

### Park Not Ready to Reopen By Evan Kramer

Tseriadun State Park at Agate Beach will not be reopening on October 1. The information we heard at the city council meeting that was in this paper last week was incorrect and a simple misunderstanding. State Parks Manager Frank Eckley said on Monday morning there were still several things left to do before the park reopens again to public use and beach access. He said the contractors haven't completed the job yet and still have to hydro seed the creek, grade the parking lot and then plant grass. This past summer and spring \$1.5 million worth of work was done at the park. This includes construction of a 300 foot long underground concrete culvert which was installed to stabilize the water level in Garrison Lake at fourteen and a half feet. Water will only flow through the culvert when the lake level rises about that level or so they say.

Laskey Clifton the contractor on the job has nearly completed a "constructed creek" which leads from the end of the culvert to where the original outlet creek was located. They have used concrete matting as well as rock gabions to stabilize the sides of the creek.

When the park reopens the beach access will be via the new trail that was put in a few years ago. This time we'll wait for official word from Frank Eckley before printing anything. Direct access along the road to the bluff area will continue to be blocked off to the public until it has been stabilized.

There are no more of the original buildings left at what used to be Agate Beach Trailer Park before Oregon State Parks acquired it. The last one which was where the showers were located was torn down this summer.

Eckley says that this winter will be a learning experience for state parks at Tseriadun State Park.

Access to the park is currently blocked off with a fence and Danger signs. Soon enough we'll be able to drive or walk or bicycle in and enjoy this park.

### Bandon Wave Energy Project

The Port Orford Ocean Resources Team hosted Kevin Bannister from Finavera Renewables last Thursday for an informal meeting and question and answer session about the wave energy projects his company is working on. Finavera is headquartered in Vancouver, British Columbia and is a publicly traded company on the Canadian stock market (its 170 million shares of stock

were selling at 43 cents a share last week). They are mainly involved in wind energy at this point. Finavera has installed a test wave energy buoy off the coast at Newport. Bannister said the 75 foot long test buoy was to see how much energy they could create with this project but at this point is producing no electricity, just information about potential energy output.

The wave energy buoys are vertically installed and look like a rocket with a space capsule on top. They will be "fastened" to the ocean floor with four anchors and very thick cables. The company is looking at flat soft bottom areas because of the ease of anchoring them as opposed to rocky bottoms. They have a preliminary permit for a site off of Two Mile Creek in Bandon where the company is considering putting in a wave energy park. The preliminary permit expires in April 2008 but Bannister said the company would need more time. The project could eventually contain 400 buoys and would take up two and a half square miles of the ocean within the three mile zone. Bannister said placing four buoys together would take up an area 600' by 240'. Finavera chose the Bandon site to explore wave energy because of its proximity to the Two Mile Bonneville Substation.

Fishing would not be allowed in the wave energy project areas.

Bannister was asked about the effect of the electro magnetic fields the wave parks would produce and he said it was something they need to watch. He was optimistic it wasn't going to be a problem.

The company is in the very early process of certifying the Bandon site for a wave energy park. They are working with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to get licensing for this project. The company has issued an intent to pursue the license. When it gets further along there will be well publicized formal public meetings where people can speak, express their opinions and ask questions. If they are like the Port Orford meeting there will be many questions.

The fishing community was represented at the Port Orford meeting and had plenty of questions including mitigation if a two and a half square mile area were taken out of use by fishermen. Bannister

spoke about the lease fees to the state going to a fund for displaced fishermen. The company will be bonded for enough money that if any of the buoys breaks free and causes damage and needs to be removed there will be money to pay for it and also money to remove the whole project down the line if that becomes necessary. Bannister estimated it would take 2-3 years after the give notice of intent before the wave energy park construction is completed.

The wave energy projects up and down the coast include two in Coos Bay, and others in Florence, Newport, and Gardiner. They are part of Governor Kulongoski's push for reliance on more renewable energy including wave, wind and solar. Hydroelectric is not considered in the renewable equation. The wave energy projects are also coming along at a time when the Governor is pushing for a series of marine reserves along the Oregon coast.

### Smith Supports Copper Salmon

Trout Unlimited and local sportsmen congratulated U.S. Sen. Gordon Smith for signing onto a sportsmen-initiated bill that would create the Copper-Salmon Wilderness and forever protect the headwaters of the prized Elk River from development.

Smith joins U.S. Sen. Ron Wyden and U.S. Rep. Peter DeFazio in their efforts to keep intact the headwater habitat in the Elk River that is so important to spawning salmon and steelhead in the coastal Oregon river system. Because that habitat is still intact, the Elk is arguably one of the best remaining coastal salmon and steelhead streams in the Northwest. The Copper-Salmon Wilderness bill would set aside over 13,000 acres of headwater habitat that is vital to ocean-going fish. The land is also valuable to black-tailed deer, black bears, mountain lions and a host of coastal forest wildlife.

“With Sen. Smith signing onto the Copper-Salmon Wilderness bill as a co-sponsor with Sen. Wyden, it once again shows how these two men set aside political differences and work together in the spirit of bi-partisanship for the best of Oregon,” said Mike Beagle, the Pacific Northwest field coordinator for Trout Unlimited’s Public Lands Initiative. “Thanks to their efforts, Oregonians generations from now will be able to fish for salmon and steelhead in the Elk River.”

The focus of our articles thus far has been on the play we are producing. Hopefully everyone knows by now that *Sylvia* opens October 12 and runs through October 21. So, we decided to devote this article to answering some of the questions that we are frequently asked.

Many people expect a traditional proscenium stage when they come into our space. Surprise! We are what is commonly called a "black box theatre". The black box theatre is a simple, somewhat unadorned performance space, usually a large square room with black walls (ours are midnight blue) and a flat floor. Such spaces are easily built and maintained, and are usually home to plays with very basic technical arrangements, such as limited sets, simple lighting effects, and an intimate focus on the story, writing, and performances rather than technical elements. The seating is typically composed of loose chairs on platforms, which can be easily moved or removed to allow the entire space to be adapted to the artistic elements of a production. The black box is considered by many to be a place where more "pure" theatre can be explored, with the most human and least technical elements being in focus. We are often asked if we will be holding auditions for our plays - the answer is yes, and no. Theatre 101 is a company of actors. There are 8 of us

and from that group we can cast most of the plays we want to do. However, from time to time we will need someone to fill a specialty part, or small parts, and we will hold open auditions. Anyone who is interested in auditioning can also let us know in advance and we will contact you directly. Otherwise, watch the papers!

How often will we be producing plays? Our goal at this point is to produce three or four plays a year. We plan to fill the "dark time" (a time when the theatre is not being used to produce a play) with music events, variety shows, and other types of performance art. We are open to suggestions, so let us know if there is something you'd like to see or do.



OLPC (One laptop per child) was founded by Nicholas Negroponte to provide children around the world with new opportunities to explore, experiment and express themselves. Most of the nearly 2,000,000,000 children in the world are inadequately educated or receive no education at all. One in three does not complete grade five. The team put together by Negroponte decided to try to do something about it by following a different path. They wanted to develop a cheap, lightweight, rugged, durable, yet powerful computer that children could use to learn, to explore, and to express themselves. Ideally they wanted to be able to make it available for \$100. They weren't able to get the price down that low but they did create an outstanding innovative computer.

The computer includes an 80+ key keyboard, a gamepad with 2 sets of four-direction cursor-control keys, a touchpad, speakers and microphone, wireless networking including mesh networking, and a 640x480 video camera.
