Council Hires Mike Murphy By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council met on Monday night with council president Jim Campbell presiding in the absence of Mayor Jim Auburn. Campbell announced that the council had hired Mike Murphy as the new city administrator in a unanimous vote. This action was taken on Friday, April 14. Campbell said he felt the city had a very good individual for the job. Murphy currently works as the Curry County Director of Emergency Services. He has given his two week notice and will begin working for the city on May 1. Murphy attended Monday night's meeting and said he "looks forward to getting in and making good things happen."

Port Orford Volunteer Fire Department Chief Gayle Wilcox presented the council with the department's quarterly report. Councilor Steve Abbott asked her about maintenance logs for the department's equipment. Wilcox responded that they have logs for each vehicle and have hired a new person to maintain the vehicles. There are 20 volunteer fire fighters in the department of which six are new volunteers going through training. The training classes are held in conjunction with members of the Sixes and Langlois fire departments.

Curry Transfer and Recycling Manager Pete Smart presented the council with the company's annual request for a rate increase. They are allowed the equivalent of the CPI increase for the year which would have been a 3.8% increase but asked for a 3% raise. Councilor Ed Beck asked Smart about the placement of CTR dumpsters on city rights-of-way and Smart told him he would look into it. Councilor Carl Eskelson made a motion to approve the CTR rate increase of 3% and it passed unanimously.

Under citizen's concerns the council heard a presentation from Bill Hawkins representing the Port Orford Community Ambulance (POCA). He began by congratulating the council on their fantastic decision for city administrator. Mary Loan, financial advisor to POCA, had written a letter to the council representing PO Ambulance regarding the deteriorating conditions of the ambulance bay doors. Hawkins told the council the doors need to be replaced and the POCA has been told they are unfixable. Hawkins estimated the cost of replacing the current doors with insulated steel doors at \$3,000. Fire Chief Gayle Wilcox explained to the council the necessity of fixing the doors. She said they are semi-automatic and when the ambulance leaves on a call the doors come down to

close but then go back up again. She said this delays response time by a couple of minutes. The crew can't leave the ambulance bay until the doors are down and locked. Councilor Milton Finch made a motion to put the doors out for bid and approve the bidding process and get the job done as soon as the city can get the money. The motion passed 6-0.

Police Chief Mark Creighton thanked councilor Jerry Steinhorst for donating a shotgun to the department. Creighton announced that he had promoted officer Scott Halse to Sergeant that day. Creighton then handed out a letter to the council regarding a situation that occurred in Port Orford on Thursday April 13 when police officers Scott Halse and John Fink responded to a silent alarm of a robbery in progress at Chetco Credit Union. At the time of the alarm Creighton was in Coos Bay but in contact via radio and cell phone with his department. At one point during the incident Officer Halse notified Creighton that there was no robbery in progress and that it was a false alarm. A patron had come out of Chetco and informed Halse that there was no robbery in progress in the bank. Halse was told by Creighton to contact the bank manager and have that person make contact with the police. Despite this Curry

Council Hires Mike Murphy Continued from Front Cover

County Sheriff Mark Metcalf and other sheriff deputies continued to respond to the scene in a Code 3 mode (high speeds with lights and sirens) Creighton said the Sheriff disregarded Creighton's request that the action be called off. Creighton said Metcalf's actions reflected very poor judgement in overruling the local department. Creighton said he didn't want this to happen again and told the council he is the chief law enforcement officer for the city. He said some very inappropriate things were done that he called kindergarten stuff.

Councilor Ed Beck gave a public works subcommittee report. He said the city did not receive the culvert grant it had recently applied for. He said that under rumor control it is not true that there will be a moratorium on water hook ups after 50 more houses are connected to the system.

The monthly public works report showed 6.086 million gallons of water pumped from the Hubbard Creek reservoir and

that the city distributed 5.107 million gallons of water. The city billed 2,658,700 gallons in March but 2,448,300 gallons of water were unaccounted.

Grey Podorean representing the Podorean Family Trust presented the council with a letter regarding the old city jail property which the trust owns. He said he wanted to move forward on the project which includes a street vacation of Eighth Street and a lot partition splitting the jail off from the lot. The City would get the jail and a small amount of property adjacent to it and the trust would get half of Eight Street to a length of 150 feet. Podorean said he wanted to revisit the issue and do a center line vacation which would have given the trust and other adjoining property owner 30 feet of Eight Street with the middle 20 feet held in city hands. Councilor Abbott made a motion to have the city pursue three bids for a survey for the lot partition and have the city planning department start the street vacation process. The vote was 5-0 with Ed Beck abstaining.

The council passed Resolution 2006-20 unanimously. It authorizes the acceptance and disbursement of several grants to the Port Orford Police Department.

The council passed Resolution 2006-21 authorizing a supplemental budget transfer of money to the police department.

The council voted 6-0 on Resolution 2006-22 allowing the City to have an agreement with Sterling Savings Bank so city utility customers may set up automatic pay plans for their water/sewer bills.

The council voted to approve Resolution 2006-23 accepting the proposal of Richard P. Turi to administer the construction of the new Port Orford Public Library.

Seven city employees recently voted to be represented by the Teamster's Union. Councilors Finch and Abbott met on Monday morning with the Teamster's representatives and began negotiating the contract with the city employees for the next fiscal year.

Broadband is Coming! by Dana Amarisa

A local group has been working hard to bring high-speed internet to local homes and businesses by 2007. Scotty Auble, Ed McQuade, and Valerie Kramer formed non-profit CurryISP, Inc. specifically to make broadband a reality.

"Telecommunications companies can't make much profit offering broadband in a town our size, so I realized that if we're going to have high-speed internet here, we're going to have to do it ourselves," Auble said.

With hundreds of hours of research and planning under their belts, now CurryISP is focusing on funding. McQuade explained, "It's going to take help from our community and grants from outside to build this network. This is about the long-term economic and cultural vitality of our town, about engaging with the rest of the world on a level footing, say in an

internet business or getting a college degree without leaving home," he said.

The \$200,000 USDA Community Connect grant that CurryISP is applying for requires volunteers, donations for matching funds, and letters of support from locals and businesses, due May 15th. As part of the grant, CurryISP will provide a Community Access Computer Center and free broadband to the library and the City of Port Orford.

The Garrison Lake Restoration Committee will meet on Thursday, April 20, at 5:30 pm in the Council Chambers at City Hall. This is a public input meeting and anyone with visions for Garrison Lake for the next ten years is encouraged to attend the meeting and share.

There will be also a special presentation from Mary Pfauth and Rich Miller from Portland State University Center for Lakes and Reservoirs. They will be in town to study the Lake and make a presentation.

The Visioning session will be lead by Amy Wilson who is currently the USDA Coordinator for the Southwest Oregon Resource Conservation and Development Council in Grants Pass. Amy will be leading an hour-long facilitation on the community vision for Garrison Lake in

Participants will practice with emergency equipment that should be onboard any commercial fishing boat or other sizeable vessel - PFDs, life rafts, immersion suits, EPIRBs, fire extinguishers. They will learn and practice emergency procedures like man overboard retrieval, abandoning ship, fire fighting and flooding control.

Mariners who have already taken the course are encouraged to attend again to refresh their skills. A study by NIOSH determined that after five years, the effectiveness of training in reducing fatalities declines significantly.

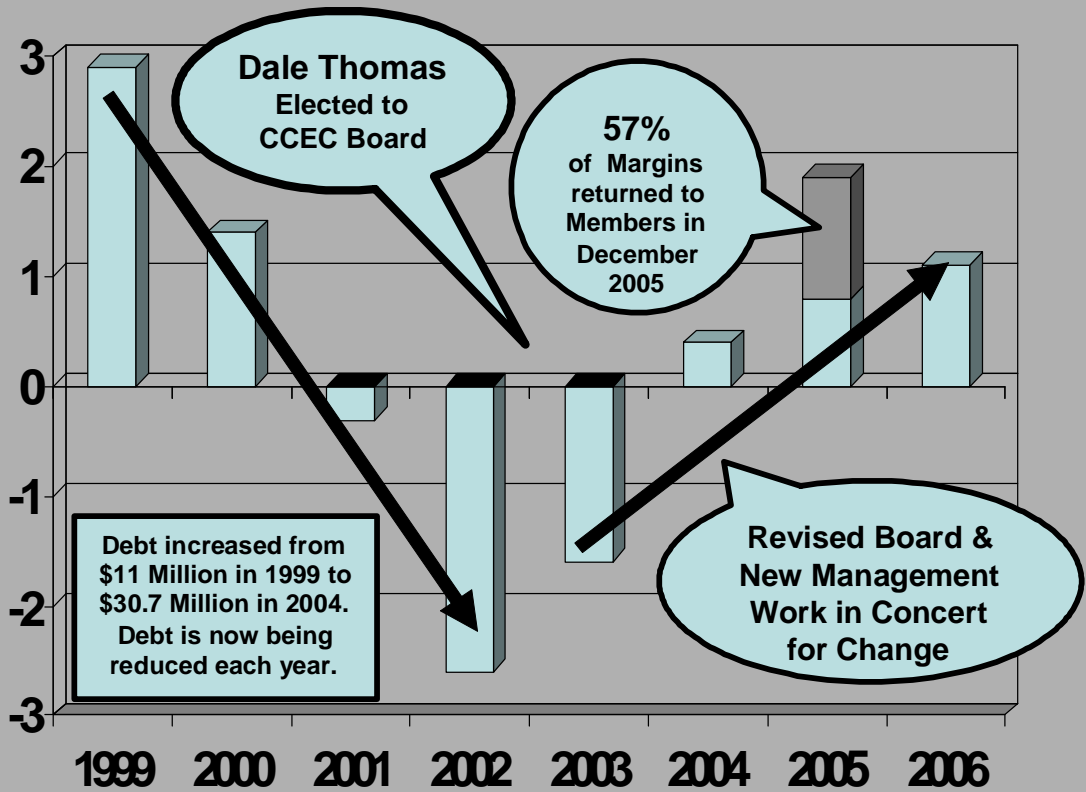

Coos-Curry Electric Cooperative Base Electric Business Operating Results Profits and Losses In Millions of Dollars by Year





The Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission met on Friday, April 14 and heard testimony from 65 commercial crabbers on proposals to limit the number of pots their boats may fish in a season.

Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife staff presented options developed in cooperation with the commercial crab industry, whose members voiced concerns about derby-style behavior during the winter opening of the season and an over-capitalization of the resource.

Both proposals work to limit the Oregon commercial crab fishery to approximately 150,000 pots in the ocean, require the use of buoy tags, establish a maximum pot size of 13 cubic feet, establish an appeals board, require a single pot limit per vessel, prohibit gear leasing and require a review of the program after three years. The Commission will take final action on the issue at its June 9 meeting in Salem.

The Commission staff presented an overview of proposed ocean sport and commercial salmon seasons, approved at the recent Pacific Fishery Management Council meeting in Sacramento. The pro-

posed seasons await approval by the U.S. Secretary of Commerce, but the Oregon Commission approved fishing seasons in state waters that correspond to regulations in federal waters. Details are available on ODFW's web site www.dfw.state.or.us/MRP/salmon/updatesnew

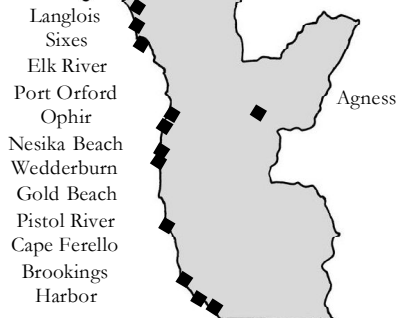

Police Report By Chief Mark Creighton

04-13 Police responded to an alarm at one of our local establishments. Upon arrival it was determine to be a false alarm.

04-14 Police received information that a person had violated a restraining order by using other police agencies to intimidate the victim. Police have started a criminal investigation, and are in the process of preparing that information for review by the Curry County District Attorney for criminal prosecution.

04-15 Police responded to one of our local restaurants on a call of a fight in progress. Police arrived, investigated the incident, and one male subject was issued a citation to appear for Assault IV.

Police responded to Pinehurst on a call of a fight in progress. Upon investigation police determined the fight had broken up just prior to police arrival.

04-16 police observed suspicious activity Easter Sunday in back of True Value hardware. The missing white plastic goose previously removed by the Pink Flamingo Phantom has re-appeared and is right next to the Pink Flamingo. Both now seem happy together. Also mysteriously appearing were four small plastic semi-pink baby birds floating happily in the puddle. Could this be a new species of Flamingeese? Police are puzzled.

CHIEFS NOTE: Traffic speeds are again on the increase in our community, and because of the large flow of traffic during the summer months; sometimes it is difficult to use our current radar on a group of vehicles to pick out the exact speeding vehicle. We now have added a laser radar unit which was provided by Oregon Department of Transportation on a grant from our department. This unit utilizes a laser beam aimed at a specific vehicle. The vehicles speed can actually be detected from one end of town to the other, and is extremely accurate. Because of the restrictive cost for such an expensive tool, our agency did not have the funds to purchase one. We put in a grant for several pieces of equipment through ODOT, and thanks to them we were awarded the laser radar, and additional handheld radar, and an in-vehicle recording device which will be installed

soon in one of our patrol vehicles. Because of the increase in vehicle flow I'm asking everyone to use caution when driving, riding bikes or skate boards, and walking. We will continue to aggressively working the traffic speed problem. Remember if you have any comments either good or bad, information that you would like to pass on to me regarding the police department, or just a question or concern you want an answer to.
