### Elder Wisdom By Evan Kramer

The North Curry Family and Children's Center sponsored an elder wisdom project which culminated this past Sunday with a reception at the Senior Center and the release of the book, "North Curry Elder Wisdom" – "Local Elders Speak Out on Life". The interviews in the book were compiled and edited by Shirley Nelson. It was for sale at the Senior Center for \$7 and there are still some copies for sale at \$7, available at the Fun Zone or they can be checked out at the Port Orford and Langlois Libraries. Nelson said she had a lot of fun putting the book together and learned a lot about the people who shared their stories. The interviews were conducted between 2003 and 2007 and feature interviews with Rita Armstrong, Myrtle Clark, Charlie Crew, Marcia Donaldson, Carl Eskelson, June Heyl, Jerry Hillman, Ray Johnson, Doug Kinney, Forrest Kirby, Bessie Laursen, Dot Mathews, Delores Mayea, Monty Montgomery, Thelma Nodine, Charlie and Florence Quillen, Jerry Stoo pes, Shirley Van Loo, Peggy Wagner, and Leon White.

Many of these people have served in various roles in the community from Leon White who is a former mayor of Port Orford to Charlie Quillen who helped found the Common Good to Peggy Wagner who

served as the librarian at the local schools including Driftwood, Shirley Van Loo who served for more than 12 years on the Port Orford-Langlois School Board and was a teacher in the Port Orford School District and Carl Eskelson who served over 12 years on the Port Orford City Council.

Some like Marcia Donaldson were born and raised in Port Orford. Charlie Crew was born in Langlois and raised on a ranch in that area. Others like "Monty" Montgomery moved to Port Orford – in his case in 1957. He was born in Louisiana and owned and operated the Union Oil Station in Port Orford for 29 years.

There was a large gathering of people at the Senior Center for the program and most bought books. Many of the people interviewed in the book were present. Some have passed on since the project started and a few were unable to attend but most were there and people who bought a copy of the book went around the room getting them autographed and sharing conversations. Everybody from the people interviewed in the book to the autograph seekers were happy with the way things went which proves that the one thing most of us want is a little attention.

The book has a section at the back for general subjects like what transportation was like, mentors who influenced them,

World War II, the opposite sex, marriage and children. Several people mentioned taking the Greyhound bus in out and of town but the bus no longer stops here as of a few years ago. Charlie Quillen, Charlie Crew, Jerry Stoo pes, Carl Eskelson, Ray Johnson and Jerry Hillman served their country during World War II in different branches of the service while Monty Montgomery and Doug Kinney served in the Vietnam War. One way or another all those interviewed served their country, the area they lived in and their families in many capacities. Now just think of the stories to be told by your parents or grandparents that are just waiting to be released with a little interest on your part.

### Sunset Garden Club Tour

This Saturday July 7 one of Port Orford's best events will be held and that is the Sunset Garden Club Tour. Each year they find five families or individuals willing to share their home gardens and open them up to the public. This year two of the gardens are within the Port Orford city limits while a third is located along Elk River and two others are located along the Sixes River. **A Special Jeep Trip

A while back several of us took an excursion south to Smith River, California. This turning off point is located across from the Sentry Market and Rowdy Creek Junction. Rowdy Creek Road leads one to "Low Divide". Low divide is like being in central Oregon.

The soil and rock reminds one of Iron Mountain that forms the upper headwaters of upper Elk River. The difference being low divide runs for many miles crossing the North Fork Smith River that pours water out of the Kalmiopsis Wilderness. One hour of the trip brought us to North Fork Smith River and two picnic areas to choose from. Absolutely no one was there. Duane Byers saw evidence of a huge snake that had made its way on the dirt road leading into a new campground there. Yes this area is known for rattlesnakes. Backtracking on the road we have to tell about "Altaville". Altaville is a historic mining town dating back to the 1850's. In reading about Altaville it is written that during the American Civil War copper was mined extensively there and shipped to Germany. The Germans made ammunition and shipped back to whichever side for the war. Altaville had a population of 1,500 at one time. Now all that remains are mine tunnels deep into the earth and vertical holes for some water and some vertical mine shafts.

Back to North Fork, Smith River. We enjoyed a picnic lunch at the new campground, and then proceeded to a real Jeep adventure. The Wimer Road as it's called is ultra primitive. Primitive enough that we used our lowest gears in our jeeps because of the rocks imbedded in the 1800's road. At one time the Wimer Road was a toll road for passengers, freight, and footmen from Crescent City, California to Grants Pass, Oregon.

The road supplied all kinds of supplies for the "Gold Rush" times as well as general freight for other. The stage

lines and freight took two days to make this hard trip on the mountain tops and down into the many draws that make up Wimer Road.

The soil which much is boulders and red earth produces azaleas, rhododendron, Indian Paint Brush, Darlingtonia, and others we were unable to identify. We viewed many vast strips where the "Biscuit Fire Scorched the Earth". The end of the line is O'Brian, Oregon. The road and territory is on US Forest Service maps of Curry County. I highly recommend no one cross this area with one vehicle. This is probably one of the, or one of the most primitive named roads in Southern Oregon that is accessible by jeep. If you

take this trip take two vehicles for safety. The wild flowers and the special beauty of Low Divide and the Wimer Road make it a trip to remember. Making the trip were Mickey and Duane Byers, Malcolm Young, Ruby Wagner and myself.

## Remembering Carl Eskelson

Remarks made by Mayor Jim Auburn at Councilor Carl Eskelson's memorial service last Saturday.

I'm grateful for the privilege of knowing Carl Eskelson for the past 8 years since moving to Port Orford. He was a model citizen and a good role model in his public service. He was appointed to the City Council in 1994 to fill an unexpired term of a member who had to resign for personal reasons, and subsequently served in three additional terms. He achieved the highest number of votes of any candidate in the November 2003 election, surpassing even those of

the mayor who ran unopposed. His total service on the council totaled over 12 years. He served on the Public Works, Finance and Personnel Subcommittees, as CTR/Streets Liaison, participated in weekly Staff Meetings, and in a number of other capacities on the City Council. He was fiscally and socially conservative, and worked for the overall benefit of the City and our community. He also served as Assistant Treasurer for Port Orford Rotary, collecting money at our weekly meetings. I enjoyed working with him in that capacity at our annual Rotary 4th of July Pancake Breakfast. I also appreciated seeing him operate the organ here at Zion Lutheran Church when you did not have an organist. His presence and service in all these capacities is sorely missed. Thank you Carl for all you've done.



## Allen Boice Appointed Sheriff

Allen Boice was appointed Sheriff last week by Curry County commissioners Lucie LaBonte, Georgia Nowlin, and Marlyn Schafer and sworn in shortly afterwards. The commissioners had selected two people to interview - Allen Boice and former Josephine County Sheriff Dave Daniels. Shortly before

lunch commissioners were informed by County Counsel Jerry Herbage and it was confirmed by Clerk Kolen and the Secretary of State's office that Daniels did not qualify. According to the statutes an elected or appointed official had to reside in the county for one year before election or appointment. Daniels resides in Grants Pass. There were two other applicants but neither had certification. Boice underwent an extensive interview with 12 questions for nearly one hour. Nowlin and Schafer felt Boice qualified. La Bonté mentioned pitfalls that sometimes occurs moving people up as interim but agreed to the appointment feeling that Boice did qualify. The vote was unanimous. County Clerk Renée Kolen issued the oath of office. Boice was a captain in the Sheriff's Department at the time of his appointment and is the nephew of the "Rogue River" Sheriff Allen Boice.



## **Harry Potter Returns! by Valerie Jean Kramer**

It's a big month for Harry Potter Fans! At 12:01am Wednesday, July 11 The Savoy Theatre will make the first showing of the new Harry Potter movie, "Harry Potter and the Flight of the Phoenix". Later this month on July 21, the seventh and final book in the series, "Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows" will be released.

"Flight of the Phoenix" is the fifth movie in the Harry Potter series and remembering them all is starting to be like trying to remember the names of the seven dwarves. They were, in order, Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone, Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets, Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire, Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban. The sixth book is "Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince".

I remember when Harry Potter first came out I took a look at the books and saw some of the odd and difficult names - Dumbledore, Gryffindor, Hogwarts, Voldemort etc. I was put off and didn't read the books until the second or third volume had been published. Then I got a cheap paperback copy to try it since I'd heard so much about it. Once I got into it, I was entranced just as so many other readers have been and zoomed through the rest of the series, eagerly awaiting each new volume of adventure.

The story line has continued to grow darker and the situation more desperate

as the series has progressed. Those who have followed the series are nervously waiting to see how it all comes out in this final volume. Speculation is rife as to who will die and who will make a comeback. I've had my book pre-ordered for months and I probably won't be good for much for a few days as I'm sure I won't want to put it down once I begin reading.

To date the six books currently available have sold more than 325 million copies and have been translated into more than 63 languages. Publishers have announced a record-breaking 12 million copies for the first print run of the final volume and that's just for the U.S.! The success of the series has made J. K. Rowling the highest earning novelist in history and the first person to become a US-dollar billionaire by writing books. Not a bad comeback for an unemployed single mom living on welfare! It wasn't an instant success, however. Eight publishers rejected the book before one agreed to take a chance on it.

Unlike many movie adaptations of books, the Harry Potter movies have been very well done and, for the most part, have remained true to the books. They have retained the charm of the originals while adding a whole new visual layer to the fantasy. The newest movie about to be released is touted as "the best Harry Potter movie yet!"

The movies are great, but there is much more in the books than can be put into even a long movie. If you liked the movies and haven't read the books, you might just want to think about doing so. I think you'll agree the books are even better. Personally I like to read the book then enjoy the movie (several times). That way if anything is unclear in the movie, you'll understand it anyway because you know all about it from the book.

So get your eyeballs ready. Harry is comin' to town!
