Welcome, Ruby Price

The Port Orford-Langlois School District has selected Ruby Price to become the district's next superintendent/principal, starting July 1. The School Board voted to approve selection of Price on Monday, May 1.

Ruby Price was in the Port Orford-Langlois community on Tuesday and Wednesday, May 2 & 3, saying that "meeting staff, students, parents, and community members is a high priority for her and she did not want to wait until she was officially on board in July." She visited Driftwood, Pacific High, and Blanco schools and met with a number of community members as well.

Price began her educational career as a teacher at Central Howell SD, a small district of 110 students near Silverton, Oregon, in 1985. She moved to the Salem School District in 1987 and served for five years as a Title 1 Basic Skills teacher at Richmond Elementary School. She was an assistant principal for two elementary schools for two years, traveling 15 miles between the two school sites as needed. She was then selected to be the principal at Lake Labish Elementary School and also served at the same time as District Title I Coordinator for three years. Her final position in the Salem-

Keizer School District was as principal of Highland Elementary School where she served for five years.

In 2001, Ruby Price was selected as the director of the Leadership Academy for the Success for All Foundation and provided Leadership Academy training to more than 30 school districts nationwide over a four year period, from Alaska to South Texas to Kansas to North Carolina. One interesting assignment found her providing leadership and support to a number of K-12 schools in remote villages in Alaska near the Bering Sea.

She graduated with a bachelor's degree from Western Oregon University in 1985 and a master's degree from Portland State University in 1987. She completed the superintendent licensure program at Portland State University in 2001. She has worked for more than 20 years in education-related positions.

Ruby is looking forward to moving to the Port Orford-Langlois area with her husband, Dale, who is retired from the military where he served on active and reserve duty.

Leadership Training

Volunteer action preserves and improves the quality of life in Oregon. By building the skills of attendees, the training creates excellent project managers and improved communities. Training topics include volunteer recruitment, project planning, fundraising, and publicity.

The Volunteer Action Training empowers citizens to organize projects and en-

gage volunteers in Oregon communities. "Across Oregon, there's a growing need to keep our state livable," says Gerik Kransky, Program Coordinator with SOLV. "Oregonians from every region have a vision for their communities, and they know action is needed to achieve that vision. Because of this expansion SOLV no longer calls itself "Stop Oregon Litter and Vandalism" and has adopted the acronym, SOLV, as its official name.

Sole Pursuits

A lucky walker will receive a \$50 cash prize when Curry General Hospital's Sole Pursuits organizers announce the next winner in the Walking Card Program, Saturday, June 3. The announcement will be made prior to the group's monthly hike when Walt Schroeder, historian, and Cathy Boden, naturalist, lead their annual quest into the Kalmiopsis Wilderness to view the blooming Kalmiopsis leachiana. Those interested in participating can register with Southwestern Oregon Community College or just show up at 8:30am, at the SWOCC campus in Brookings.

The famous purple blossom was first discovered by Lila Leach in 1930. The plant is a pre-ice age relic and the oldest member of the Health (Ericaceae) family.

Besides being a place of great botanical interest, the Kalmiopsis Wilderness –

named for the rare plant — is also one of the most complex geological areas of the United States. Schroeder will discuss historic mining activities that occurred there when the group walks by the old Gardner Mine. Hikers also will have the option to trek to Vulcan Lake, another wilderness landmark, before returning to the trailhead.

The walking card cash prize is made possible by the Chetco Federal Credit Union, co-sponsor of the Sole Pursuits Walking Card Program. Walkers are eligible to enter the drawings for free after they have tracked 15 hours of walking, or about a month of daily half-hour walks.

Walking cards are available in the Curry General Hospital lobby in Gold Beach, or in The Brookings Medical Center, 585 5th St. in Brookings. Participants can return their completed cards to the same locations for entry in quarterly drawings. The next drawing will be scheduled in September.

On June 24, Sole Pursuits will host a hike for Wilderness Week with eco-forester and naturalist, Jerry Becker. Becker will lead hikers to the top of Barlow Mountain within the proposed Copper Salmon Wilderness near Port Orford.

Parks Commission Report by Jay Stoler

The Port Orford Parks Commission met on Tuesday, May 2 for their regular monthly meeting. Commissioners present included Chairman Jim Billings, Joanne Ruoff, Millie North, Mark Murray, Jodi Bulaich and Laurie Borba. Jerry Stienhorst was absent. New City Administrator Mike Murphy and Police Chief Mark Crieghton were also present. In addition there were half dozen citizens.

They had a full agenda and here are the highlights:

• Had a long discussion with Chief Creighton about safety and vandalism issues in the Parks, particularly Buffington Park where there seems to be a rash of vandalism lately. Creighton was also concerned about visuals for police patrols and suggested the removal of brush at certain areas and a light at another area. A second topic was dogs running loose on the baseball field and in the Park leaving waste deposits, which is unhealthy and illegal. The Commission agreed with the Chief and voted to ban dogs altogether from the ball field and to also place four signs in Buffington Park,

and in other area, advising the leash law and encouraging people to clean up after their dog. The Commission also agreed to get the brush removed and install a light.

- Carrie Shields showed the Commission drawings of how the proposed Edible Garden project next to the A-frame building in the Park would look. Shields showed how the rainwater tub would be enclosed by lattice fence work. Shields said the time is now to move ahead on the project.
- The Commission decided that they needed to do an on-site inspection of the Garden proposal and the Chief's requests, so they will meet on Sunday and do a walk-through of the Parks and make notes.
- The old, rusty dumpster will be removed from Battle Rock Park and be relocated elsewhere. The dumpster is an eyesore and will be replaced by several small trash-cans.
- The Commission scheduled a meeting for Saturday, May 20, 2006 to discuss utilizing the services of SOLV to maintain trails and help obtain beautification grants. The exact time will be decided

Letter to the Editor,

It had been my pleasure to serve on the Coos-Curry Electric board for 48 years. We saw many successes and some setbacks. It now has \$75,000,000 in assets. Three years ago, the board recognized that we were in trouble and hired the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA).

News from the consultants was not good. They told us that we needed to change, reduce expenses, modernize and raise rates to remain solvent. Implementing the recommendations would be difficult, but we could not shirk our duties.

First we hired a new manager, highly recommended by NRECA, then we got down to the unpleasant task of reducing expenses which meant that we would lose valued employees, but it had to be done. We also had to raise revenues to keep our credit.

The changes caused criticism from a few employees and members, but by far the silent majority of members have recognized and accepted the changes. Fifty years ago my dentist said I needed to remove a tooth. I was certainly unhappy with the news, but it was cracked and infected and a week later I was much happier without pain. My dentist did a needed job as did the current manager and board. Their work is sometimes painful, but they are fair and competent and not avoiding their responsibilities. It would have been much easier to do nothing, but soon they could not have paid the bills.

Who would have kept the lights on then, to light up your life?

Letter to the Editor

Thomas spins again:

Since Mr. Thomas made reference to me in his recent letter to the editor, regarding Joan Calhoun's letter, I felt compelled to do my own research. Joan Calhoun's numbers are correct as she stated. Her letter states "in the past two years" which

is 2003 to 2005 (not 2004 vs 2005), which is the period of time that Dale Thomas has been on the CCEC Board, expenses have increased as follows:

- 1. Operation and Maintenance distribution expenses increased 33 per cent
- 2. Consumer services and accounts expense increased 17 percent.

- 3. Administrative and general expense increased 19%
- 4. Tax expenses increased 215 percent.
- 5. Interest on long-term debt increased 37 percent.

Dale Thomas said her figures were 100% erroneous. He failed to see the difference in one year and two. The figures are absolutely correct according to the 2003 and 2005 CCEC Operations Statements. He suggests contacting a Director for facts but these are the facts. Mr. Thomas has stated many times that since he has been on the Board costs have been reduced at all levels, maybe that is why he does not want the 2003 numbers to be used.
