Motorcycle Mania

There are two big events in the motorcycle world this year. One is the centennial celebration of the founding of the Harley-Davidson Motorcycle Company. The other event takes place in Port Orford where Stan Dishong's **Antique Motorcycle and Auto Museum** opens this Thursday.

Stan Dishong lives on a 25-acre ranch south of Langlois where his antique motorcycles have been housed. He and his late wife Jackie moved to the area in 1988. In May of this year Stan bought the Battle Rock Garage from Bill Foster and immediately began work on the motorcycle and car museum. Three months of hard work seven days a week pays off this Thursday with the grand opening.

The 75 years young Dishong has been interested in motorcycles all his adult

life. He bought his first Harley in 1944, one year before he joined the Merchant Marines where he served from 1945-46. Stan said he grew up moving around a lot, as his father was an owner and trainer of racehorses.

Stan opened a motorcycle shop in 1953 in Vallejo, CA, which he owned and ran through 1987. In addition to Stan's Cycle Shop he and his wife Jackie operated a motorcycle parts manufacturing facility called Dishong Manufacturing. He said it was a B.S.A. shop though he worked more on Harley's than B.S.A.s. It was during the years he ran his shop that he started collecting motorcycles. His first purchase of an older bike was a 1929 Indian "4" which he bought for \$15 and sold for \$100 and which is now worth many thousands of dollars. Since then he's hung on to his collection.

The oldest motorcycle that will be on display at the museum is an 1896 Marks. The cycle was made in San Francisco. Stan bought it for \$100 and he says it may be the only one left in existence.

The Marks motorcycle he owns has engine #1.

The newest motorcycle in Stan's collection on display is a 1956 BSA Gold Star Clubman racing bike. There will be 30 antique motorcycles on display at the museum including a 1903 Indian, a 1910 Indian and a 1929 Harley 45 once owned by actor Steve McQueen. Stan bought the McQueen motorcycle at an auction at the Imperial Hotel in Las Vegas for \$1,700. He also bought McQueen's bathroom fixtures. Steve McQueen was an avid motorcyclist, and collector of motorcycles and antique airplanes. He had a couple of hangars at the Santa Paula, CA airport where many of his restored motorcycles and airplanes were housed. The bathroom fixtures came from the Santa Paula airport.

Stan emphasized that his collection of motorcycles is all antique and all original. He is also a skilled machinist and when the bikes needed a replacement part he was able to machine them. He

The Sri Lankan Story

There was a valiant effort made by the community of Port Orford to support the Sri Lankan family that was left without means here during the months of May and June 2003.

The Nesan family had obtained legitimate travel visas. They came to Port Orford with the understanding that they would be "taken care of" by their former employer Acey Johnson and Long Lee. Johnson and Lee, Consular Associate and Chief Administrative Officer respectively of the U.S. Embassy in Sri Lanka were arrested for numerous alleged fraud and visa violations. Johnson had hired the Nesan family to work as cooks and domestics at their home and at the Lem-on Grass Restaurant that never opened.

The town showed their kind hearts and donated money that went into a fund at Klamath First Bank for the family to

reestablish themselves upon return to Sri Lanka. In addition, there were numerous donations of food and gifts including bail, pro bono legal aid, meals and lodging during their Portland immigration hearings. These services and expenses were covered by donations.

The family left Portland for Denver to seek out other arrangements. Since then, no one has heard from them. The last court date was for July 22. An appeal for visa fraud and petition for asylum were denied. The Nesan family did not show for that hearing. The Immigration court ordered the aliens to return to Sri Lanka.

We really cared about these people and tried to do our best. We felt it was not right to support them in continuing to stay in the US illegally, therefore we are returning the donations that were deposited on their behalf. Those people who made anonymous donations please contact Bob Ewalt at 332-7051 to arrange

for returns. All unclaimed donations will be given to the library fund. Genuine thanks to the community for giving their support during this experience.

The Black's opened their "Cars and Things of Yesterday" museum in July 2002 in a building adjacent to their home on Silver Springs Road. It included five antique autos and other memorabilia. They both enjoyed the many visitors who came to their museum from all of the country and as far away as Italy and Germany. Jim's eyesight has been deteriorating and this has hastened the closing of their museum.

said one third of the motorcycles at the museum are Harley-Davidsons including a 1934 Harley Speedway. Stan said 20 of these were manufactured and only three or four are left.

The museum features a beautiful mural covering the north wall, painted by Patrick Em of Coos Bay. It depicts a motorcycle race on an oval dirt track at the Tacoma, Washington fairgrounds in 1918.

Stan also raced motorcycles. He raced a Harley Special motorcycle at the Bonneville Salt Flats in 1951 and hit 156 miles per hour. This would have been the world record but at the same time a group of Germans put together a racing team and one of them set the record at 180 miles per hour on the autobahn driving an NSU motorcycle. Stan raced at the Nationals in Vacaville and won one National at that track in the quarter mile drags. Stan recently raced his 1979 Camaro at Coos Bay Speedway in the quarter mile drags.

Stan developed many motorcycle innovations including the extended forks, springer front ends, the shift and lever

mechanism and stroker fly wheels. He didn't patent these ideas but told me no one was making these motorcycle parts when he started to build them.

There is more to the Antique Motorcycle and Auto Museum. Stan will display his antique gun collection including his 1752 wheel lock rifle. He recently purchased three cars from Jim and Jane Black's antique car museum and they will be on display. These include a 1916 Hudson, a 1922 Essex and a 1923 Essex Touring Car. Stan also has a collection of antique musical instruments, radios and televisions that will be on display in the 4,000 square foot building. A portion of the museum displays the antique and turn of the century machines he acquired when he bought the Battle Rock garage. Most of these machine tools are belt driven and include a shaper, a spring hammer, a 1910 lather and a drill press. Stan has room to expand his museum in the future as the property included two additions to the main building, which will eventually include parts of the collection.

The museum will be open seven days a week from 10:00am to 7:00pm. Admission is \$6.50 for adults, \$5.50 for seniors and \$4.50 for children ages 6 through 12

Port Orford Mayor Gary Doran hosted a large gathering at the groundbreaking ceremony for the sewer ocean outfall project. The ceremony was held at Agate Beach State Park along the graded road to the beach. Mayor Doran began by reminding everyone of Joe Edney who had passed away recently. Edney had worked for DEQ and been actively involved with the Port Orford project. Doran thanked city administrator Erna Barnett who he said had worked long and hard on this project. He said it wouldn't have come along this rapidly without her. Doran introduced many people in attendance including Curry County commissioner Lucie LaBonte, Chris Conroy – representing U.S. Representative Peter DeFazio and Mike Murphy – Curry County Emergency Services Coordinator. Doran thanked State Parks and Parks Manager Frank Eckley for their cooperation during this project.

Livestock Assistance Program

Agriculture Secretary Ann M. Veneman announced sign-up for the Livestock Assistance Program (LAP) begins August 6. This program was authorized by the Agricultural Assistance Act of 2003 (2003 Act) and \$250 million were made available to livestock producers for grazing losses that occurred in either 2001 or 2002. When the sign-up period ends (Oct. 24, 2003), the total value of all applications will be determined and if in excess of \$250 million will be adjusted proportionately.

"This program will provide additional relief to livestock producers who suffered grazing losses due to drought, severe weather and related causes, and have limited safety net and risk management tools available," said Veneman.

Under LAP, a producer's grazing land must be located in a county that was declared a primary disaster area under a

Presidential or Secretarial declaration. Both Coos and Curry were designated as disaster counties for losses due to drought starting April 15, 2002 and continuing.

In addition to designation as a disaster area for 2001 or 2002, additional LAP eligibility criteria must be met for each year. Both Coos and Curry have requested authority to implement LAP – neither county has been approved yet. A county must have suffered at least a 40 percent grazing loss for three or more consecutive months in a calendar year in order to be eligible for that year. A county may meet eligibility requirements for both 2001 and 2002; however, a producer may receive a LAP payment for only one of the years.

LAP is a grazing loss program. However, payments are on a per head basis of eligible livestock, including beef and dairy cattle, buffalo, beefalo, sheep, goats, swine and certain equine animals. A producer must have control of adequate grazing land to support the eligible livestock. During 2001 or 2002, a livestock producer must have suffered a 40 percent or greater loss of grazing production for three or more consecutive months due to drought, hot weather, disease, insect infestation, flood, fire, hurricane, earthquake, severe storm or other natural disasters.

The 2003 Act required that an adjusted gross income (AGI) limitation apply. Also, LAP payments to a producer will

be reduced by the amount of assistance received by that producer under previous Livestock Compensation Programs (LCP-I, LCP-II) and the 2002 Cattle Feed Program. A producer must possess beneficial and financial interests in eligible livestock that have been owned or leased for at least three months. A \$40,000 payment limitation also applies to LAP assistance.

USDA has developed a Web site (<http://disaster.usda.gov/>) that provides producers with one convenient location for details on new and existing disaster assistance.

CFPA vs. Lightning

A thunderstorm hit Oregon with 94,000 lightning strikes Monday evening, Aug. 4, and ignited eight wildfires within the Coos Forest Protective Association borders. The fires took place in the north interior of the district. One fire was located within the Elliott State Forest, three near Bridge, one that was five miles north of Reedsport, two near Scottsburg and one between Coquille and Coos Bay. All but one fire had been contained and extinguished by Wednesday morning. Crews are making their way into an area near Wells Creek to suppress the last fire, which is .01 acre in size. All fires range in size from .01 to .25 acre. CFPA anticipates picking up additional sleeper fires from the storm in the next few days. Firefighters will continue ground and air patrols looking for smoke.

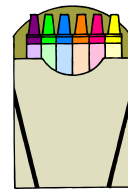
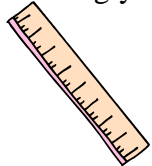
End of Summer Celebration

Biscuit Fire Salvage

Representative Peter DeFazio sent a letter to the US Forest Service on August 6 urging them not to delay the salvage and reforestation of the Biscuit Fire.

DeFazio said in his letter to Forest Service Chief Dale Bosworth and Regional Forester Goodman that "The Forest Supervisor of the Rogue and Siskiyou National Forest, Scott Conroy and his team have worked diligently to prepare a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DE-ISS) which analyzes five alternatives. This DEIS was nearly complete and ready for public comment, which would have put them on schedule to offer salvage and reforestation contracts later this fall. I am extremely disturbed that at this late date, the Forest Service is considering adding a sixth alternative to the DEIS. I am concerned that the further analysis required to include another alternative will unnecessarily delay salvage and reforestation of the Biscuit Fire well into next year.

It has now been 10 months since the Biscuit fire burned. To recover any wood of value and lessen erosion, whatever post-fire rehabilitation will occur should take place as soon as possible next Spring and Summer. What delay in this work do you anticipate by analyzing other alternatives in the DEIS.

I urge you to not unnecessarily delay a good salvage proposal by analyzing additional alternatives in the DEIS."

The DEIS was expected to be completed and released by the end of August, putting the Forest Service on schedule to offer salvage and restoration contracts later this fall.

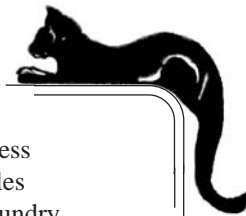

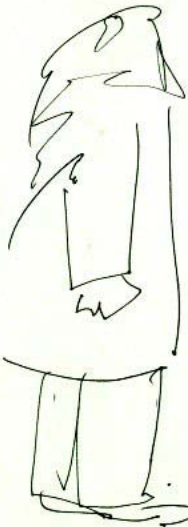

Electrical, water, and sewer services to the site are to be protected and preserved during the demolition and grading.
