Council Chooses Creighton By Evan Kramer



The Port Orford City Council met in special session on Monday evening at 5:00pm and chose Mark Creighton as the new police chief.

The council began their meetings with an exec-

utive session under Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 190.660(2)(a) employment, to discuss the two police chief search panel's (one civilian and one law enforcement) conclusions and how the council wanted to proceed on selection of a new police chief. They returned to special session after this discussion.

Councilor Steve Abbott made a motion to offer the police chief job to Mark Creighton for a six month probationary period. Before he starts work Creighton will have to pass physical and psychological tests and a background investigation. Councilors Steve Abbott, Ed Beck, Jim Campbell, Carl Eskelson, Milton Finch, and Jerry Steinhorst voted yes on the motion and it passed unanimously.

City Administrator Ken Knight told the council they would now need to change the personnel policies since they just violated them. Council Campbell said the council would work on that at the next council meeting. Mayor Jim Auborn said there would be an evaluation of Creighton at the end of the six-month period.

Councilor Finch made a motion to direct the city administrator to supervise the police chief until the city council takes other actions. The city administrator will be the day-to-day supervisor of the police chief and will negotiate with him the salary for the position. The motion carried 6-0 and the meeting came to an end.

Interim police chief George Simon will continue working until Creighton passes his tests.

Mark Creighton has over 22 years experience in the law enforcement field. Most of that was served with the Curry County Sheriff's Department where he worked as a road deputy and detective for over 15 years. Creighton began his law enforcement career in September 1978 with the Rogue River Police Department and also worked with the Reedsport Police Department, the Toledo Police Department and the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department For the past two years he has been in business in Port Orford running a plant nursery and supplies with his wife Gerri.


The City has been without a permanent police chief since former Chief Bill Rush resigned or, more correctly, was eased out of the job at the beginning of October last year. Rush and the city worked out a separation agreement that cost the city \$19,285.

Special District Elections

The filing deadline for the May 17 Special District Election is on Thursday, March 17, 5:00pm. As of Monday, March 7 there were many positions open with no candidates running in them. The special districts range from the Port Orford-Langlois 2 CJ School District with four openings to the Port of Port Orford with three openings. So far only Rosario Williams has filed to run in position #1 for the school district. No one has yet filed for the three Port positions.

The Curry Health District with three positions up for election this year with two of the three incumbents having filed to run.

Candidates who want to file for any of the special district positions must file the appropriate form with the Curry County Clerk/Elections department by 5:00pm on March 17. Most candidates go to Gold Beach, fill out the form and pay a

\$10 filing fee. For those more energetic people you can get a different form and collect signatures to place your name on the ballot.

Other districts with openings are the Sixes Rural Fire Protection District (3 positions); Langlois Water District (4 positions), Langlois Rural Fire Protection District (2 positions), Port Orford Rural Fire Protection District (four positions), Port Orford Library District (3 positions), Langlois Cemetery District (2 positions), Port Orford Cemetery District (2 positions), Langlois Library District (3 positions).

Most of the boards of the special districts meet once a month in public session. They also have extra meetings this time of year to review and pass their 2005-06 budgets.

Local Highway Projects Funded

Representative Peter DeFazio announced on March 2 that he has secured \$90 million in funding for highway and transit projects in southwest Oregon under legislation titled, the Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (TEALU), HR 3. The six-year \$284 billion federal highway and transit funding bill was approved on March 2 by the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee. Oregon stands to benefit from DeFazio's new position as Ranking Member on the Highways, Transit and Pipelines Subcommittee. From the post DeFazio helped craft the legislation and will play a leading role in its passage in Congress.

The funding for TEA LU is fully paid for through the Federal Highway Trust Fund, which is sustained with gas tax receipts. It does not add to the federal deficit. The bill is not yet in its final form. It must be debated and may possibly be amended next week on the House floor. When the Senate approves the companion bill, both bodies will meet in a conference committee to resolve the differences between the House and Senate passed legislation before the President can sign it into law.

The projects in Coos and Curry counties for which DeFazio secured funding include \$3,3000,000 for US Highway 101 improvements in Bandon; \$600,000 for the Rogue River bikeway and pedestrian path; \$992,000 for the North Bend Waterfront Boardwalk construction; and \$200,000 to upgrade Highway 101 and utility relocation in Gold Beach.

The Bandon Highway 101 proposed project will widen the highway south of Bandon to provide a center turn lane, as well as bicycle lanes and sidewalks.

Parks Commission News

The Port Orford Parks Commission met for their regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, March 1 at City Hall and worked their way through a full slate of items. Here are the highlights of that meeting.

- Discussed the Horse Arena in Buffington Park and the need for a group or association to 'adopt' the arena and manage it. Citizen Beth Welch stepped forward and agreed to try and help form a group. She will contact a list of other potential association members and report back to the panel.
- Discussed the ramifications of caring for memorial trees that are donated to the city and how creating a policy might help in the maintenance.
- Discussed City right-of-ways. Joanne Ruhof asked that those matters be brought before both the Parks and Planning Commissions.
- Discussed the rewards currently being offered for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the culprits who axed a half-dozen trees in Buffington Park. Millie North displayed a layout of

a reward poster that will be placed in about 20 locations.

- Discussed the possibilities of having an 'Art Fest' or outdoor type weekend marketplace in Battle Rock Park and/or other area of town. Joanne Ruhof said this had been discussed before and the strong winds from the ocean make an outdoor market, especially one selling high-priced art, almost prohibitive because of potential wind damage to the goods. City Administrator Ken Knight asked if perhaps the grassy bank on the side of the parking area could be utilized, using the bank as a sort of 'back wall.' It was suggested that the Chamber of Commerce and the Arts Council look into the possibility.
- Discussed the possibilities of moving or preserving the old Port Orford 'Jailhouse' sitting on some property right behind the Sixes River Land Company office. It was mentioned that there had always been a lot of talk about the historic site, but little, if any decisive action. The Commission did not feel it was within their purview and moved on.
- Discussed the updated progress of several on-going Parks projects that included the coming upgrade at Pinehurst and

the 12th Street Boat docks, general Buffington Park projects, the proposed Bus Stop next to the new Library site. All projects were on schedule.

• Discussed sending Parks Chairman Jim Billings and Parks Secretary Millie North to a grant writing workshop in Coos Bay in May. The tuition would be \$375 per person. While the money for tuition for two people did not exist in the budget, Mayor Auborn who was in attendance asked to have this brought to the next City Council meeting. Jay Stoler, representing the Chamber said that perhaps the Chamber might be able to donate some tuition money.

The productive meeting ended about 8:30pm.

Play it Again Sam

The Southwestern Theatre Club will present *Play It Again Sam: Three Experimental Plays By Samuel Beckett* on Tuesday, March 15 at 7:00 PM. This showcase performance will be held in the Performing Arts Center on the campus of Southwestern Oregon Community College.

Samuel Beckett was one of the most influential authors of the 20th century. He was born near Dublin and resided in Paris until his death in 1989. During World War II, Beckett fought with the French Resistance against the Nazis: an experience that was later to color much of his writing. He inherited the Irish literary tradition of Shaw, Wilde, Yeats and Joyce. Best known for the plays, Waiting for Godot and Happy Days, he was also a prolific writer of novels, poetry, and dramatic works for radio and television. Beckett wrote only one screenplay, Film which featured Buster Keaton. Samuel Beckett was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1961.

The short plays being presented at Southwestern date from 1962 to 1981 and are quite experimental in nature. The first

play titled That Time is a stream-ofconscious monologue that dramatizes the fallibility of memory. Three voices bombard a lone actor with shattered images from his past. As the narrative lines weave and overlap, Beckett examines the transitions that delineate youth, maturity and old age. The second play, Ohio Impromptu, two anonymous men sit at a table before a mysterious book. As passages are read and re-read, the play builds to one of Beckett's most poignant climaxes. The third, titled *Play* is farce on our need for companionship. Two women and a man are interrogated about their romantic liaisons in a contrapuntal tour de force.

At turns earthy, harrowing and infuriating, these short plays are best approached as allegories. The post-human characters in these works dwell in a world of theatrical abstraction where minor gestures, sideways glances and silences communicate as much as the spoken text. This is the theatre of the absurd, where realism is rejected and the human plight is theatricalized with existential terseness.

Play It Again Sam is director Rob Clingan's fifth outing with Samuel Beckett. Admission to Play It Again Sam at the





Understanding CD's By Valerie Jean Kramer

CD-RW drives can burn either CD-R or CD-RW disks. The drive will have 3 numbers associated with it – like "52x32x52". The first number indicates how fast the drive can record a CD-R, the second how fast it can burn a CD-RW, and the third how fast it can read a CD. The numbers are relative to "real time" If you recorded a standard disk at 1x it would take 74 minutes. At 2x it would take 37 minutes and so on. At 52x it would take 74/52 = 1.4 minutes at least in theory. You should know what your drive's speed is so you can purchase the right disks for your drive!

CD-R's are more common than CD-RW. They are "worm" disks – "Write Once, Read Mostly." That is, you write to them once and from then on you merely read them. A standard CD has a capacity of 650Mb or 74 minutes of music though

CD-R disks can store computer files, music, or video. CD-RW drives usually include a "light" version of Easy CD Creator (now Easy Media Creator) or Nero Burning ROM to use to burn CD's. Any CD-R disks can be used in a CD-R drive. If necessary, you can tell the software to burn at less than your drive's maximum speed to insure a good result. An unsuccessfully burned CD is known as a "coaster" and that's about all it's good for. "Burnproof" or "buffer underrun" protection in recent drives and software helps a lot. You can usually burn at more than the disk's rated speed but results vary depending on the disks, the drive, and the software.

CD-RW disks sound great at first – you can basically treat them as if they were a large floppy disk! The standard CD-RW holds 500Mb of data or only about 76% of the capacity of a CD-R though newer disks now have the same 700Mb capacity.

They are slower than CD-R's – typically at least 4 times slower though again, the new drives are better. You have to install a device driver on your computer before you can use CD-RW disks. These drivers have caused me a lot of problems and I no longer install them on my own machines. The disks have to be formatted before they can be used for the first time. Finally, once you have written something to a CD-RW, you probably cannot read it back in a normal CD-ROM drive and may not even be able to read it back in some other CD-RW drive or even in the same drive under different drivers! CD-RW disks are often incompatible with standalone CD or DVD players. Besides all that, the blank disks cost more! Some of these issues have been overcome and others may be solved in time. For now, I'd recommend CD-R's unless they just won't do.

There are four speed categories of CD-RW's and they are NOT interchangeable! Regular speed (1-4x), High speed (4-10x), Ultra speed (8-24x), and Ultra Speed+ (32x) disks. Newer drives are usually faster and usually are designed to be backward compatible with the slower disks but check your instruction manual

to be sure and put a note in your wallet if necessary.

If you shop for blank CD's you will find some labeled "Audio" or "Music" and some labeled "Data" (or are unlabeled). Both types look the same to computer CD-RW drives but stand-alone recorders in stereo systems require the "Music" disks which have a special code embedded in them.

Be sure to tell your software to "finalize" your CD-R when you burn it or it may not play in all drives. Do not add more to the disk later (multisession disks) because Windows has no good way to get to anything but the last session.

Finally, don't run any other software while you are burning CD's!
