### LWV Forum Brings out Issues by Jay Stoler

Even though it is an "odd year" Special Districts election, there are plenty of candidates and lots of issues to talk about. And, that is exactly what happened at the League of Women Voters Forum in Port Orford last Monday night.

Nine candidates showed up out of the thirteen that were scheduled for the Forum and they represented only three of the four districts. There was only light attendance from the general public, although more than a dozen volunteer firefighters and Chief Wilcox was in the audience. The following is an overview of the candidates and their stances.

The Port Orford-Langlois School District position #4 has three candidates vying for the two-year balance of a recently vacated chair:

Cairehn L. McGowan – Has been a local teacher for 30 years and is now a substitute teacher at Pacific. She has put six children through the local school system and feels that she has a real grasp on the situation from the perspective of a parent, teacher and taxpayer. McGowan said she would work to promote better communications with the community and keep channels open. McGowan said that children were the future and would

work hard to facilitate opportunities for the students' benefit.

Kenneth Martin – Recently retired to the Sixes area, Martin was a Science teacher in the Powers school system for 11 years and a former local resident and graduate of Pacific High. He said the prime mission of the school is to prepare children for adulthood and that success was having a happy life.

Roger Reiber – A former Junior College teacher and retiree, Reiber moved to Langlois in 2000 and is currently serving on the board as a replacement to Virginia Hughes who resigned. Reiber said that students needed to be trained as literate members of the community. Reiber said he found rural life both rewarding and beneficial, but it also presented challenges.

The Port Orford Rural Fire District Board had all three seats contested although Ed Tennant, the person serving in position #3 did not show up. That position is for the remaining two-years, the other two positions are for full four-year terms.

Edna Auld – Auld is the incumbent for position #1 and has been serving for nearly four years. Auld said she takes the responsibility seriously having been asked to be on the board in 2001 and

then again in 2003, when she accepted a replacement position. Auld felt that only those who truly have the time and commitment should be running for the position. Because the Rural Board takes care of the city and the rural district, Auld felt that being a board member was tremendous responsibility to the whole community and there cannot be a "we vs. them" mentality. Auld said the district is really just one huge area from Elk River to Arizona Beach. Auld said she would weigh all decisions based on what was best for the larger group, not the "select few." Auld expressed a deep sense of respect and understanding for the firefighters. Auld felt that she had made inroads into mutual understanding on the current board and said she is running again to "continue the work this board has begun for the good of the entire community."

Brice Wagner – A former board member and longtime firefighter, Wagner started off by thanking the Chief and firefighters for the good work they do. Wagner then said he was running because he had several concerns. One concern was the evaluation of current apparatus to see what improvements could be made to lower the ISO rating. Wagner said that the ISO ratings could be affected by the

gross weight of the water tenders, which he felt had "some age" on them. Wagner said he has an idea that for not too much expenditure could double or triple the available amount of water to fight a wildfire on the edge of the city. Wagner wanted to see the Jeep at the Elk River station finished to be used as a rescue vehicle for beach use.

Frank Smith – Smith, also a former board member, provided a copy of his presentation to the media. It reads as follows:

I would like to serve on this Board of Directors for the following reasons:

I am concerned about the district and the increasing costs to the tax payers

I am concerned about the continued growth of the City of Port Orford without a significant accounting of the cost to the Rural Fire District for the City's fire protection.

I am concerned about the decline in volunteer fire fighters and the

procedures for selecting and discharging firefighters.

I am concerned about the continual decline of the fire fighting status of the rolling stock, particularly at Elk River and Cedar Terrace. This would include the lack of regular exercising and maintenance checks of all vehicles and equipment.

I am concerned about the giving away of equipment, especially water tankers.

I am concerned about the future of the department in regards to actively soliciting more volunteers.

I am concerned that we have made little to no progress in obtaining more Water Drafting Points throughout our district in order to have enough water to fight a sizable fire and to lower our fire ratings. Other districts have had significant lowering of Fire Ratings by providing adequate water drafting points.

I am concerned about the condition of the Fire Houses, particularly Elk River Fire Hall.

Smiths opponent, the incumbent, Ed Tennant was out of town on a previous commitment.

Beaver Rickel – Said she had lived in Port Orford for 19 years, and did not have a prepared speech, but was interested in the being on the board. She said she felt "we had a good group of people here" and that she felt she could work with them. She said she had a dog grooming business in town and her husband was a commercial fisherman and she wanted to "get involved" because the firefighters did such a fine job.

Marie Van Aart – Van Aart is the incumbent for the position, currently serving as the board secretary. She said she was fairly new to the area, having moved here in 2005 from Ketchikan, Alaska where she worked with the fire department. Van Aart said she is learning a great deal from the current board members and Chief Wilcox and is impressed with the training and dedication of the firefighters. She said the current board works very well with

In accordance with the By-Laws of the Cooperative, nominations made by these committees must be made not less than 45 days prior to the date of the Annual Meeting and posted at the principal office of the Cooperative not less than 30 days prior to the date of the meeting.

The By-Laws also allow any 15 or more qualified members in a district to make other nominations for that district in writing over their signatures not less than

45 days prior to the meeting. Petitions are available at the Cooperative's area business offices and must be returned to the Cooperative's Port Orford Headquarters no later than May 2, 2007, for verification and posting.

In related action at the March meeting, the Board of Directors opted to have the membership fill the District 2 Board position left vacant with David Itzen's resignation during the upcoming election process. This decision was in part due to the amount of time the Board felt was necessary to conduct an interview and selection process and the limited amount of time the successful candidate would hold office before the Annual Meeting.

In other action, the Board of Directors announced that a transmission workshop was tentatively scheduled for April 20th at 10:00 am in the Brookings/Harbor area. The April 20th date was selected based on the importance of having the entire Board of Directors, management and key staff available at the meeting to discuss this important issue. The exact location has not been determined.

## Letter to the Editor,

The recent article by Pilot Staff writer Valliant Corley, "Group Seeks Recall of Co-op Board Members, 4-7-07," is inaccurate to the point of hysterics.

I covered the Annual Coop membership meeting last year in Gold Beach. In fact I have 72 digital pictures, including more than a dozen of the audience and other activities. That meeting was not "packed" by any one group or association, as Corley states. There were less than two-dozen folks with "We Own Coos Curry" name-tags on.

Writer Corley then states that the "group...elected three new board members." That is patently false and

misleading information and should be corrected immediately.

The election was held by mail-in ballot weeks earlier and the annual meeting which is a quasi-legal, mostly social, chicken BBQ to "announce the winners" of the board ballots and give an annual report.

There is no voting at the meeting and the Editor and Publisher of the Pilot knew that, even if writer Corley didn't. It was fallacious and should not have been in print.

The WOCCE group helped raise the voter turnout to 17 percent, nearly double the previous election, and got more people involved. Those people

elected the three new Board members, not WOCCE, whose main goal was to see that "all the member issues" were brought to the table, especially the rate hike increase.

Looking at things in a calm and clear manner is the ONLY direction for the CCEC and ANY group communicating with it. Recalls, misinformation and hysterics will NOT make things better. The scare tactics have to cease and the light of truth must start to shine.

All of the facts and voting by a greater percentage of the Owner/Members is the only answer. Let's work to that end.

At the end of this month, the Pirate Scientists are going to show off the fruits of their hard labors this year at the first annual science fair and fundraiser, on Saturday, April 28 at Driftwood School. Last month the Pirate Scientists represented our district very well at the SOCC Regional Science Fair, with 5 students winning scholarships, 7 bringing in medals, and 3 more earning special recognition awards. WOW! Now, many of these same young scientists

### AARP Driver Safety Class

All attendees 55 or older who complete an AARP Driver Safety Class are certified to receive a reduction in auto insurance from their insurance agent per Oregon state law. Drivers who have previously taken the class and received auto insurance discounts are urged to renew their eligibility for reduced auto insurance rates by taking the class every three years if under 70 years of age and every two years if 70 and older. The next AARP Driver Safety class (55 Alive) is scheduled for Monday and Tuesday, April 23 and 24, at the Port

Orford Senior Center from 9:30am to 1:30pm each day under the auspices of Southwestern Oregon Community College and sponsored by the Port Orford Senior Center. This class is given quarterly in Port Orford.

Driver Safety class reviews how to compensate for age-related changes thereby reducing traffic violations, crashes and chances for injury - in addition to discussing updated Oregon traffic laws. A "generational two for one" tuition is offered wherein parent and child or grandparent and grandchild can take the course for the price of one participant.

Reservations are required and made by calling 247-2741 or 332-0639 or stopping by at the Senior Center in Port Orford (at Jackson and 15th Streets). Registration is at 9:15am preceding the first day of class on April 23rd. Cost of tuition is \$10 with checks made out to AARP (or cash) and includes a workbook and other materials. 


