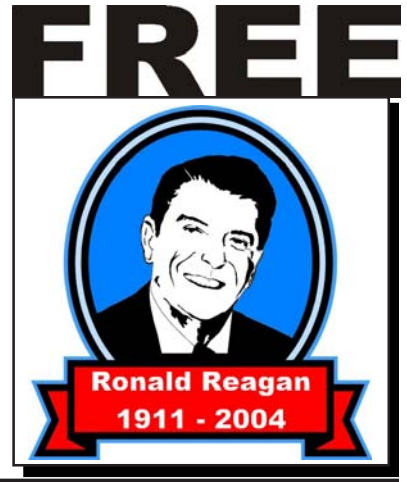

Most of the Jubilee events take place the weekend of Saturday and Sunday, July 3 and 4. The previous weekend, June 26 and 27 the Jubilee kicks off with a co-ed slow-pitch softball tournament at Buffington Park. For more information call Kathy at 332-2245.

On Friday July 2 you can enjoy a kick-off dance at the Beachcombers Cove. Darrell Newell of Hillsboro will be calling and Dave and Barbara Cooper of Prineville will handle the cueing. There is no charge to spectators. Take my advice if you haven't been out to freshly painted 50 year old country dance hall and seen eight or nine squares doing their square dancing thing you owe it to yourself to come on out. The group is always looking for more dancers and regularly gives lessons.

DeFazio Dredging Response

The following letter was written to Port manager Gary Anderson by US Representative Peter DeFazio in response to Port's letter requesting help with in dredging funds for the Port of Port Orford.

Dear Mr. Anderson:

Thank you for your message in support of federal funding to dredge Oregon's shallow draft channels and harbors. I appreciate hearing from you and regret the delay in my response.

We are in complete agreement that shallow draft channels are fundamental to the economic viability of the Oregon Coast. Without regular removal of sand and silt, the entrances to these river channels swiftly deteriorate and become dangerous, even impassable, to navigation. Impassable channels leave coastal communities without the commercial shipping, fishing, recreational boating and

even Coast Guard operations that their economic livelihoods depend upon.

Despite the great needs and demonstrated benefits to the economy from dredging shallow draft channels, once again the President's proposed Fiscal Year (FY) 2005 U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Civil Works budget did not include any funding for maintenance dredging at the Port of Siuslaw, the Port of Umpqua, the Port of Bandon, the Port of Port Orford, the Port of Gold Beach, or the Port of Brookings Harbor. As a result, I have requested that the Appropriations Subcommittee on Energy and Water include funding that meets the needs of all six of these Oregon ports in the FY 2005 Energy and Water Appropriations Act.

I have been a vocal opponent of the President's budget for the Corps in the past and will continue to work with my colleagues in Congress to restore the agency's funding for dredging. The main-


tenance of these channels is critical to the economy of the South Coast, and I am deeply concerned that, if implemented, these cuts will have an extremely negative impact on the entire region. These channels are heavily used by recreational boaters and commercial fisherman, which are extremely important sources of jobs and revenue on the South Coast.

Over the past sixteen years, I have consistently and successfully resisted efforts to eliminate or reduce funding for dredging of Oregon's ports. You can be sure I will continue to work with other Members of Congress to ensure the federal government maintains its longstanding commitment and restores funding for the dredging of shallow draft channels and harbors across our nation.

National Day of Mourning

President George W. Bush has declared Friday, June 11, as a National Day of Mourning in honor of President Ronald Reagan who died on Saturday, June 5. Federal offices including the postal service will be closed on Friday as well as the stock markets.

President Reagan's body will lie in state at the Capitol Rotunda from Wednesday through Friday with viewing open to the public. There will be a state funeral service conducted for President Reagan on Friday at the Washington National Cathedral in Washington D.C. at 11:30am eastern time. This will be the first state funeral for an American President since Lyndon Johnson's funeral in January 1973. Later that day the late President's body will be flown back to the Simi Valley where he will be buried that evening in a hillside plot adjacent to the Ronald Reagan Presidential Library.

President Bush ordered the American flag to be flown at half-mast for the 30 days mourning period.

Ronald Reagan served as President from January 1981 to January 1989 and was

the first President since Dwight David Eisenhower to serve two consecutive terms. Before he became President Reagan worked as a radio sportscaster, a movie actor appearing in dozens of films, President of the Screen Actor's Guild, television host and spokesman for General Electric and in November 1966 was elected Governor of California where he served two terms. He challenged President Gerald Ford for the Republican nomination for president at that party's political convention in 1976. He fell short of taking the nomination away from Ford. Reagan served in the United States Army Signal Corps during World War II and was stationed in Culver City, California at the Hal Roach Studios making war-training films.

President Reagan was seriously injured by an assassin's bullet only 70 days into his first term and survived. The attempted assassination by John Hinkley Jr. took place outside the Washington Hilton Hotel and three other men were shot and injured in the attack. Reagan broke the 20-year jinx that had followed American presidents since 1840 and continued through 1860, 1880, 1900, 1920, 1940, and 1960. Every president elected in

those years had either been assassinated or died in office. Later on that year in his first year in office Reagan fired 11,000 striking Air Traffic controllers. He is given credit for the dismantling of the Iron Curtain and the fall of the Soviet Union; events which occurred after Reagan left office during the presidency of the first President Bush.

Ronald Reagan was American's Fortieth President and there is already talk about placing his likeness on either the dime or the ten or twenty dollar bill. Ronald Reagan was a conservative icon who eclipsed all others and will be hard to replace.

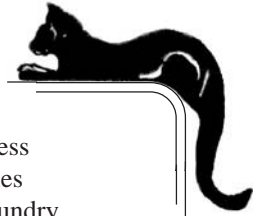

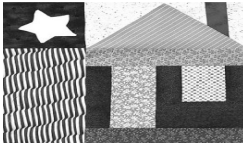

Letter to the Editor,

I was really pleased at the turn out at the Rural Conservation and Developments Wind Energy Fair. Our staff Amy Wilsson did a great job of recruiting speakers from around the region.

I did want to clarify that as a County Commissioner I will be involved in making decisions if any such technology moves forward through our land use process. In that role I am bound by law not to have contact with anyone regarding specific information that could influence my decision-making ability. That was why we tried to stay broad in nature regarding the information. The last speaker, Ann Vileisis began speaking about local bird populations, which I thought may be too specific. By law, we are supposed to announce that we are leaving and depart so as not to be influenced in our decision. I did check with Judge McArthur who was there and who is familiar with that law. He agreed. My apologies if anyone did not understand my announcement and leaving but I am bound by law. I look forward to hearing what all sides have to say including Ann if this issue does come forward.
