Congratulation Graduates By Evan Kramer



One of the happiest events of the year in Port Orford is the Pacific High School graduation ceremony and it takes place this Friday night, June 3, 7:00pm, inside the school gymnasium.

This is a time of transition as the 33 graduating seniors leave Pacific High School and go out into the world.

This year of the 33 graduates, 25 are going on to either two or four year colleges ranging from SWOCC, to Embry Riddle, Oregon State University, University of Oregon, Portland Community College, Long Beach State College, Lane Community College, Pacific University and George Fox, among others. None of the graduates is going into the military this year. Two of the graduates are entering trade schools and the other six are entering the work force.

Everyone is invited to the graduation ceremony, which usually draws around 500 people. The commencement speaker this year is Lt. Colonel Rick Francona.

The graduates participate in Project Graduation activities beginning during the

day on June 3, then participate in the graduation ceremony and then continue with Project Graduation through the night and end up with a breakfast on Saturday morning where they are given their diplomas.

Jubilee Auction

This Saturday night, June 4 is the annual Jubilee Auction, which will be held at the Port Orford Community Building, starting at 6:30pm. This is an important step in the annual fireworks program held each year on the night of July 4 at Battle Rock Park. Someone has to pay for the fireworks and this is one of the main fundraising events. This year the Jubilee Committee has worked extra hard to come up with lots of great auction items so don't miss out on this one.

The Jubilee Committee has also been putting together the 2005 Jubilee Schedule of Events. They have a four-day series of things to do and enjoy this year staring on July 1 with square and round dancing at the Beachcombers Dance Cove from 7:00-10:30m. The theme of this year's Jubilee is "Ocean port with no bar to cross". The July 4 events come to a glorious ending at dusk on July 4 with the fireworks display at Battle Rock Park. The Port Orford Volunteer Fire Department puts on the fireworks. There are no

fees for the fireworks display but donations are accepted at the sound truck located in the parking lot.



offense will result in a citation signed by the complainant. We generally cannot issue a citation if the offense is not committed in our presence.

City Budget Wrap-Up

After six sessions lasting a total of more than eleven hours and five different budget drafts the Port Orford Budget Committee hammered out and approved a working budget of \$2, 217,589 for the fiscal year of 2005-2006, beginning July 1, 2005.

The Budget Committee approved the budget and set the tax rates at their final meeting on Wednesday, May 25. The Committee had the added pressure of having only 8 of 14 members present, which meant that the vote had to be unanimous. It was, but not without lots of questions and requests for justification of budget amount from department heads.

There was even a last minute effort by Councilor Ed Beck to try and offset the pending sewage rate increase with a five step program that would have ultimately needed about \$20,000 to be transferred

from the reserve fund to the water fund. The problem was the reserve account was too low to permit any more transfers. However Mayor Auborn said they would revisit that idea when time comes for the Water Master Plan.

Almost everything that was asked for by department heads was granted with the possible exception of a new city worker that would be shared by several departments. It is unclear at this time if the City Council will cut that position or fund it when they put their stamp of approval on it.

The total contingency and unappropriated ending balance was about \$129,000 at the beginning of the budget meetings and was whittled down to a razor-thin \$44,000 in the final version. This amount comes into play in the time between the beginning of the fiscal year on July 1, and sometime in October when tax monies start rolling in. Finance Director Dave

Johnson said the \$44,000 would probably tide us over, but it would be close.

The Budget Committee was made up of the Mayor and City Council and citizens Emily Francona, Gary Doran, Ken Williams, John Lincoln, Joanne Ruoff and Jim Rhoades. Technically Bob Ewalt was on the committee although he was not available for meetings and could not resign in time to get a replacement.

The tax rates are \$2.2688 per thousand dollars evaluation for the city property tax and \$1.14 per thousand dollars evaluation for the Police Levy. Other funding for the city comes in the form of revenue from citations, grants, rentals, licenses, state revenue sharing and surcharges.

Look for the budget to be published in the next few weeks. Copies of the proposed budget are available to look at down at city hall.

New P.A. at Clinic

Curry Family Medical has recruited a physician assistant from Klamath Falls to help staff the clinic for at least the next six weeks, announced Ginny Hochberg, CEO of the Curry General Hospital Health Network.

Traci Darnell, P.A., is seeing patients in the Port Orford clinic now, temporarily. A traveling health care provider, she last worked for an addictions clinic in Casper, Wyoming. She also worked for Healthcare for the Homeless in Casper. "She will fill the gap between Carol Milne and a permanent hire," Hochberg says.

Darnell received her physician assistant degree from University of North Texas Health Science Center in Fort Worth. She received her bachelor's degree in biology from Southern Nazarene University in Bethany, Oklahoma. Currently, she and her husband, a family practice doctor, reside in Klamath Falls.

Highway Bill

The House of Representatives appointed Representative Peter DeFazio on May 26 as a conferee to the multi-year, roughly \$290 billion federal highway and transit funding bill known as TEA LU, the Transportation Equity Act, A Legacy for Users. The bill could include over \$2 billion for highway and transit projects in Oregon. As a conferee and Ranking Democrat on the House Highways, Transit and Pipelines Subcommittee, DeFazio will continue to play a leading role in the crafting and passage of this crucial legislation.

DeFazio and a handful of his House colleagues will work with their Senate

counterparts over the next few weeks to resolve differences in the House and Senate-passed versions of the highway bill. These meetings of the Conference Committee will produce a single piece legislation that can be sent to the President and signed into law.

Although the legislation is paid for through gas tax receipts, President Bush has threatened to veto the highway bill if it exceeds \$283.9 billion. A veto of this bill could be the first veto of the president's career.

As Ranking Democrat on the key committee of jurisdiction for TEA LU, the Highways, Transit and Pipelines Subcommittee, DeFazio worked to increase overall funding for Oregon in the Housepassed bill, at over \$2.5 billion. He will work to protect that high level of funding in the final legislation developed by the Conference Committee.
