## **How Far Can You Go?**

Ballots are due back to the Curry County Elections department by March 11, 8:00pm as voting continues in the City of Port Orford on how to finance a sewer outfall replacement project. Only voters registered in the City of Port Orford can vote on this issue.

A double majority is needed to pass the General Obligation bond ballot measure #0838. This means at least 50% plus one people must vote and a majority of those who vote have to vote "yes" on it for it to pass. According to the Curry County Elections Department 113 ballots or 18% of the total had been sent in as of March 3. The County Elections Department will have an attended ballot drop off box at city hall in the council chambers starting on Friday from 9:00 to 4:30pm and on Monday the same hours and then Tuesday, March 11 from 7:00am to 8:00pm.

If the General Obligation Bond measure does not pass voters will then get a chance in the May 20 election to vote on financing the sewer outfall project with revenue bonds. If neither passes we're handing the problem over to the Department

of Environmental Quality and it won't be pleasant for anyone. One effect if both the GO Bonds or Revenue bonds were to fail is, according to DEQ representative Jon Gasik, there will be "no building in Port Orford." The moratorium on new sewer permits will not be lifted and that's just the beginning.

## **Hazardous Waste Cleanup**

The Curry County Solid Waste/Recycling Committee met on Tuesday, February 25 in Gold Beach. They discussed the once postponed but now back on track household hazardous waste cleanup day. Curry Transfer and Recycle Company manager Pete Smart said he was 99.9% certain the cleanup day would be held this June. Funding comes from a grant from the Department of Environmental Quality. The site for this year's household hazardous waste cleanup day will be the Curry Transfer and Recycle Station in Brookings on Carpentersville Road. Homeowners will be given an opportunity to bring in their unwanted paints, insecticides and other hazardous waste for free. Smart said there could be a charge for businesses bringing in hazardous waste. The recycling committee discussed encouraging people from Port Orford and Gold Beach to carpool when they bring their waste materials down to Brookings rather than everyone drive

alone. Once the exact date is set for the cleanup day there will be press releases and advertising in the newspapers announcing the event, date, time and location and a list of exactly what kind of hazardous materials can be turned in.

## **The Coastal Express**

Bill Dooley, manager of Curry Public Transit, said he attended the ribbon cutting ceremony between the Curry and Del Norte County commission at the "Bug Station" as it is known last Friday. The "Bug Station" is actually the border crossing station at the California-Oregon border where motorists are stopped going southbound and asked if they're carrying any fruit or vegetables. Dooley said that Northwest Transportation, which runs the bus company in Del Norte County, comes as far north as Smith River and goes south to Klamath. Curry Public Transit takes passengers as far south as Brookings and as far north as the Pony Village Mall in North Bend. Dooley is working with Del Norte County to provide service to Crescent City and Klamath by having Curry Public Transit buses meet Del Norte buses at the border crossing station. If this can be accomplished people will be able to travel 155 miles between Klamath and North Bend. Currently Curry Public Transit

**A While Ago . . .**

A while ago someone asked why the Council Chambers at City Hall are named the “Gilbert Gable Council Chambers” and it reminded me that there is an interesting story about that very thing.

In 1975, Port Orford’s new City Hall complex was almost complete, except that the Council Chambers were only roughed in and the City found it didn’t have the \$18,000 necessary to finish that project.

Mayor Leon White wrote to Robert Gable, son of Port Orford’s first mayor, to see if he would be willing to donate the money to finish the chambers. In return for this gift, the Chambers would be named after and forever dedicated to the memory of Gilbert Gable, with a picture of him permanently displayed behind the Mayor’s chair.

Mayor White also mentioned that November 1975, which would mark the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the incorporation of Port Orford, would be a good time for a dedication of the new facilities.

Robert Gable quickly sent an enthusiastic acceptance of Mayor White’s proposal, which was ratified by the City Council. When he sent a picture of his father to be enlarged and hung in the Council Chambers, he mentioned that the picture was especially appropriate because it had been taken around the time that Port Orford was founded.

All living former Mayors of Port Orford were invited to the dedication of the Chamber on November 8, 1975, but members of the Gable family were Guests of Honor. The Gables were kept busy the whole time they were here, with a boat trip of the harbor, visits to local landmarks and meetings with old timers who remembered Gilbert Gable, but the high-

light of the weekend was the dedication and the reception that followed it.

In his letter of thanks to the people of Port Orford, Robert Gable mentioned how thrilled he had been to see that the chairs he had watched his father make were still being used by the Council. Those unique chairs are still in use at City Hall and the Battle Rock Visitor Center and remain in excellent condition.

Next time you stop by City Hall, take a look at the picture hanging in the Council Chambers and the lettering on the wall and think some kind thoughts about the people who made these Chambers possible a while ago.

Dear SP, System freezes are one of the most aggravating problems that can develop, primarily because there are many possible causes, from software to hardware. I think you are on the right track eliminating unused programs first, particularly those that are started automatically by Windows. Another common cause of freezes is overheating, due to poor system design, dust buildup, or fans burning out, so look into these problems as well.


**Letter to the Editor,**





**A Privilege to Serve

My name is Jerry Stoo pes, my wife Jackie and I moved from Lane County in the Eugene area to the Elk River in 1986. We love this area and its people. I would like to tell you about our family and a history of military service that goes to the Civil War. My great grandfather John Stoo pes was a member of the Union Army in 1862. Next was my great uncle Fred Podas who fought in the Philip-pines in 1898 in the Spanish American War. Uncle Fred was the national commander of the Spanish War veterans in the mid sixties. My uncle Fred Thomp-son served in France in World War I and was involved in the Argonne Forest bat-tle. Then it was my turn to serve my country in World War II. I was drafted right out of high school into the Army. After basic training I joined the Eleventh Airborne Division for parachute and glider training. I served with the Eleventh Airborne Division one hundred eighty eighth parachute regiment in late 1945 through 1946 as part of the occupation based in Sendia Japan.

My younger brothers Tom and Michael served in the Korean War. Both sur- vived but my youngest brother Michael was wounded and almost captured.

These men were not career military men but citizen soldiers who served their coun- try when called. I don't think this is an

The Celtic music of the British Isles has continued to increase in popularity for the past several years, and one of the groups spearheading this popularity is the international touring and recording group Golden Bough. The group will perform pieces from Scotland, Ireland, Wales, Cornwall, the Isle of Man, Brittany and Galicia in a concert at The Savoy Theatre, 811 Hwy 101 in Port Orford on Thursday, April 3 at 7:30 PM.

Since 1980 Margie Butler and Paul Espinoza (co-founders of Golden Bough) have recorded and performed not only the better known music of Ireland & Scotland, but also the music of the lesser known Celtic lands of Wales, Cornwall, The Isle of Man, French Brittany and Galicia. The newest addition to Golden Bough's line-up is violinist Kathy Sierra, whose vibrant energy, exquisite fiddling and dulcet vocals compliment the singing and playing styles of Butler and Espinoza.

The music of Galicia is the latest to be added to Golden Bough's ever-growing Celtic repertoire. Galicia is one of the few areas in Continental Europe that has been able to maintain its Celtic culture. With melodies similar to Irish and Scottish music, the Galician music also incorporates the rhythms of Spain, giving it an exceptional flavor of its own. Espinoza, whose family has roots in Spain, hopes to continue the research of this province and further explore the Celtic music of Galicia, incorporating it even more into Golden Bough's collected works.

Besides the traditional music of the Celtic lands, Golden Bough also performs their own compositions, many of which are based on these musical styles. With a dazzling array of acoustic instruments and haunting vocal styling, this trio of modern day minstrels presents a program that leaves little room for audience members to lose interest. Their instrumentation includes; the Celtic harp, guitar, penny-whistle, recorder, violin, viola, octave-mandolin, accordion, and bodhran (the Irish hand drum). Blending their voices in three-part harmony they sing ballads, lively sing-alongs and beautiful a capella pieces. Audiences are delighted by the group's fresh approach to the ancient Celtic music.

provides service for Port Orford residents both south to Gold Beach and Brookings and north to Langlois, Bandon and Coos Bay and North Bend.

There are three southbound buses out of Port Orford and three north bound buses. The bus stop in Port Orford is located at Battle Rock Park opposite the Wheelhouse Restaurant but that location will change soon. Dooley has made an arrangement with Ray's Place Market in Port Orford to put the bus stop and bench at their location near where the big Ray's sign is located. Down the road Dooley is planning to put the bus stop across the street on the new Port Orford Public Library property and it will include a bus shelter.
