Coos-Curry Board Meeting By Evan Kramer



The Coos-Curry Electric Coop Board held their regular monthly meeting on Friday, February 18, at 9:00am, at the Coop's headquarters.

The board recognized the members present and then voted to approve the consent calendar, which included the minutes of the previous meetings and list of new members.

Next on the agenda were the monthly financial reports. General Manager Werner Buehler said they were thinner than in the past because of a short month. Buehler said the Coop was currently working with their new auditors Moss-Adams.

Chief Financial Officer Doyle Eden said the new automated payroll system was working well. He discussed outsourcing of the safety training and that they had hired a new insurance and safety analyst out of Spokane, Washington. Eden said the Coop would get consistent high quality safety training and that they had advertised locally but couldn't find a local person to fill the position.

Eden said the Coop received the SHARPS award from OSHA, which reviews the Coop's safety procedures and issued the award. This indicates a superior safety position.

Eden then gave the financial report. There were 16,600 accounts billed in January for a total of \$2,571,374. The Coop collected \$2,306,066 from 14,476 checks. 1,669 final notices were mailed for not paying. The Coop paid out \$2,322,418.76 in accounts payable with 245 checks. Eden said the power bill was the major part of the accounts payable. He said the gross payroll was \$350,000.

Eden said the Coop had ordered new fax machines and a computer accessory called air cards which will enable an employee to access the Internet wherever they are working as long as they are in cell phone range. The air card is plugged in back of the computer and as Eden said, "makes us global." He said the Coop was barcoding its inventory and that bar codes would be put on all equipment.

The Coop web site is up and running and the address is www.cooscurryelectric.com.

Eden discussed the condition of the headquarters' building. He said it was 20 years old and that the heating and cooling system needed to be fixed. The cool-

ing system as it currently exists is opening windows. The Coop is getting bids on replacing the roof and talking about making changes to the sunroom.

Werner Buehler discussed the power supply report. He said the water inflow on the Columbia River was 80% of normal and that market prices were high. He said the hydro system is burning its fuel (water) now. He described the amount of water flowing through the Columbia River this year as a big unknown.

Board chairman Terry Hanscam discussed what he called the "summer spill" on the Columbia River for salmon. He said it could double electric rates. He said there was also discussion about limiting barge traffic east of the John Day River, which would cause havoc with grain farmers. He said the summer spill for salmon cost ratepayers \$75,000,000 last year and that the total spent on salmon recovery in the Columbia River system was \$6.5 billion so far.

The board discussed the annual meeting timeline. The sixty-seventh annual meeting will be held on Saturday, June 18, at Pacific High School in Port Orford. The nominating committees will meet by May 6 and the ballots will go out to the members by May 31. There are three members

on each nomination committee. Board members recommended dropping the number of board members from nine to five by 2008. The board approved the members voting on a change to the Articles of Association, which would change the number of board members and zones from nine to five. Zones 1 and 2 would be in Brookings with zones 7,8 and 9 shrunk down to one zone. Gold Beach would be one zone and there would be one in Port Orford and one in Coquille-Myrtle Point. A motion to present a by-law change to the members to vote on regarding this issue was passed by the board. This issue was worked on and recommended by the citizen advisory committee. We were told at the January board meeting that the board costs the Coop \$230,000 a year. They are paid for the meetings they attend, travel expenses for meetings and full medical benefits.

Chairman Hanscam was asked if the basic rate (\$33.00 for residential users) would go down now that the Coop's financial position is getting better. He said no and that the market rate for residential users would be \$37.50.

The board discussed the six employees who were furloughed last year. They have not been replaced. Four new positions have been created since then and people from out of the area filled all four positions. The furloughed employees were given a chance of applying for the new positions.

The consulting firm hired to do the safety training will be paid \$26,000 a year. The Coop hired a company in Minnesota to get set up to handle the Coops emergency phone calls and then pays a yearly service fee to handle them. The charge for setting up the service was \$20,000. A request was made to General Manager Buehler to see the statistics on how the board saved money (\$60,000) by out-

sourcing their mailings to Sterling Bank in Portland. Buehler questioned whether the board wanted to spend the time on the issue but board members Dave Itzen and Jean Shank said they were interested in seeing those figures. A meeting will be set up with Doyle Eden to see how the Coop saved so much money by outsourcing and it will then be reported back to the owner-members in this paper.

Next month's board meeting will be held in Brookings on March 25 in conjunction with the Coos Curry Electric 2005 Home Show which is held on March 25 and 26.

Thanks to a group of interested community members, Blanco School in Langlois has had the benefit of a wonderful new program this school year: Start Making a Reader Today (SMART). This innovative, award-winning program can be found across the state, including right here in our own area in Bandon and Brookings.

SMART is targeted at kindergarten through third grade children. Teachers participating in the SMART program select several students from their classes who may be at risk for low literacy. Fifteen Blanco students are being given the opportunity to read with community volunteers twice a week to help build necessary reading skills that will prove crucial later in life. In order to encourage continued reading, students also select a book every month to add to their own personal libraries.

The caring, inspired volunteers who read with the children and coordinate the program provide a safe, nurturing environment that ensures that students learn at their own pace. Thanks to the safe and self-paced nature of SMART, students make significant progress with their reading that has positive consequences later in their academic lives, a point supported by a study by the Eugene Research Institute. Our own teachers can already attest to the great improvement experienced by students in the SMART program.

Of course, a program like this has two crucial needs: money and caring volunteers. If the SMART program interests any of you, we would greatly appreciate if you would be willing to support the program financially or with your time. 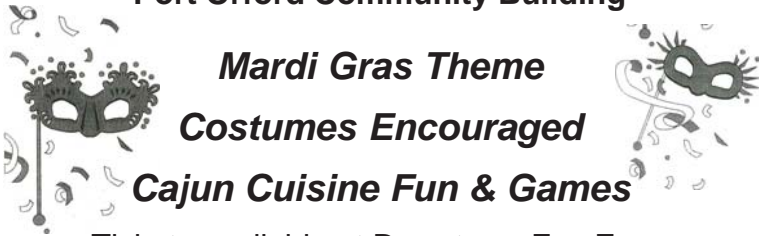

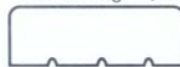
