Community Supports Skateboarders By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council was greeted by a packed house and many new faces at their Monday night meeting.

Public Works Director Jerry McNurlin reported to the council he wanted to purchase two used service trucks from the State of Oregon. These 1990's models would replace the city's two 1970's model trucks. Each would cost between \$4,500 and \$5,500. He also asked the council to purchase an all wheel drive vehicle for use by the city crew working on the filters at the sewer system drain field near Agate Beach. This vehicle would cost \$7600. McNurlin told the council that the public works had the funds to buy the three vehicles. The council agreed by consensus to buy the two trucks and all wheel vehicle.

Fire Chief George Gehrke told the council his department responded to ten calls in August including six vehicle accidents, two brush fires, one house fire and one-fifth-wheel fire. The department has added four new fire fighters. Gehrke said the department needs a new truck. The two city fire trucks are now 25 and 18 years old.

Police Chief Russ Hunt told the council the department had handled 27 criminal cases in August including 12 felonies, 14 misdemeanors and one warrant. They wrote 42 traffic citations and gave out 15 written warnings. Hunt has completed a police reserve policy and said October 1 was the tentative date for bringing the additional police officer on line. 28 applications for the position were turned in and the applicants will be given a written exam at the Community Building.

Skateboard Ordinance

Mayor Gary Doran acknowledged all the young skateboarders in attendance at the meeting and moved the portion of the meeting related to a skateboard ordinance to the beginning of the agenda. He thanked the young people for coming to the meeting and declared that despite what the ordinance said there is "no emergency".

The ordinance which had deeply affected many in the community who had seen it turned out to be a copy of the one used by Coos Bay to regulate skateboarders and rollerskaters. It would have prohibited use of skateboards and rollerskates on Highway 101, defined fines not to exceed \$500 for the first offence and forfeiture of skateboards by repeat offenders. The ordinance described the situation as an "emergency" saying the health, welfare

and safety of the people of Port Orford "require this ordinance have immediate effect".

Chief Hunt said there had been four complaints received regarding skateboarding. Councilor Jim Campbell asked Hunt "Is there a problem with skateboarders"? Hunt told Campbell he "wouldn't call it a problem". The audience greeted this with applause. Brenda Dell, mother of one of the skateboarders, told the council the kids had done a good job of policing themselves. Frank Smith addressed the council and told them to get the skateboard ramp started in Buffington Park. He said we could solve the problem using 10% of the energy in the council chambers to get the ramp done. City Parks and Recreation Planner Jason Seivers told the council he had held several meetings with

the skateboarders and four of them had worked on a design of their choice for the ramp. He said the city was waiting for legal opinion on the city's liability with a skateboard facility. Jasper Shumaker-Pruitt, one of the dozen skateboarders at the meeting, spoke on the positive aspects of the skate park. Councilor Jim Campbell made a motion to revisit the ordinance in 90 days which would be the December council meeting. The motion passed unanimously. Jerry McNurlin noted that the issue of liability is with the insurance company, not the lawyer.

Three cheers for Russ Hunt, Jason Seivers, Brenda Dell and everyone else who showed up at the council meeting regarding this issue.

Councilor Ralph Donaldson offered a resolution stating if there was a positive response from the insurance company

concerning the liability issue the City would make development of the skate facility a top priority for the Parks Department. The council voted unanimously in favor of this motion.

Cellular Phone Competition

The council heard a land use appeal hearing from US Cellular regarding a city planning commission decision at their June 3 meeting. The commission turned down a request from US Cellular for a conditional use permit for a transmission tower at the top of Deady Street on property belonging to Russel Ucolano. Planning Director Butch Parker spoke first and told the council councilor Robert Warring had ex parte contact. Warring said he had attended the May planning commission meeting and heard both sides of the issue. Parker recommended Warring not vote on the appeal because if he did it would leave grounds for an appeal.

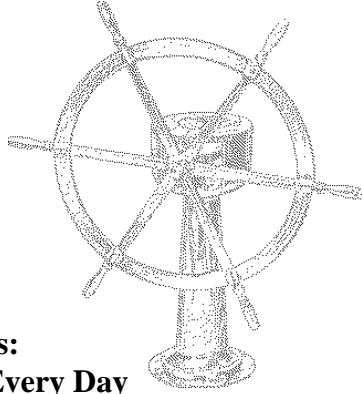

Warring strenuously objected to not getting to vote. Jim Campbell said he had spoken to city attorney Randal Tosch and Tosch recommended Warring shouldn't vote. Ralph Donaldson stepped in and made a motion that Robert Warring be excluded from voting on the appeal. It passed 4-1 with Carl Eskelson the sole dissenter. Warring was excused from participating in the hearing. Butch Parker then made it clear that the council only hear from people already on record from the two planning commission meetings.

John Blackhurst, a lawyer representing US Cellular, said the company didn't have a cell phone site in Port Orford. He described the tower as a 130 foot tall wood monopole painted brown with an adjoining 10'x20' equipment shelter located on a 50'x50' portion of Ucolano's property. He said the company had tried to minimize the effect of the tower on the environment. Councillor Ruth Jamieson asked Parker what the council's job was regarding the appeal. He told her it was to determine if the applicant met all four criteria for a conditional use permit in a residential one zone for a transmission

tower and base their vote on that. Councillor Tim Sparks made a motion to approve US Cellular's conditional use permit but it died for lack of a second. Carl Eskelson then offered a motion upholding the planning commission's June 3 decision. It passed 4-1 with Sparks voting no. Butch Parker told the council US Cellular had 21 days to appeal the council's actions to the Land Use Board of Appeals.

Other Business

Co-chairs of the Community Resource Team Ed and Nancy Dowdy said the next meeting of the CRT would be on Thursday, September 11, 7:00pm, at the Senior Center. The CRT will hold elections for officers. Nancy Dowdy said the \$30,000 Forest Service grant for the city entrance signs and Highway 101 beautification had been received. Ed Dowdy said bids had been put out for work on the wayfinder site at Battle Rock Park and some work might go to local contractors.

Jason Seivers told the council he is leaving his job in 38 hours. His position has been funded by a Forest Service grant. He spoke to the council about the Community Center/Library plans. He presented the seven options worked out by

the project design committee and architect James Tronson. The preferred option is number seven, which involves a complete remodeling of the Community Building and American Legion Hall and the construction of a new library with a second story for classes and other community activities. Seivers told the council they need a new project manager for the project since he is leaving. Ralph Donaldson made a motion for the city to adopt option #7 as the preferred plan. It passed unanimously. Donaldson then thanked Seivers for all the work he has done for the city. Seivers was given a heartfelt standing ovation by many in the audience. Ed Dowdy volunteered to serve as co-liasion with Nancy Dowdy on the community center project working with the council. They will also take the lead searching for 1.7 million dollars in grant money to pay for the center.

Citizens Concerns

Vietnam Veteran Mark Creighton told the council he was concerned about the City not recognizing the Missing in Action servicemen. He said September 15 is National Prisoner of War and Missing in Action day. He asked the council if they would issue a proclamation making September 15 MIA-POW recognition day. He asked them to fly the MIA-POW flag below the Oregon flag. Ralph Donaldson made a motion approving a proclamation making September 15 MIA-POW honor

day and that the MIA-POW flag be flown on a daily basis. The council approved this motion 5-1.

Port Orford resident Brian Conaway spoke to the council about farm wastes and garbage polluting the lake near his home on Idaho Street. His property adjoins the portion of the lake that used to be a log pond leading into Garrison Lake. He said the neighboring property at 18th and Arizona was being used as a farm. He said the former city manager had made illegal deals with the property owner. Conaway asked the council to enforce the city ordi-

nances and make a riparian border for the property. Jason Seivers spoke to the council in support of Conaway and said the farm has encroached on a large section of Port Orford city property. Mayor Doran said this is an enforcement issue and indicated it was time to take action.

The council had taken over three hours and fifteen minutes to get to this point. They took care of a few more items of business and then adjourned with several items of old and new business, reports, consent calendar and other items left for a continuation of this meeting on Monday, September 29.

Nat'l Register of Historic Sites

Are you interested in how historical buildings are designated as "Historical?" Join members of the Point Orford Heritage Society this Friday, September 12, when they meet with Henry Kunowski of the State Historical Preservation Office to discuss listing the Port Orford Heads Lifesaving Station site.

Using the designation of the Port Orford Lifesaving Station - considered the finest example of its kind on the west coast - as an example, Mr. Kunowski will tell how the listing process is done, from initial application to federal recognition. Mr. Kunowski will review the paperwork and research his office has prepared for the Port Orford site.

Several buildings in the Port Orford area are already recognized as historically significant and are listed on the National Registry. Included on the list are the Sixes Hotel and the Hughes House. Other

buildings in the area may also be eligible. This will be a great opportunity to find out which buildings may qualify, what the application process is and what the benefits of being recognized are.

Everyone is welcome to attend this presentation, and invited to join in the discussion and have your questions about historical buildings answered. The program will be at the Port Orford Heads State Park in Port Orford, Friday, September 12 at 7pm. For more information call 332-2352.

Letter to the Editor,

Ninety-nine percent of the yards in Port Orford and its adjacent areas are tasteful and attractive. Then there's the other one-percent. According to County Commissioner Bill Roberts, there is no legal recourse to remedy somebody else littering his own rural private property. What they can't toss on the street they can toss into their own yards.

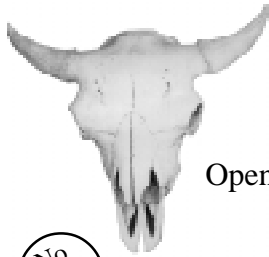
I would like recourse against squalor, slovenliness and litter bugging of private rural property in those few instances where people with little personal pride dump indiscriminately on their yards in plain public view. A long overdue statute protecting legitimate land use, prohibiting unsightly dumping of broken glass, burned-out and unreparable wrecks, etc., and providing a reasonable grace period for owner remedy without penalty (but with inspection and verification of the remedy) is necessary to eliminate the eyesores and child endangering hazards inflicted by so few.

This new chip set is the first to offer support for the Accelerated Graphics Port (AGP) which promises to speed up video tremendously. In present systems the CPU has to send all the data to the video card via the bus which runs, at best, at about 33Mhz and may be busy with other tasks. The new AGP port is a direct connection between the CPU and the video system which allows data transfer at up to 133Mhz without going thru the bus. 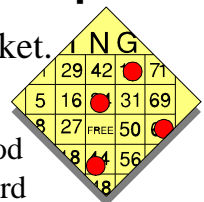
