The Port Orford Arts Council had a sellout on its hands for the Compleat Works of Wllm Shkspr (abridged) on Saturday night at the Community Building.

Over 200 people were on hand to welcome the FoxWell Production's version of this three-person play, which takes in all 37 of Shakespeare's plays. Starring in the production were Michael S. Fox as Michael, Victoria Weller as Victoria and Arthur Dingle as Arthur and Ozzie Nelson as Ozzie Nelson. The first of the plays the group tackled, once a little background on Shakespeare was given, was Romeo and Juliet and from there it was all uphill and outrageously funny. The company of three did a rap version of Othello and a version of MacBeth with extreme Scottish brogues. They broke for intermission when Art left the building rather than perform Hamlet and when the company resumed the play the second half was devoted to the Bard's most famous work about Hamlet, the Prince of Denmark. They pulled in a few audience members to participate and later got the entire audience in on the fun. And if you didn't get to see the play or

#### Irish Chautauqua By Carol Berger

An enthusiastic crowd filled the City Council Chambers to almost overflowing on Saturday night, August 27, to hear Jeni Foster present her program, "My Father's Immigrant Eyes: Songs and History of Irish Emigration to America." The program was co-sponsored by the Friends of the Port Orford Library and the Friends of Cape Blanco, and is an Oregon Chautauqua Program presented through the Oregon Council for the Humanities. Foster presented her first chautaqua program ever, here in Port Orford six years ago; this was her fourth presentation here. In addition to stories of how the Irish came to America. Foster played the guitar and sang a number of songs about Irish emigration, most traditional. and asked for audience participation in singing several of them.

Besides being of general interest, the subject of chautaqua relates significantly

to Hughes House at Cape Blanco, which was the home of Patrick Hughes, how emigrated from Ireland himself. After Foster told the fascinating story of why and how the Irish emigrated to America in vast numbers in the mid-1800's, Friends of Cape Blanco member Shirley Nelson told the story of Patrick Hughes.

In addition to Foster's most informative and entertaining presentation, the evening included refreshments provided by the members of the Friends of Cape Blanco and the Friends of the Port Orford Library, and a raffle of items provided by the Friends of Cape Blanco. Thanks go both organizations for sponsoring an enjoyable evening.

Ann Robbins, unofficial Mayor of Langlois, passed away the night of Saturday, September 3 in her sleep after a splendid day hosting Back to the Garden: A Celebration of Community Arts. It was a day of community and friends - and celebrated the creative spirit in all of us. Ann recently wrote the following piece:

#### **New Beginnings**

In August 1987, I remarried after being a single mom of sixteen years. Two months later, I was diagnosed with breast cancer after my annual check-up. After I was released, I remember my doctor telling me, "Go live your life. Don't let the fear of cancer live it."

After a vacation in Oregon, which we fell in love with, my husband and I left our jobs, packed up, left Colorado and moved to Oregon. We bought an acre of land and started our life together.

I had been brought up by parents who loved to garden and my time had come. And garden I did with a passion. Once again I took to heart what someone said: "If you're going to drag all those plants home, you might as well start a nursery."

On April 15th, 1993, Sweet Annie's Herb Nursery opened. On April 15, 2000, the nursery relocated because of personal circumstances.

This time, I was alone again. Because of the faith and love I had found in the people, I chose to remain in the area, and so I moved right into the heart of the small town close to where I had lived.

The nursery is now twelve years old, and I will soon be 65. Both of us keep evolving. There may be another "new beginning" in my future, but for now each time I step out my door into the garden is my new beginning.

#### Watercolorist Show

This Sunday, September 11 from 5 to 7pm, the Biscuit Art Gallery in Gold Beach will host a free reception celebrating the work of Curry County artist Shelly Wierzba.

The daughter of a prominent San Francisco area painter, Wierzba grew up in the midst of a vibrant artistic home and community. She has been an artist for 35 years, as well as a long time student of art and design. Only after early retirement from a medical career did Wierzba devote her full time to painting.

While watercolors are her primary choice, Wierzba also works with other media to create her art, which has been exhibited at shows and galleries throughout Oregon. Her series of paintings on child abuse prevention has been widely acclaimed and featured at events sponsored by children's advocacy groups. "My challenge is to create arresting designs that excite me, and which will hopefully stir emotions in the viewer," Wierzba says, adding that human figure is her favorite subject "because there is always a story behind the image." According to Biscuit Art Gallery owner Ted Watkins, "Like all truly accomplished artists, Shelly has developed her own identifiable style which is present in all of her work, whether her light-hearted and whimsical creations that will make anyone smile, or her serious subjects which involve a provocative blend of sultry passion and spirituality."

Wierzba's work has received several honors and awards and, most recently, one of her paintings was accepted into the Northwest Watercolor Society Show, scheduled for later this year in Seattle. In addition to the many artistic associations to which she belongs, Wierzba is an advisor to the Biscuit Art Gallery, where her works will be on display through October 14.

#### Senior Center News


The Port Orford Senior Center office is open Monday through Friday from 9:30am to 3:30pm and the coffee is always on.

This is an all volunteer event, table setup and decoration is scheduled for noon





#### **School Begins**

The Port Orford/Langlois School District welcomes students back this week. Classes for kindergarten through eight grade began on Tuesday, September 6 at Driftwood, Blanco, and at Pacific High School for the ninth graders. Classes for those young people in grades 10, 11, and 12 began at Pacific bright and early on Wednesday morning, September 7.

Now for a reminder to motorists. The speed in the Driftwood School zone is 20 miles per hour-twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week so wake up and pay attention as the police department will be monitoring the school zone regularly. #### Coos-Curry Meeting By Christine L. Stallard Member / Public Affairs Director

The Coos-Curry Electric Cooperative Inc. Board of Directors held its regularly scheduled meeting on Friday, August 26, at the Cooperative's headquarters in Port Orford.

The Board discussed and acted on the following items.

**Financial Report:** Board members continue to closely monitor the financial condition of the Cooperative, provided reports that illustrate that revenues and expenses are in line with projections and are consistent with seasonal patterns of revenue generation and operating and maintenance costs. Overall, CCEC management has been accurate and realistic in its projections and the Cooperative is on budget in all areas of operations and electricity sales and purchases.

Reports to the Board: The board discussed power supply forecasts through PNGC Power and noted that the loss of generating capacity due to the summer spill requirement and Columbia Generating Station continue to be big issues for PNGC's member utilities and our Cooperative. Both the hydropower system and the Columbia Generating Station, a thermal generation source, represent unknown financial exposure and will not be fully understood until the end of summer when the Bonneville Power Administration reconciles the amount of power purchases needed - and market prices paid to meet load requirements. Ultimately, these costs are passed on to utilities, including Coos-Curry Electric Cooperative, in the form of wholesale power rates. Staff reports including that of General Manager, CEO Werner Buehler and a report from the Oregon Rural Electric Cooperative Association were also presented to the Board. These reports were routine with no significant issues noted.

The City of Port Orford is seeking a Planning Consultant to provide technical assistance to amend the city's comprehensive plan and zoning regulations to create a refinement plan for a special area within the city. Duties will include:

- Setting Goals for the Community
- Collecting an up to date database of information regarding the existing land uses in the area, public facilities, vacant developable land, potential redevelopment properties, existing and future plans of affected public agencies (i.e. Port of Port Orford, ODOT, OPRD, etc.), and proposed development plans of private land owners.
- Meet with staff and Board of Directors of the Port of Port Orford to obtain information regarding existing and future development plans.
- Meet with staff, Planning Commission and Parks Commission of the City of Port Orford to obtain information regarding existing and future development plans for the city.
- Conduct a series of three separate public meetings within the City of Port Orford to involve the general public in setting goals and creating a new vision for future development within the proposed special area.
- Prepare a final report for Phase I of the project which includes:
- A summary of the findings from the meetings described above.
- The identified community goals and future vision for the special areas.
- Recommendation(s) for proceeding with Phase II of the project and development of a refinement plan for the proposed special area.

Work to be performed under the direct supervision of the City Administrator through the Planning Director.

Total budget for Phase I is \$60,000 of which and estimated \$25,000 is dedicated for consultant services and \$5,000 for GIS services to be provided by Curry County. An additional \$30,000 of in-kind services shall be provided by the city.
