Christmas in Port Orford By Evan Kramer



Christmas comes early to Port Orford this year. This Saturday residents and visitors can enjoy four Holiday bazaars in the area. This is also the second year for Port

Orford's Bargain Holiday, which is a fundraiser for the Port Orford Public Library. Sixty-one area businesses have pledged either a cash donation or contributing a percentage of their sales this Saturday, December 6 to the building of the new Port Orford Library. Last year's Bargain Holiday was a big success and this one looks even better.

Port Orford's Bargain Holiday is sponsored by the Port Orford Friends of the Library, the Port Orford Library Foundation and the Chamber of Commerce of Port Orford and North Curry County. The Chamber has donated the typesetting and printing of the Bargain Holiday brochures, which are available at businesses all over town and the posters, which adorn participant windows.

Thanks to the generosity of the people in and around Port Orford all the turkeys for the needy families have been rounded up and are awaiting distribution in the Holiday boxes due to be distributed on December 20.

There are some items still missing that make the holiday meal complete like cranberry sauce or stuffing. But items are coming in as people add a few extra items to grocery carts and bring them to the "Good House" Wednesdays from 10-11:45 am or 1-3:45 pm.

Friends Ask for Support By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford and North Curry County Chamber of Commerce hosted Jerry Becker and Jim Rogers at their Monday, November 24 meeting at the Wheelhouse Restaurant. Becker and Rogers are board members of the Friends of Elk River. This group is working on getting national legislation passed which would make the 11,000-acre Copper Salmon area a Wilderness Area.

The meeting began with Rogers and Becker showing an 11-minute video the Friends of Elk River had made about the Copper Salmon area. The video began with the sound of marbled Murrelets and featured much footage of the North Fork of Elk River and interviews with local people and former county commissioner Lloyd Olds.

Jerry Becker said the Friends are asking the Chamber for a letter of endorsement

for the Copper Salmon Wilderness designation. He said the Friends had the endorsement for the wilderness designation from 30 area businesses. The Port Orford City Council, the Curry County Board of Commissioners, and the Port Orford Watershed Council have also endorsed the proposal.

Becker said that good quality clean water is needed coming out of the headwaters of the Elk River. He said the Elk River Fish Hatchery needs high quality water to function, adding that protecting the Copper Salmon Wilderness protects the hatchery. Becker said there were five species of fish coming up the Elk River including Coho and Chinook salmon, and steelhead, rainbow, and cutthroat trout. Becker estimated 15,000 salmon will return to the river this year and of that number 5,000 are needed for spawning leaving 10,000 for fishermen. He estimated that a sport fisherman can spend from \$600 to \$1,000 in the area on a three day fishing weekend.

Jim Rogers read several letters of support on behalf of the Copper Salmon Wilderness designation including one from former Oregon Governor John Kitzhaber and the American Fisheries Society. Rogers said that the only thing that would change in the Copper Salmon area if it was designated Wilderness was there would be three miles of logging roads decommissioned. These would become hiking trails.

The Friends of Elk River asked the Chamber for a letter stating the Chamber supports the proposed Copper Salmon Wilderness and that protecting the headwaters of the Wild and Scenic Elk River will help safeguard our world-class salmon runs and the economy of Curry County. The Chamber was asked to include in their letters to our two US Senators. governor and representative that the Chamber encourages they enact this legislation as soon as possible.

Chamber members have received a ballot in the mail this week and will vote on whether to write a letter of endorsement or not

Port Orford Ambulance News

Effective November 19, 2003, the Port Orford Community Ambulance, Inc. Board of Directors made a change in the wording on the "subscription" application. This will affect only new and renewal applicants. The wording states that upon receipt of payments from all insurance companies the subscriber will be responsible for 50% of any balance due. Under the old application if the insurance payments would total over 50% of Port Orford Community Ambulance, Inc.'s normal and customary fees for the services rendered the insurance payments would be accepted as satisfaction in full for all charges. Should the payments from all insurance companies combined be less than 50% of the normal charges, then the difference between the amount paid and 50% of the normal and customary charges would be considered payment in full. In other words, if you have excellent insurance you could wind up having to pay nothing for the service. This could happen when a subscriber was employed by a large company. The Board decided that it would only be fair to every subscriber if everyone's bill would be discounted by 50% after insurance payment and the balance to be paid by the subscriber.

If the subscriber patient has no medical insurance or insurance denies payment, the normal and customary charges will be discounted by 50%. All of the changes apply to 911 emergency services only. Courtesy transports will continue to be charged at the usual and customary rate without discount.

A new program has been installed on the office computer and you will be receiving notice of renewal approximately 40 days before your subscription is due. All subscriptions are due one year after application and payment.

The new Board of Directors are working very hard to make constructive changes in the working order of the Port Orford Community Ambulance, to try and insure that our community will always have ambulance service. They welcome any help that anyone of you can volunteer. Call the office at 332-0384 if you have any questions and there will also be a booth at the Community Bazaar where you can obtain a copy of the new application and ask questions of an EMT.

The festivities also include an open house nightly with cookies, hot cider, punch and coffee located in the decorated Garden House.



Coos Curry Electric has not yet hired a new accountant to take the place of Bob Ewalt who was fired in August 2002. When asked what the status was, at the 11-21 meeting, it was stated that an accountant would be hired sometime in the next 2 months. Then Director Grant Combs stated that Jim Arntz was presently overseeing someone on staff who was handling this work and that it was working so well that CCEC might just continue with that policy. There are several problems with that plan.

#1. The CEO is controlling the accounting procedures and assistant who is not certified in accounting procedures or the legal ramifications of CCEC's \$\$ numbers.

#2. As we have seen frequently throughout this past 2 years, Mr. Arntz is having difficulty completing his own work on time and has not provided the Board with requested information even with a month's leeway. Remember it took 22 months to complete the 2001 Audit and pay taxes. If Mr. Arntz doesn't have time to complete his own responsibilities in a timely manner, he certainly does not have time to adequately train and supervise an assistant.

#3 It is organizationally unsound to have one person control money documentation, borrowing, spending, and also be the CEO. The accountant should report to the Board and not be obligated to the General Manager.

The CCEC Board needs to set up a system of checks and balances all along the line.

to the turn of the century. The Hughes House was built by P.J. Lindberg for Patrick and Jane Hughes in 1898 at a cost of about \$3,800. The eleven room, 3,000 square foot home was framed by two by eight inch Port Orford cedar and is an outstanding example of Eastlake architecture. Standing on a terrace northeast of Cape Blanco, it is tucked comfortably against a rising hill on the south and protected from south-westerly winter storms. The sweeping view from the house is spectacular. The eye travels from the Pacific Ocean to the west, along the Sixes River, to the far-away hills of the coast range. One can imagine waking early and looking out over the green valley, dotted with cattle and sheep, as an indigo sky, blushing pink, silhouettes the dark-timbered hills.




