Jubilee Schedule on the Way By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford July 4 Jubilee schedules are being printed and will be distributed by later this week or early next week. This year's Jubilee is a three day affair with July 4 falling on a Friday which makes it convenient for people to turn this into a long weekend in Port Orford.

One of the highlights of the July 4 weekend will be the opening of our new Port Orford Public Library on Saturday July 5. We've all been following the progress of the library construction as it is in a very visible and prominent place in town at the corner of Fifteenth Street and Highway 101. Major construction is now complete on the new library. The parking lot in back of the building was paved on Friday and the gutters were being installed on Tuesday of this week. Now one of the few jobs left remaining is the landscaping in front of the building and on the side. The library has hired Paul Prosch-Jensen (Estate Landscape and Associates) to do the landscaping. He is a Port Orford resident with many years experience in the landscaping business and according to his wife Alisa we're in for a real treat with the library landscaping. No, it won't be a dull lawn. The library grand opening will be held from 1:00-5:00pm and include a ribbon

cutting ceremony and tours. You won't want to miss this one as the building is truly spectacular and a huge boost for a town full of empty business buildings, for sale signs, and controversies.

The Jubilee starts out on July 4 morning with the sandcastle sculpture contest at Dock Beach, better known as Port Orford's dog beach. The Rotary Club pancake breakfast takes place from 7:00-11:00am at Driftwood School.

The Jubilee Parade is always one of centerpieces of the holiday and it takes place at 11:00am along Highway 101 starting at Port Orford City Hall. Participants are asked to be in the parade line for judging by 10:00am. The theme of this year's parade is "Another Day in Paradise". You can fill out an entry form to participate in the parade through June 27 and turn the forms back in at the Liquor Store, Finch's Custom Jewelry, The Downtown Fun Zone, Chetco Federal Credit Union and Sterling Savings Bank.

Later on that afternoon the Jerry Can Races take place at the Coast Guard Museum atop Coast Guard Hill at 2:00pm while over at Buffington Park there will be skateboarding demonstrations at the newly improved skate park. A new event this year is the Nash Memorial Duck Race starting at the Elk River Fish

Hatchery at 2:30pm. The goal is for the ducks to make their way to the mouth of the Elk River. This sounds like a fun one to me and I've even got a few rubber ducks.

The other E ticket event on July 4 is the fireworks at Battle Rock Park beginning at dusk or close to 10:00pm.

On Saturday July 5 you can enjoy the Beachcombers Pancake Breakfast from 8:00am-11:00am. The Beachcomber's Cove is located off Highway 101 at Milepost 298 and is the home of the Beachcombers Square Dance Club. Photo day displays and driftwood art are featured for a second day at the make-shift art gallery at 755 Highway 101.

The ever popular pet show takes place on Saturday afternoon from 2:00—4:30pm at 545 Tenth Street. This fun time is sponsored by Pampered Pooches dog grooming.

There are even more events on Sunday to round out the weekend with a horse exhibition and riding competition at the Wilbur Green Horse Arena in Buffington Park from 10:00am-2:00pm. Over at Red's Field in another part of Buffington Park the Coast Little League hosts food and games for the community from noon – 2:00pm.

Planning Commission Meets

The City of Port Orford Planning Commission meets on Tuesday night, June 10, 5:00pm and continues a hearing on granting a modification of a conditional use permit to US Cellular to build a 90 foot tower on Coast Guard Hill. Consultants acting on behalf of US Cellular will present additional information regarding the company's request for the modification of their conditional use permit. This will open up the public hearing again allowing for testimony from interested parties. US Cellular claims they need a new 90 foot cell tower to improve cell phone service in Port Orford. Let's face we live in a Wi-Fi, cell phone world now.

Free Fishing Weekend

Elk River Fish Hatchery will host the 13th annual Free Fishing Weekend event on Saturday and Sunday, June 7th and 8th, 2008. Each fishing day will begin at about 8:00 am. Young anglers will be allowed to fish for rainbow trout in a special hatchery pond that is stocked with 800 legal size fish (8-12 inches) and 350 whoppers that will weigh from 4-8 pounds each. The hatchery will provide rods, reels, bait and tackle for the kids to fish with. The bag limit is the first three fish caught. There will be no "catch and release", so please bring a large plastic bag to carry your catch home.

The event is limited to the first 100 children 10 years old and younger that sign up in person on each day (100 for Saturday and 100 for Sunday). Sign ups will not be carried over from one day to the next. Upon sign-up, participants will be advised of the approximate time when it will be their turn to fish. To provide a more quality fishing experience we will only fish two kids at a time. Each young angler will be welcome to fish on one day only (either Saturday or Sunday, but

not both). The event will be held rain or shine, so be ready for the weather. Each child on the sign up sheet will receive a free starter kit (hooks, sinkers, lure and bobber). Additional prizes will be given away, including mail boat trips, rods and reels, a fully stocked tackle box and much more. This event is provided free of charge, so we ask for your cheerful acceptance of our efforts. For more information, contact the hatchery prior to June 7th at 541-332-7025. 
It is with great pleasure that the 2008 Port Orford Jubilee announces its choice for this year’s Grand Marshals. Congratulations to Alan and Brenda Mitchell!

Alan and Brenda have lived in Port Orford for almost 40 years. Their contributions to this community over the years are numerous. They have been extremely generous with their time, energy, and resources. Time and time again, they have demonstrated their unflinching dedication in helping to build a better community.

Let’s start with Brenda’s career as a teacher for the Port Orford School District. As enrollment fluctuated, Brenda taught various grades and transferred from location to location as the need arose. She also taught twenty years at Ophir Elementary. Her service in the field of education spanned thirty years. To give girls an after school activity Brenda taught 4-H cooking in her home for several years. While teaching, Brenda also served 10 years on the Port Orford Library Board and held several offices in the Back Acres Garden Club.

Brenda decided the coast was the perfect place to own a horse. Before you could say “giddy up!” Alan and Brenda joined up with Jim & Bev Crose to organize and build the riding arena in Buffington Park. Hard work and dedication to community improvements would become a trademark often associated with the Mitchells.

Alan served as secretary of the Port Orford Volunteer Fire Department for 10 years. He also served on the city and county planning commissions, as well as the City’s Lodging Tax and budget committees. In 1973, Alan initiated communications between then-Mayor Leon White and the Robert Gable Family in Kentucky; his hard work resulted in the community to obtaining the funds

necessary to complete the construction of the City Council Chambers in 1975.

As charter members of the Humbug Mountain Committee, Alan and Brenda can take credit for what has now become the Port Orford Arts Council.

Alan worked with the city and the port to help obtain a 100% grant to both replace a failing water tank on Coast Guard Hill and provide water for the Cannery’s hydraulic shrimp picking machine.

Alan obtained the financing for and then served on the committee that developed Oregon’s first Comprehensive Plan – The Port Orford Plan of 1977. While working on that he also spearheaded the fundraising of the \$2,000 needed to get the necessary equipment to bring Public Broadcasting TV and radio into Port Orford .

In 1974 Alan utilized a considerable amount of his time and talent to bring national attention for our port’s sanding-in problem. Before it was over, we had a story on the front page of the Wall Street Journal, and CBS News was in town to report on the first ever town meeting with the Army Corps of Engineers.

Alan’s knowledge and photograph collection of Port Orford makes him a wealth of valuable information and an esteemed town historian. If only we could set him on a reference shelf of the new library!

The Mitchells are also owner-builders. For instance they built and operate one of Oregon’s original Bed and Breakfasts - Home by the Sea where they offer a Wi-Fi hot spot for anyone needing Internet access. And Alan has created a unique website showcasing Port Orford, one that has a live webcam looking down our ever changing Battle Rock Beach. The website (www.homebythesea.com) is a great treat for people worldwide and attracts people to Port Orford. As an example, Rockne Berge, the Castaway Motel manager, reports that many of their valley guests always check Alan’s webcam before making plans to come to the Coast.

Alan and Brenda are gearing up for their next adventure, which will take them to Vancouver, Washington. When they drive away from Home by the Sea for the last time, they will be leaving a legacy of incalculable acts of generosity and community spirit.

Letter to the Editor,

On Wednesday, May 28, I was prepared to give a workshop on composting at the Port Orford Educational Demonstration Garden, but nobody showed up. I was head-droopingly disappointed and loaded my workshop teaching aides back into my truck for the drive back home. I had to sort out my disappointment on that drive. Was it that I didn't get to teach... I love to teach, I love to share my gardening knowledge, was it an anti-climactical aching in me that I had spent time in preparation and my own letdown that no one partook in my planned hour of good, solid compost information? Did everyone in Curry County already know everything they need to know about making it that compost? Or was it my own hurt feelings that gardeners don't quite get it that compost is the food for the soil (!) and it's free for the making?

The prunings and snippings from our yards that we send to the landfill (via the transfer station), the grass clippings and the scraps from our plates can become, with almost no work at all, the vital humusy compost that we need to grow our plants. The beautiful and productive demonstration garden behind the Senior



Late Bloomer Grants

Applications are now available for the 6th annual Late Bloomer Grants sponsored by the Brookings Harbor Festival of the Arts. The purpose of the grant program is to encourage older individuals to reach their artistic potential by assisting them in developing their creative skills. This could include taking classes, seminars, obtaining supplies, etc. Grants are awarded for the development of skills rather than to produce a product. There is no financial need criteria. All creative artistic fields are eligible, including but not limited to, fine art, photography, woodwork, sculpting, pottery, writing, poetry, metal work, music, etc.

To be eligible for a grant an applicant must be age 50 or above and be a resident of Brookings, Harbor, or the larger area extending south to Crescent City, north to Port Orford and east to Gasquet. The applicant must demonstrate talent in a relatively new artistic field, and document how the grant will assist in the development of that talent.

The Festival of the Arts, an independent, nonprofit volunteer organization, will award up to a total of \$1,000 in grant




Port Orford Weather Statistics
