Governor Visits South Coast By Evan Kramer



Oregon governor Ted Kulongoski spent last Thursday in Curry County visiting the three cities and meeting with dozens of people. Kulongoski began his day

with meetings in Brookings with the newspaper and the city council and the port manager. He continued up the coast and met with a select group of students at Gold Beach High School who got to ask the governor questions. He also met with the newspaper in Gold Beach and ate lunch at the new Gold Beach Bookstore. Kulongoski's staff scheduled him for two meetings in Port Orford. One was at the Port of Port Orford. He arrived at about 2:30pm at the Port under rainy skies. He was accompanied by two members of his staff, one of his field representatives from Medford and two bodyguards. There was confusion about what kind of meetings Kulongoski was holding and who could attend. One thing they weren't, were town hall meetings where the citizens were invited in advance and all could attend and ask questions. The main purpose of the Port visit was to meet with the Port Manager Gary Anderson and some of the Port commissioners and hear about their issues.

Gary Anderson began by taking the governor on a limited tour of the Port, Anderson showing him the two hoist cranes, the fueling system, and the fish buyer's stations. Kulongoski's timing was good for activity as he got to see a boat unloading crab at one of the fish buying stations. Once everyone was all wet we proceeded back to the Port dock office where Kulongoski spoke with Gary Anderson, commissioners Ed Dowdy and myself, Curry County Commissioner Lucie La Bonte, a few members of the public who had found out about the meetings (they hadn't been publicized) and some press including the Port Orford News, and Coos Bay television station KCBY which had been formally notified in advance of the governor's visit. They were accorded a sound bite interview.

Governor Kulongoski talked about the need for an updated Port of Port Orford strategic plan and offered assistance from members of his staff once this is done. He emphasized the importance of having a vision of what you want to accomplish. He also spoke about tourism and the importance it plays in our coastal economy. Kulongoski said Oregon has been almost last among states in tourism promotion funding but would soon be in the middle range. The Oregon legislature passed a bill last year that authorized a

one-cent bed tax on motels and RV parks. This money is dedicated to tourism promotion.

Kulongoski left the Port around 3:15pm and was driven to Port Orford City hall. He met with Mayor Gary Doran and councilor Emily Francona and Carl Eskelson, Lucie La Bonte, Curry County Emergency Services Coordinator Mike Murphy, and a few citizens and discussed Garrison Lake issues. From Port Orford the governor was driven to the North Bend Airport for the short flight home to Salem.

Garrison Lake Update

Garrison Lake was breached on Saturday, March 13. Dave Bassett, the man who provided part of the engineering for the lake breaching, got the permit from the state to open it, and paid the contractor for the work has written an update on the situation as of March 22. He says Garrison Lake has reached equilibrium where output matches input. The level is still high though at 17.3 feet. Bassett says the outlet channel integrity is "okay" but has been affected by some wave action. Bassett describes his ideas for the future in dropping the lake level. "The next step for successful maintenance is to lease or rent a small floating sand dredge to drop

March Port Meeting By Jane Cramer

Commissioners Gifford Barnes, Dave Knapp, Evan Kramer and George Welch, as well as Port Manager Gary Anderson were present at the February 17 regular meeting of the Port Commission. Commissioner Ed Dowdy was absent.

The first item of New Business was a review of the Port insurance policy. Harry Abel of Abel Insurance gave an overview of current coverage and noted areas he felt might need changing. The commissioners then went over the coverage item by item and made adjustments in coverage, up in some cases and down in others. They then discussed areas not currently covered and decided which ones should now be covered. Although the process was time consuming, the resulting schedule of coverage and deductibles will be better suited to the Port's needs.

Other New Business was handled quickly as the commissioners reviewed and approved changes to the Employee Handbook regarding holiday pay, discussed appointment of Budget Committee members and the completion of the 2000-2001 audit

After some discussion about the Port's grant application for an ice machine and the application by Oregon Bait Company to erect a new building to house their ice machine, the commissioners approved the building and instructed Anderson to continue to pursue the ice machine grant for the Port.

Under Old Business, Anderson reported that a net amount of \$4,080 was realized by the Port at the Surplus Sale on February 28. Commissioners discussed bids on some treated poles and decided not to sell at the bid prices.

Anderson also reported on his application for a grant to Planning and Marketing. This grant would cover updating the Port Strategic Plan with emphasis on marketing and would include a land survey, which is needed before development of assets can begin.

After a review of the Manager's Report, which covered Coast Guard construction of a permanent light for the jetty, this year's record crab season, and other Port activities, the Commissioners went into Executive Session on Pending Litigation.

Coos Curry Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of Coos-Curry Electric Cooperative has been scheduled for 10:00am on Friday, March 26 at the Cooperative's Brookings District office. This meeting takes place the same day as the Cooperative's Home Show in Brookings at the Kalmiopsis Elementary School.



Dredging Funding Sought By Evan Kramer

Curry County Commissioner Lucie La Bonte returned from a trip to Washington D.C on March 7. She went to Washington with Port of Brookings executive director Russ Crabtree, Port of Umpqua Manager Penny Ryerson, and Depoe Bay City Councilor Jack Brown. They were in the nation's capital for one week.

This group went to Washington D.C. to lobby for reallocating funding for shallow draft ports that had been cut from the Army Corp of Engineer's budget in the Bush budget proposal for fiscal year 2004-05. They also met with the National Harbor's Association, which is a collation of small shallow draft ports, harbors and boat users.

The group met with Oregon Senators Ron Wyden and Gordon Smith and their staffs, Representatives Peter DeFazio and Darlene Hooley and their staffs, Barry Holliday with the Army Corps of Engineers, Jim Rausch with the Dredging Contractors of America, Chris Alosp with the USDA Rural Development Administration and others.

La Bonte said, "As a county commissioner I was able to give the perspective of coastal counties and the effects of curtailing dredging on local economies. It shows those we are having discussions with that this is a county priority, not just a management issue." La Bonte emphasized "each port in Curry County is part of a bigger system. Shutting down these ports would be like shutting down our waterways along the coast, our commercial fishing industry or food supply, commerce traffic, our recreational fishing which is a key component of our tourist economy." She said this would have a major impact on the Curry County economy.

La Bonte said Oregon's congressional delegation is very committed to the dredging issue and that it is a top priority. The congress people were made more aware of the economic importance of our coastal ports. There was concerned expressed about sending dredging funds overseas while letting the local port infrastructure deteriorate. La Bonte did not have a list of which foreign countries are receiving dredging funds but is working on getting that information.

Related to dredging is a press release issued by Peter DeFazio on March 23. DeFazio and Representative Rahm Emanuel of Illinois have announced their intentions to offer the "American Parity Amendment" to the \$87 billion Iraq War Supplemental Appropriations bill. This amendment adds \$20.3 billion for improvements in health care, education and infrastructure in America, to match the \$20.3 billion included in the supplemental to rebuild Iraq. DeFazio's statement includes the following remark related to the south coast ports. "The Port of Umm Oasr (in Iraq) will receive \$45 million for further upgrades, even though we've already dumped over \$50 million into it. However, President Bush can't find the \$8 million needed to dredge struggling ports in southern Oregon."

There are currently 100 cosponsors of the American Parity Act, HR 1738, the companion stand-alone legislation which was introduced by DeFazio and Emanuel.

Running For Office

Dr. Charles Hochberg announced his candidacy for Oregon State Legislature at a conference with Governor Ted Kulongoski on Thursday, March 18. Hochberg is running unopposed in the Democratic Party primary.

In announcing his candidacy Dr. Hochberg stated, "As a citizen I feel it is my obligation to step out from my daily life and enter the political arena. It is vitally important to restore integrity to Oregon's legislature – to make the legislature work to solve Oregon's funding crisis."

"I also feel very strongly as I discussed with Governor Kulongoski, that we need to restore and expand Oregon's Health Plan and I intend to put my experience to work to rebuild Oregon's unique health delivery system. We were the nation's leader in health care, but we are no longer."

Hochberg added, "During my campaign I will meet and talk with citizens throughout the district searching out their ideas and concerns. The people of the South Coast and the Coquille Valley and upper Umpqua need to be represented in Salem by a legislator that shares their problems. As Governor Kulongoski has stated, "the solutions have to come from people in this campaign" and it is my intention to spend the next several months listening to and having a dialogue with the voters of my district."



The Oregon Coast Highway (U.S. Highway 101) is closed at Bullards Bridge (MP 259), located two miles north of Bandon. Traffic is being detoured to Oregon Highways 42 and 42S. Motorists are advised to expect minor delays. The closure is due to a commercial truck hitting the vertical girders and crossmembers of the bridge on March 22. ODOT bridge inspectors surveyed the damage and decided to close the bridge for public safety.



federal statutory law. However, the amendment may prohibit city employees from cooperating with federal agencies charged with the enforcement of federal law such as the USA Patriot Act. The amendment to the Port Orford Municipal Code reaffirms citizens' rights as guaranteed by the Bill of Rights of the United States Constitution, the Oregon State Constitution and certain Oregon state statutes. It prohibits City employees from violating citizens rights and provides that the City shall expend no funds or resources for activities to be performed by City employees which violate citizen's rights. The amendment mandates the City Administrator to regularly advise the City Council and the public and any attempts by federal agencies to require the city to violate any citizens' rights. It further requires that the City provide a legal defense to any emplye who is criminally charged based upon his or her actions in compliance with the amendment and provides for a fine not to exceed \$50 based upon a violation of the amendment.

the weir effect [on the] bottom of the channel with the first 100 feet of the lake. By doing so we can bolster the berm with sand and drop the lake by six-inch increments to get to the proper level of 14'7". State Parks will have to authorize use of the small dredge operation for channel maintenance. Bassett plans on being in Port Orford March 27-30 and wants to do this work and in addition readying 50 sand bags to use to stop the channel if a breach occurs during the high tides on April 7 and 8.

State Parks has put up a trail closed sign on the trail leading from Agate Beach State Park to the beach. This is because of the outlet stream. However, Parks says you can use the trial to the beach at your own risk (not much of a risk at this time.) You'll have to walk across a narrow stream, which is only a few inches deep. People with strollers for their children may find it difficult. It's okay to go out to the beach. There are plenty of agates out there and it's your front yard.
