News Before it Happens

We received an e-mail from the city recorder on Friday of last week notifying us of a city council special election set for Wednesday, January 12, 7:00pm. The recorder will swear in newly elected Mayor Jim Auborn and then Auborn will swear in newly elected city councilors Milton Finch and Steve Abbott. Next item on the agenda is the mayor appointing, with council approval, a replacement for his seat on the council. Auborn's council term has two more years on it. Mayor Auborn has said he will select outgoing councilor Jim Campbell to fill the two-year vacancy. Three people submitted letters of interest in the position. A committee had formed to support Jim Campbell for the soon-tobe-vacated council seat and last week they turned in 203 signatures of people both in the city and outside the city who wanted to see Jim Campbell be named to the council seat. This influenced our new mayor, so as of Wednesday night the council will consist of Mayor Auborn and councilors Steve Abbott. Ed Beck. Jim Campbell, Carl Eskelson, Milton Finch, and Jerry Steinhorst. Auborn will assign the six councilmen to various liaison positions including city parks, Port of Port Orford, streets, Chamber of


The City of Port Orford is enjoying the glow of getting the sewer outfall up and running after nearly seven years but the other half of the problem has yet to be solved. When the wastewater effluence leach

field was destroyed during the winter storms of 1997-98 the Garrison Lake outlet creek, weir, foredunes, and parts of the aftdunes were also destroyed. Seven years later the City, County, State, Native American tribes, and other government entities have formed a Garrison Lake Restoration Committee and are working towards a December 2005 goal of coming up with a solution to better controlling the lake levels. Frank Eckley, Oregon State Parks Cape Blanco unit manager, said the committee is looking at the feasibility of running a culvert through the park to ease the lake levels but was quick to add that there are many hurdles to jump including the permitting process.

I took a drive down to the "Twelfth Street boat launch" (as it is officially known) on Tuesday morning to check on the Garrison Lake level. The city has put in a "measuring stick" at the fishing dock that goes up to 17 feet. On Tuesday morning the lake level measured 16' 8" and rising. Frank Eckley said on Monday of this week that Garrison Lake will be breached on Thursday of this week. Late last year they hired local contractor Joe Marsh to open a longer and improved lake outlet channel but winter storms have sanded that channel in. Eckley said Marsh would clean out the outlet channel on Thursday. He expects, because of the higher lake level, that the channel will get a better "head" on it and scour it out and keep running.

Twelfth Street at the boat launch has been barricaded by the City of Port Orford public works crew due to high water. This means to get to the boat launch you'll need to drive down Agate Beach Road and turn right at Twelfth Street. As part of the sewer outfall project Twelfth Street between the boat launch and Agate Beach Road has been paved with asphalt. State Parks has had some of the dead Port Orford Cedars taken down in the State Park lands that adjoin Twelfth Street. Eckley said the part of Twelfth Street (the dip) that is under water is under the jurisdiction of the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife. They will look into solving the flooding problem.

Letter to the Editor.

Little wonder that CCEC is paying off most of its obligations. How could it be otherwise since they have burdened Coos-Curry Electric's (CCEC) ratepayers with the highest standby meter fee in Oregon's history ever levied against a co-op of which there are 19 in Oregon.

Our base rate of \$33.00 is double the amount when averaged out amongst the Oregon co-ops. It can be compared to a regressive tax. No other co-op has had a meter rate that astronomical.

CCEC bailed themselves out of debt, a debt that was self-inflicted and as such no fault of the co-op members. Yet in the penalty phase where restitution for poor management was the cause, the CCEC ratepayers were made to pay the bill.

Now that they have picked our pocket and at a time of the year when our use of electricity is out of necessity dramatically increased, they announce the fact that their 2005 budget, which spurted to \$26,580,083, a 12% rise from 2004, is in splendid shape. So much so that the possibility exists that they are debating whether to return some of the Capital credits to membership.

A co-op is a non-profit organization. As such all profits must be returned to the membership in the form of reduced rates. The standby rate of \$33.00 is excessive, working a hardship on co-op members. That figure should be pared back and brought into closer configuration with the 18 other Oregon co-ops.

If CCEC responded by bringing the base rate down that would be an indication of their willingness to ameliorate the plight of many co-op ratepayers who are in dire straits.

Do people who are having difficult times have to prostrate themselves for charity to pay their bills. A co-op is so situated

that the ratepayer is its primary focus insofar as doing everything in their power to keep the cost to them at an affordable rate.

Here in Port Orford it is said there is a 25% poverty rate. These people must be reckoned with. The \$33.00 base rate is devastating their budget.

Show a little compassion CCEC instead of a calendar give your members a rate break. Now that your creditors have been satisfied its time to rescind the \$19.00 increase in the base rate. Fourteen dollars or thereabouts is the going rate in most co-ops.

Since the co-op is a membership organization both member owners and management would like a compatible relationship. We've seen it in the past and with each other's cooperation can recapture it for the future.

ATVs On Agate Beach

Tim Wood, Director of the Oregon Parks and Recreation Dept. wrote this letter to Port Orford resident Edwin Liszka.

Thank you for taking time to write about your concerns regarding the prohibition of ATVs on Agate Beach.

As you correctly stated, that portion of the Oregon Shore State Recreations Area from Cape Blanco to Port Orford Heads is presently open only to street-legal, licensed motor vehicles. It was so designated when the 1967 Beach Bill was enacted.


The Beach Bill placed Oregon's beaches into one of three categories so far as motor vehicle use on them is concerned: beaches that are open to street-legal, licensed motor vehicles; beaches that are closed to all motor vehicles; and two beaches, contiguous to US Forest Service off-highway riding areas, that are open to both street-legal and OHV or ATV use: Horsfall Beach, north of Coos Bay and Sand Lake, near Tillamook.

Unfortunately, enforcement of the streetlegal rule on Oregon's beaches has been minimal in the past, leading to some uncertainty on the part of ATV enthusiasts. Oregon Parks and Recreation Dept.
