**Library Book & Fish Sale
This Saturday & Sunday**

Fresh Start By Evan Kramer



The Friends of the Port Orford Public Library are holding their semi-annual book sale this weekend at the Community Building. This sale is special for many reasons including it will be

held on Saturday and Sunday for the first time. Hours for the Saturday portion of the book sale are from 9:00am to 3:00pm and on Sunday the doors swing open again for eager book buyers from 10:00am to 2:00pm. Port Orford Librarian Tobe Porter told me on Monday that the sale this year is bigger than ever. The Friends of the Library received three generous donations of book collections. Bessie Laursen donated her late husband Orville's huge and eclectic book collection to the library sale. Merlene and John Stockman donated their collection of quality books to the sale and Brenda Fanning Foster donated a collection of books from a friend of hers. Tobe Porter said there will be books for sale on every imaginable subject including religion, history, health, gardening, and biographies. Porter said most would be hard-bound books. What makes this sale so special is the way Porter described it – as a “fresh start.” The books for sale on

Saturday and Sunday this week will be for sale for the first time and none will be holdovers from previous sales. The only books, which may be familiar, will be books culled from the library's collection but for them it will be their first time on the sale tables.

Not all of the books donated in these three collections went up for sale. Some of them were put in the library collection for people to check out. Adria Merryman, a member of the Friends of the Library, sells some of them on eBay. Most of the books on sale this weekend will go for \$1.00 for hardbacks and fifty cents for paperbacks. A few of the even better books are priced higher and there will also be a silent auction for some of the book sets.

The Friends of the Library is a volunteer organization, which supports the Port Orford Library and deserves a big thank you for all they have done and continue to do. They gave the Library \$1,900 last year to help pay for some expenses including computers and Internet service. In addition the Friends gave the Port Orford Library Foundation \$2,500 for the new library which is in the planning stage right now and about to get even more exciting. Architect Rich Turi will speak and present his most current drawings for the new library including floor

plans and what it will look like from the outside on Thursday evening, November 6, at 7:00pm. The meeting will be held in the city hall council chambers and will be an opportunity for the public to see the plans, ask questions and make comments.

There's a lot going on at the Port Orford Library. Despite being overcrowded (and I do understand that problem) the library continues to bring in a wide variety of new books for adults and children. Examples of some of the new adult acquisitions since August 29 of this year include John D. MacDonald's "The Executioners", Orson Scott Card's "Homebody, A Novel", Julie Garwood's "Mercy", Jim Hightower's "Thieves in High Places", Georgia Raimondi's "The Passionate Gardener", and Linda Greenlaw's "The Lobster Chronicles: Life on a Very Small Island." New children's books include Roald Dahl's "The Fantastic Mr. Fox" and Bill Cosby's "Friends of a Feather: One of Life's Little Fables."

The Library added several new books on cassettes and compact discs for those who enjoy listening to a book being read while driving around this big, beautiful state.

All this searching for book treasures will get you hungry and the fishing commu-

Letter to the Editor,

On 9/26/03 the Coos Curry Electric Cooperative (CCEC) Board approved the 2001 and 2002 completed audit from Auditor Ken Kuhns. Jim Arntz, General Manager, stated that he would be putting out a news release but refused to tell owner/members, present at this meeting, the amount of taxes, penalties owed by South Coast Satellite.

Owner/Members in the audience suggested that any monies taken from Coos Curry Electric coffers to pay South Coast Satellite bills/taxes/penalties/interest be pre-approved by the Board. Historically, this has not been done. When asked about actual documentation of a supposed "Line-of-Credit" document from Coos Curry Electric to South Coast Satellite, Jim Arntz hesitated and then stated that it was "in the minutes". It is imperative that CCEC follow good business practices and General Accounting Procedures (GAP) that would be used to track and control money movement including legalized loan payments between Coos Curry Electric and South Coast Satellite. When asked if any money has ever been paid back to Coos Curry Elec-

tric on this "loan", Board member Vern Kolan (47 years on Board) refused saying this was not information for the owner/members. If not owner/members-who??

Board Member Monte Lund (23 years on Board) stated that he felt the job of a Director of the Board was to hire the General Manager and then let him do the job. It took 18 months of delay to get the Audit done. Taxes were not paid by SCSC for 2 years. That was the General Manager's job. It's the job of the Board of Directors to **Direct** the job get done. With this thinking, how does Mr. Lund justify each Board member receiving \$350.00 per meeting that they attend and also paid health insurance. On Mr. Lund's work schedule, that equates to about \$220 per hour compensation. We need Board Members that put in time to work for CCEC and its owner/members and prevent these gross losses.

We have two newer Board Members who are actively attempting to gain a clear picture of Coos Curry Electric's business practices as well as get a perspective of how Coos Curry Electric fares in comparison to national rural electric cooperatives. NRECA (National

Rural Electric Cooperative Association) would charge \$27,000 for 3 experts to do this study. But Monte Lund (23 year on Board) stated: I don't see what we would learn from this. (Maybe we would learn how to prevent a \$18 Million dollar loss in one business year. Let's see, \$27,000 versus \$18 Million. Is there something to be learned here?)

If he has to accept having a study done, Jim Arnst wants to hire his friend from the "Ruralite" to do the job for less money. And less info????

You pay for what you get and if you don't get it, —you pay -(\$18 Million Loss). Get it? Got it? Good!

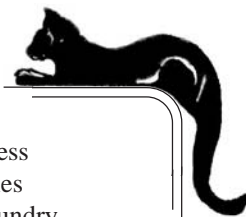

Beach Cleanup

It's time for the fall version of the Great Oregon Beach Cleanup on Saturday, October 11. Volunteers meet at 10:00am at Battle Rock Park at the visitor center. You will be given plastic bags to collect the trash you gather on the beach. Please bring rubber gloves or other hand protection. Exercise extreme caution on rocks and cliffs and don't touch medical waste (needles, bandages, etc.). Just mark the location with driftwood and report it to the Beach Captain when you return your trash bags to the meeting site. Other area places to help out on the beach cleanup are "The Barn" in Bandon City Park and the Port of Gold Beach Parking lot.

This is the twentieth anniversary of the statewide volunteer beach cleanup. Since then, annual beach cleanups have spread to 55 states and U.S. territories as well as 109 countries worldwide. In 2002, 391,000 volunteers picked up 8.2 million pounds of trash from 12,400 miles of coastline worldwide.

This year organizers of the beach clean up have been asked that participants be on the lookout for anything that could have possibly come off a fishing vessel. The family of missing fisherman Ken Tison of Bandon is looking for any evidence of his white fishing boat the "C-Lady". Tison has been missing at sea for 41 days.

**Phase 1 Construction
 by Evan Kramer**

The Port Orford effluent disposal system project took an unexpected turn last week but all has been straightened out.

Word that there was a problem came in the form of an e-mail from City Administrator Erna Barnett. The placement of the sewer outfall pipe had gone successfully. The opening in the ocean floor the pipe extended from was 2.5 feet above a sand floor. Next step: placement of the diffuser unit – a long piece of pipe with six openings for treated water to be released out of and into the ocean, in other words diffused with the ocean water. The video of the ocean floor in this area taken last fall displayed a bottom with smooth rock. Wrong! What the contractors found was a bottom “actually comprised of rock projections with troughs 4’ to 6’ deep between filled with sand”. Barnett went on to say, “There is no rock surface broad enough on which to attach the diffuser.”

This information necessitated an additional Change Order. The idea the contractor and engineers came up with was to buy 1,000 bags of concrete, load them onto a tugboat at the Port of Port Orford and have them delivered to the barge located at the diffuser site. The bags were then lowered into the troughs and punctured to let water seep in and solidify the concrete. Erna Barnett said that

SHN project engineer Steve Donovan had told her the diffuser is secured. Barnett said the concrete bags had been placed. The barge left for Coos Bay last weekend in anticipation of large swells at Agate Beach but is scheduled to return later this week. The City Council will have to approve this Change Order at their meeting on October 20.

The next step in the construction process is to have the divers place the concrete matting over the diffuser unit as extra insurance it won't go anywhere.

In a second e-mail to council and press Erna Barnett explained the financial aspect of this latest Change Order. She says, “Again I reassure you all that the cost of this is part of the project funding; rate payers do not pay for these additional costs.”

This part of the sewer outfall project is known as Phase 1. It is due to be complete by January 31, 2004 and includes the outfall, UV installation at the sewer treatment plant and a new lift station. The moratorium on sewer hookups will be lifted after Phase 1 is complete. The Department of Environmental Quality

has previously let the City issue 15 permits for sewer hookups based on the progress of this project.

People's Voice Heard

Laura Jo Hofsess, owner of Port Orford Funeral Service, said on Tuesday, that the Oregon State Mortuary and Cemetery Board have made a decision she can continue to manage two funeral homes. She received word from them on September 30 about this decision.

Hofsess is also the licensed manager for Myrtle Grove Funeral Service in Coos Bay. Hofsess said she has been managing both for nine years but several months ago the Mortuary Board moved to force her to have a licensed manager on the premises of both businesses. Had this decision gone into effect she would have been forced to close Port Orford Funeral Service.

Hofsess said the Board's decision was made because the people in Port Orford spoke out in large numbers and wrote letters to the board and their legislators.

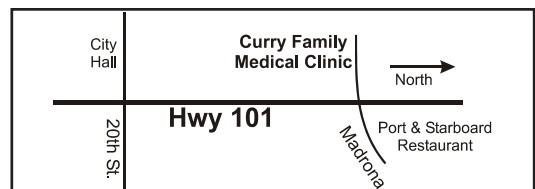

The Curry Cultural Trust Planning Council held three meetings in Curry County seeking input on their draft mission statement, goals and strategies. The group will be meeting over the next few months to discuss any changes from the public comment, revising the draft document and creating benchmarks for the goals. That will complete their task. **The Little Jail
 By Becky Flake**

Over the years our little jailhouse has become a popular landmark. Built in 1936 during the timber boom days in Port Orford and condemned in 1965, it has since been left to nature's artistic hand. Now it stands dressed with ivy hair, crying rusty tears, inviting us to take one more snapshot. I doubt if it every held more than the drunk and disorderly or a few overnight vagrants. One jailbreak was reported in the 1950's, when the little jail's hospitality was extended to a logger. His friends backed a log truck up to the jail, wrapped chains around the window bars and yanked them out. However, he was found not guilty as Port Orford had no statute forbidding jailbreaks at the time of his trial.

Wind Power Hearing

The Curry County Planning Commission meets on Thursday, October 9, at 7:00pm, in the Curry County Courthouse Annex, lower level conference room.

The meeting will begin with a public hearing # AD-0336 – filed by Pacific Wind Power, LLC (John V. Stahl), agent for Knapp Ranches, Inc./Kamph Ranch, LLC/A&M Haga – a request for conditional use approval to establish a Utility

Facility Necessary for Public Service Which Must Be Sited in an Agricultural Zone in order for the service to be provided; and a request for conditional use approval for Development in an Area of Special Flood Hazard. The subject properties are three ranches in the Langlois area, west of State Highway 101, lying within the Forestry Grazing (FG) and Exclusive Farm Use (EFU) Zones; and also one or more areas lying within an Area of Special Flood Hazard. The subject property is located in Townships 30 and 31, Range 15, an area between Highway 101 and the Pacific Ocean near the rural community of Langlois.

The public hearing regards installation of a industrial wind farm on over 2,200 acres of farm land located approximately one mile west of Langlois and within one and one quarter miles of Floras Lake. Phase one for the project includes installation of three 180-foot high data gathering towers and a large wind farm with from 150 to 250 wind turbines. The windmills will be 180 feet tall topped with three rotation blades 100 to 140 feet long bringing their full height to 250 to 300 feet.
