heritage Society has leased it now and has been making major improvements to it as well as sponsoring field schools and holding lectures.

The Humbug Mountain Committee changed its name to the Port Orford Arts Council in 1987. They held their first arts

festival in 1989. This year the Arts Council celebrates their twentieth anniversary in a big way. This weekend they sponsor the 1997 Arts and Seafood Festival in Port Orford and Langlois. They have several Festival co-sponsors this year including the Port Orford Women's Fishery Network, Port Orford Chamber of Commerce, Port Orford Fishermen's Association and the North Curry Families and Children's Center.

I spoke with Rick Cook - long-time arts council member and their current president. He said he was impressed with the number of participants in the arts festival this year and went on to say that this year features the largest participation from the community thus far.

Live Music

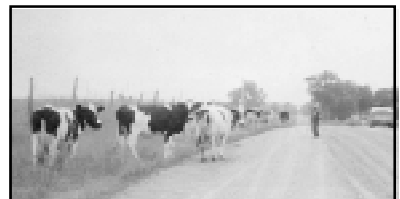
Live music plays a large part in this year's Festival. This Saturday night the wonderful Star Theater is the place to be as three musical groups and one dance troupe perform. The four acts include opening act Mello Wave featuring Vic and Liz Bacigalupi on acoustic bass and harp playing American show tunes; the Anna Powers Dance Company; Bella A Cappella with Coro Dyanne, Chris Hawkins, Julie Hawthorne and Debby Lohry performing contemporary songs A Cappella; and the evening finishes off

with the Pete Lenihan Jazz Ensemble. All this for the low price of \$5 for adults and \$1 for children.

Other live music will be held at the Port and Starboard Restaurant on Saturday night featuring Eddie and Faron. Grumpy's showcases music on Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights. Katz Juice and Java hosts folk pianist and singer Jill Cohn on Saturday night. Spaghetti West has live music this weekend. While you're enjoying the fresh albacore barbecue on Sunday at the Dock Boneyard relax and enjoy the music of Antique Dog.

Another live event is the performance of the play "**The Boy Who Talked to Whales**" at the acoustically correct Star Theater on Sunday night. The play begins at 7:00pm. Carol Malley and her troupe of young people have been working hard rehearsing this play for several weeks. Their first public performance of

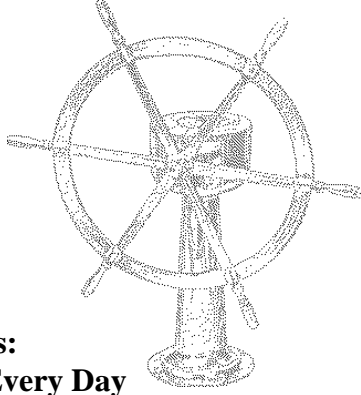

Recall Judge Mickelson Submitted by Carol Tickey

A petition for the recall of Judge Richard Mickelson has been filed with the Secretary of State's office on July 30, 1997.

Chief petitioner for the recall is Carol A. Tickey. Lawrence E. Olds is the treasurer for the recall effort.

Reasons for the recall are as follows:

"I/We believe Judge Richard Mickelson has betrayed the trust of the citizens of Curry County. He has had decisions overturned by the State of Oregon, and caused the State to revise the "search and seizure" law. He has a very high percentage of appeals.

He "prejudges" cases and does not listen to the complete case before he makes his decision.

His arrogance precludes him from re-thinking, for the sake of justice, any of his decisions."

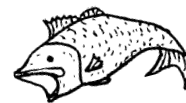

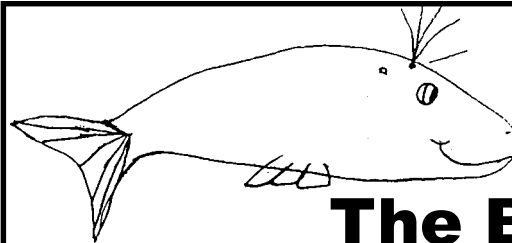

Recall District Attorney Foley Submitted by Carol Tickey

A petition for recall of Curry County District Attorney Patrick Foley has been filed with the Secretary of State's office on July 30, 1997. Chief petitioner for the recall is Carol A. Tickey. Lawrence E. Olds is the treasurer for the recall effort.

Reasons for the recall are as follows:

"I/We believe Patrick Foley has betrayed the trust of the Citizens of Curry County. He was in office a few weeks when he asked the citizens for an \$18,000 raise. He wants another \$16,000 to prosecute kids for making firecrackers.

After five months in office he takes two weeks vacation.

He acted in a disgraceful manner accusing the nurses of being "tempted to steal pills left after the death of a loved one". He wants the Curry County Sheriff's Department to confiscate all medication, and investigate Hospice Deaths.

During Patrick Foley's campaign he promised to turn the Deputy Gardiner killing over to the Grand Jury—after election he changed his mind.

He promised to investigate corruption in the Sheriff's office, and the Port of Brookings/Harbor, after the election, he changed his mind.

Patrick Foley has failed to carry out any of his campaign promises. He has lost his credibility with the citizens, and has become the laughing stock of the other attorneys.

Patrick Foley misuses his office to prosecute maliciously. He refuses to refer cases involving Sheriff's deputies to the Grand Jury. He fails to file charges against known criminals for political reasons."

[In order to force a recall election the valid signatures of 1,376 Curry County registered voters must be turned in to the Secretary of State's office in Salem by October 29, 1997. - Evan Kramer]

Senior News By Mary Yoder

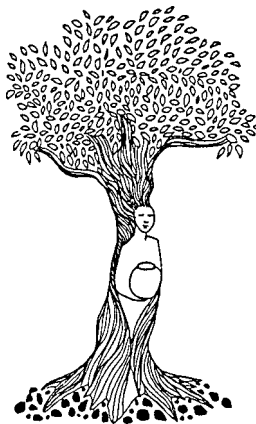

Oregon Lighthouse Week

Next week would be a good time to visit our own Cape Blanco Lighthouse because it is Oregon Lighthouse Week. Governor John Kitzhaber has proclaimed the second week in August to be an annual event "to honor over 100 years of history." The observance began in 1995/

Of Oregon's nine lighthouses, Blanco is the farthest south, farthest west, highest above the sea at its focal plane, and oldest in continuous operation. With a new paint job this spring and a group of volunteers to give informative tours, it is having a good season.

Cape Blanco Lighthouse is open for tours every day except Tuesday and Wednesday. Hours are 10am to 3:30pm.

Yaquina Head, Heceta Head, Umpqua River, Arago and Blanco are all active, automated lighthouses. Tillamook Rock and Cape Arago are not open to the public. All are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

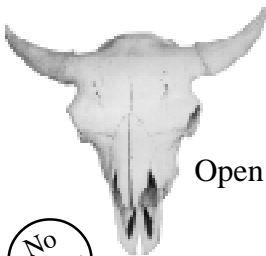
