Now that gasoline prices are up nearly 25 cents from two months ago and with regular gas clocking in at \$1.999 a gallon all the better reason for staying in town this weekend. There's plenty in store to entertain both young and old.

The North Curry Families and Children's Center ArtWorks group is presenting three performances of the play "Class Action" this weekend at the historic Savoy Theater. Sixteen teenagers are involved in this production and have been working for long hours preparing this contemporary play, written by Brad Slight, about life in high school. The three performances are scheduled for Friday April 16 at 5:00pm, Saturday April 17 and Sunday April 18 at 2:00pm.

This play will help you remember the characters you were so well acquainted with during the period of time we attended high school in different parts of the country. One of the characters in the play describes high school as a place "that is supposed to celebrate learning and education but what it really celebrates is

popularity and social groups." The ensemble cast of high school and middle school students shows us characters learning about life, love and growing up. We've all been there (or are there) and remember what's it's like. The cast of players from high school and middle school includes Adelinne Maddi, Ava Moses, Cynthia McGowan, Cynthia Wyatt, Kristy Watson, Meara Fleming, Melissa Jones, Natalie Manning, Nichelle Veien, Phillip Maddi, Travis Fraser and Signe Tronson.

The play presents a collage of high school experiences presented in 22 scenes each with different characters. The play is one hour and fifteen minutes long and the actors have spent the past 5-6 weeks four days per week rehearsing their parts. The first two performances will be held on Thursday at 10:30am and 1:00pm and the invited guests for these shows are the middle school students and the high school students.

The NCFCC ArtWorks program works to provide artistic opportunities for the younger people in our community "to share their work and vision with the community through theater and the visual and sound arts. NCFCC director Tere Tronson directs Class Action with help from a crew, which includes Alyssa Rush,

Margret McGowan, Brianna Converse and Ruby Fanning.


Class Action tickets will be available at the box office fifteen minutes prior to the start of the play. Adults are admitted in for \$5 and those people 18 years of age and younger pay \$2. The money raised from this production of Class Action will be used in further theater programs.

The Savoy will also run its regular show-times of a current film. This week's movie is **Starsky and Hutch** starring Ben Stiller as Starsky and Owen Wilson as Hutch. The movie has been a big hit with audiences across the country and has overcome the jinx that often hits movies made using television shows as their basis. The movie also stars Snoop Dogg as Huggy Bear and Vince Vaughn as Reese Feldman. The new and improved Starsky and Hutch are back in action in their red and white Ford Torino chasing criminals, of whom there is never a short supply.

So now we've seen a play, and a movie based on a remake of a popular 1970's television show so what next. Now it's time to put on our dancing shoes and get down to the Port Orford Community Building on Saturday night for A Celebration of Freedom Dance and Concert.

Roy has been playing with the Bobby Lindstrom band for a couple of years. He says "Bobby's music reflects his personality: imaginative, creative and social. He knows how to grab an audience."

Mammography Patients

In celebration of Mother's Day next month, the Bree's Foundation will give away a free gift certificate to any woman who gets a mammogram in May from The Brookings Clinic or Curry General Hospital, announced Ginny Hochberg, chief executive officer for the Curry Health District.

Mammogram patients will be offered the opportunity to draw a coupon valued from \$3 to \$10. The coupons can be used to purchase upscale recycled women's clothing and accessories in the soon-to-open Bree's shop in the Brookings-Harbor area, Pedoz Martin explained.

Martin is the executive director of the Bree's Breast Cancer Foundation. The foundation raises funds for breast health education, early detection screening and support services through its upscale resale women's retail stores in Bandon, Coquille and North Bend. Its first Curry County store is scheduled to open near the fountain in the Brookings-Harbor Shopping Center, just west of Highway 101, hopefully next month, Martin said.

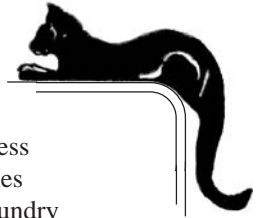

Those needing appointments can phone (541) 247-3117; or toll-free, 1-800-445-8085, ext. 117.

The American Cancer Society recommends annual mammograms after 40; clinical breast exams every three years for women 20 to 39, and annually starting at 40; and a thorough, monthly breast self-exam beginning at age 20.

Women at increased risk – those with a personal or family history of breast cancer – should talk with their doctor about the screening plan that is right for them.

Excluding skin cancer, breast cancer is the most common cancer in women. Advances in early detection and treatment, however, are allowing more women to conquer the disease. Death rates from breast cancer declined significantly from 1992 to 1998, with the largest decrease in young women.

'Muscle Busters' Hike

"We will need to spot a few vehicles at the mouth of the Illinois and then drive up to the trailhead," Schroeder says. At the end of the hike, drivers will need to be taken back to the trailhead on Wildhorse to get vehicles left there.

Port Orford resident Dave Bassett was back in town on Saturday morning at the Garrison Lake outlet in his efforts to keep it running and reduce the lake level to a manageable 14.7 feet. Bassett once again hired Joe Marsh to bring in his cat and excavator and dredge more sand out of the outlet channel.

Bassett had been to Salem on Friday of last week attending a meeting with Oregon State Parks director Michael Carrier and Steve Newcomb, engineer with EGR and Associates, and Dr. Vicki McConnell, the state geologist.

Bassett has been issued an extension to his permit to open the lake. Work began at 8:00am and was done by 12:30pm. State Park Cape Blanco Unit manager Frank Eckley was on hand to keep an eye on things.

Bassett said he was impressed with Carrier's willingness to work with him and interest in solving this ongoing problem.

Bassett has spoken about two of his goals in lowering the lake. One is to get Twelfth Street at the boat ramp open again so

motorists can use it and also to lower it enough so the City can finally open Arizona Street to one-way traffic between Geer Circle and Madrona Street.

Bassett will appear at the Port Orford City Council meeting on Monday, April 19 and speak to them about his latest proposal, which is using the city's dredging equipment for this project. The dredging equipment is normally used for dredging the North Fork Hubbard Creek reservoir. This would be a good meeting to attend if you're interested in the city and private citizens resolving the long lasting saga of Garrison Lake levels – too high or too low only the fish know.

To be eligible for a free screening, women must fit federal guidelines set by the Breast and Cervical Cancer Program, says Dave Manzella, health educator with the Curry County Public Health Department.

Patients should be between 50 and 64, and hold no insurance with either private insurers or the Oregon Health Plan.

Additionally, their family income should not exceed 250 percent of the federal poverty guidelines. For a family of one, monthly income should fall under \$1,871. The monthly income for two must be under \$2,525; the monthly income for three must be under \$3,179.

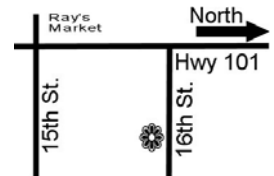
