### Library Says No to Bond By Evan Kramer

First for the big news of the day. The Port Orford Public Library Board voted at their meeting on Monday night, June 9, not to issue the bond for the new library. This had been approved by voters in the library district last year by a 53-47% margin. Though the bond wasn't for a lot of money it enabled the library board to put construction of the new library out to bid and get started. The results are there to see at Fifteenth and Highway 101 and in less than one month the bond free library will be open to the public. Now how many taxing agencies have you ever heard of which got a bond issue passed and then didn't collect on it? But the library board and librarian Tobe Porter pledged at the time of the bond issue election if they could get enough grants or other monies they wouldn't collect on the bond and they were true to their word.

### Chamber Notes

The Port Orford and North Curry County Chamber of Commerce board held their monthly meeting at the Paradise Café on Monday. The board holds their meetings on the second Tuesday of each month at 1:00pm and alternates between the Paradise Café and the Port and Starboard Restaurant.

New Chamber member Ken Stevens introduced himself to the Chamber members. He is a guitarist and engineer and runs a business called Battle Rock Studios. He makes what he calls Battle Rock Studio Blocks. These are Myrtlewood blocks that stereo speakers are placed on with brass feet connecting the speakers to the blocks. The studio blocks make for much better sound according to Ken. He has been playing the guitar for 42 years and doing studio recording for 20 years. He does voiceovers and will do the voice over work for the Theater 101 production of Steel Magnolias.

Alicia Billings, Project Director for the Port Orford Ocean Resources Team, and Chamber web master spoke about next week's POORT events in Port Orford. They will hold a series of events on June 17 and June 18 beginning with a reception for 60 invited guests on Wednesday. They are participating in the launching of the Port Orford Stewardship marine area. The next day there will be a series of seminars at the Community Building on marine stewardship themes and these will be open to the public to attend.

Cindy Schaumburg reported on problems in the Oregon wool industry. Pendleton Woolen Mills has transferred the manufacture of their garments to Mexico and

is not buying wool in Curry County anymore. Schaumburg and her partner just opened the Wild Rivers Wool Factory Outlet in Langlois across the street from the Langlois Market. Schaumburg was able to buy 100 pounds of wool from a sheep rancher in Pistol River which she will use in her store. Stop by to see the store and Oregon wool being made into a variety of things.

The Chamber raised \$455.00 at their barbecue in Buffington Park the day before Memorial Day as a fundraiser and after expenses will donate \$240 to the Pacific Wind Rider's Association.

### SMART Fundraiser

Highway 101 and Sixteenth Streets and will serve a variety of foods from pizza to bagels, soup and sandwiches and espresso and coffee. Between the library opening up on July 5 and the Hard Rain Café in two weeks there is good news to report though I'm very disappointed to see that Creighton Plants is going out of business on June 30.

**Stewardship Area Launch**

Port Orford Ocean Resource Team is moving forward with plans to establish a "Stewardship Area" that will encompass local fishing grounds and adjacent watersheds. The overarching purpose is to preserve the biological integrity of local marine resources, while supporting and promoting sustainable fisheries. POORT is launching the Stewardship Area at a meeting with state agencies, federal agencies, and NGO's at the Community Building on June 18, 8:30am-3:30pm. "We want to share information about our work with the agencies and others

working in the Stewardship Area and communicate with project leaders," said Leesa Cobb, POORT Director. In addition to a discussion about POORT projects, twelve projects within the Stewardship Area will be highlighted with presentations by the project leaders. A question and answer session will follow the presentations. The public is welcome to attend this meeting.

The process of establishing a stewardship area began nearly two years ago during a series of public meetings with fishermen, community leaders, and other stakeholders. Participants recognized that existing state and federal management could be greatly enhanced through engaging local residents in collaborative science, development of local management proposals, and watershed stewardship.

Stewardship area planning is embracing an ecosystem-based approach that prioritizes the sustainability of the entire nearshore system, including the resource users that are dependent upon

it. The process is focused on integrating local knowledge to manage the marine environment at a finer scale that makes more sense for the community.

Stewardship area planning has also benefited from strategic partnerships that provide support for community process. Project partners include Pacific Marine Conservation Council, Surfrider Foundation, Ecotrust, and Golden Marine Consulting. Engagement of these organizations is at the invitation of the POORT Board, and these groups add critical capacity for the process with respect to science, policy, and community organizing.

The plan for a Community Stewardship Area represents an unprecedented approach to managing marine resources. Through engaging fleet and community participation, the hope is to achieve an improved management scheme that will sustain and enhance traditional fisheries and the nearshore ecosystem, while avoiding the boom-and-bust cycle that has plagued Port Orford and other fishing dependent communities in the past.

05-30 Police stopped a second vehicle for a minor traffic violation. The driver was cited for possession of controlled substance marijuana.


05-31 A citizen turned in a wallet. The owner was located and the wallet returned.

Chiefs Note: The Port Orford Police Department currently has six sworn Reserve Police Officers who volunteer their time to help protect our community. Reserve officers are not paid for their time, and generally assist certified police officers by riding with them in patrol units, driving solo or in a two man reserve unit. They can assist officers to answer emergency calls for service, to render aid, to make arrests, to write traffic citations, to follow-up cases, and testify in court. These reserve police officers wear the same uniform,

wear the same badge, and have the same authority of a regular certified police officer while on duty only. Additionally a reserve officer must complete hundreds of hours of specialized training, and half of our reserve officers have additionally completed a Law Enforcement Police Reserve Academy. These same officers attend the same in-service training as the certified police officers do and must maintain minimum yearly training standards to maintain their Police Reserve status. Additionally the Port Orford Police Department holds all reserve police officers to the same standard of conduct as a certified police officer. I would like to thank all our officers for all the hard work they do for our community.

### The Avenger By Lou Mincer

Thirty five years ago, Iceland, one of the poorest countries in Europe, was importing ¾'s of its coal and oil. Successive far-seeing governments, employing new energy improvisations, have since achieved complete energy independence for Iceland, along with a thriving economy. Now the fourth most affluent nation.

Our own American Midwest winds are comparable in velocity to those of the Saudi Arabian desert.

It has been estimated that if 19% of the barren Midwest desert was overlaid with an array of photovoltaic solar cells it would furnish all the nation's electrical requirements without any further need of individual rooftop installations as an accessory crutch. These two vast regions of the world are host to the most powerful winds on Earth.

Much of the attributes of renewable energy research and analysis has been extensively discussed in great depth of various occasions and venues by Robert Kennedy Jr., an ardent and dedicated environmentalist who has elevated much of his career in the field of renewable energy and conservation. As a consequence of his solar expertise, he has become an advocate and proponent of a concept he characterizes as direct current (DC) a coast to coast energy grid fuelled by solar energy. Sounds impressive and

yet, in a sense, puzzling insofar as why we have been derelict in achieving such noteworthy energy independence.

Robert Kennedy Jr.'s vision rivals that of Thomas Edison, who in the distant past, 127 years ago, after inventing the light bulb, contrived a method of producing clean energy. His concept was premised on a small localized generator under the control of the individual user of the generated electricity. The unit being powered by windmills. Present day fuel cells, turbines and flywheels are the micro power of the future, having the potential of making oil obsolete. Kennedy has taken up where Edison left off. Others are now clamoring the alternative energy express and in their procession of wannabes are some industrial heavyweights such as California Pacific Gas and Electric Utility seeking 500 megawatts of solar power and options for another 400 megawatts. In total enough energy to power 300,000 homes. This

**Letter to the Editor,**

I would like to label this editorial an attempt at prevention and reasonableness versus the usual consternation and tension the community has witnessed the last few months between the police department and a few councilmen. As the police department is requesting a move to the vacated library next month, I would ask the Council to approve this request and let us remodel, pack our things up and move. Our office is so cramped we have not an inch of space to spare let alone find any room for storage, evidence or found property. The boxes are piling up and soon I will be putting them out in the hallway. There is nowhere to conduct suspect or witness interviews and trying to find privacy when talking to a victim of abuse is impossible. We also make this little office available to other agencies if they need a place to make phone calls or write reports and if our officers are on duty and in the office there is nowhere for them to work. If all employees are in the office together and even one reserve officer comes in it is nearly impossible to converse on the phone, move around or concentrate on matters at hand. The library area will not only provide us with the needed extra space but is being designed to include a large conference room for use by the City and other agencies and departments. Finally, it will also free up our current space and make more room

## Ruth Elliott



### Storm Drain Education By Rachel Moore

Ms. Nye's Driftwood science students and the Port Orford Ocean Resource Team are bringing educational placards to a storm drain near you! Thanks to the enthusiasm of the City of Port Orford, the Port of Port Orford, and the Oregon Dept. of Transportation you might have seen students hard at work in your neighborhood. Keep your eyes out to see if you live in the drainage to Battle Rock Beach or to Garrison Lake. Storm drain marking was part of Driftwood's ongoing science project of monitoring Garrison Lake water quality.

Water molecules are very strong and can carry hitchhikers such as pollution. Small towns like Port Orford face similar "urban run-off" problems as a truly urban city like Portland. Oil and grease from cars run off impervious surfaces like concrete and enter the storm drain system. Excess lawn fertilizers and domestic animal waste with harmful bacteria also end up in storm drains. This contaminated storm water is flushed directly into Garrison Lake and eventually into our Nearshore marine habitats like tidepools and kelp forests.



They are Coos Curry Electric Co-op board member and building contractor Dave Kitchen for position #3. Auto dismantler and general contractor Larry C. Restininzi has filed for position #2 and Larry Molliers, a retired state forestry and Coos Forest Patrol employee, has filed for position #3.


128 valid signatures are required to place the potential candidates on the November 4, 2008 general election ballot. The signatures must be verified and perfected petitions filed no later than August 26.

Candidates were chosen by the Democrats and Republicans in their party's primary election this past May. These

three candidates are "unaffiliated" with either party. George Rhodes and Pat Piper were nominated for position #2 and Bill Waddle and Steve Nagel for position #3 in the May primary.

### State Ballot Measures

Oregon voters overwhelmingly approved state ballot measures 51 and 52 by nearly 3-1 margins. These two ballot measures give more rights to crime victims. Ballot Measure 53 was approved by the voters but by a razor thin margin. There were 488,226 votes in favor of Ballot Measure 53 for a 50.04% total while 487,367 voters said no to the measure for a percentage of 49.96%. Ballot Measure 53 amends the Oregon Constitution and modifies provisions governing civil forfeitures related to crimes; and permits use of proceeds by law enforcement. Ballot Measure 53 was soundly rejected in Curry County by a 56.35 to 43.65 margin and in other rural counties but won in the more densely populated parts of the state, reminding us once again that there are two different Oregons.

**Lavender Cookbook**

Sherri' Merritt, owner of Merritt Lavender Farm in Bandon and known locally as "The Lavender Lady," will offer a presentation on cooking with lavender at 11am this Sunday, June 15 at Gold Beach Books. Afterwards, she'll autograph copies of her new book, The Lavender Harvest, a companion to her earlier volume, The Lavender Lady Cooks.

Merritt's latest book is a guide to the planting, growing and harvesting of lavender, and includes instructions for lavender projects, as well as new recipes. Among many other aspects of lavender cultivation, the book covers feeding and pruning, as well as organic weed control. Merritt has also included chapters explaining how to make wreath jigs, wands and scarecrows out of lavender.

Lavender is typically considered an aromatic, decorative flower, but has actually been a culinary ingredient for centuries, particularly among French chefs. A Mediterranean herb, lavender is a member of the mint family and has been touted by some for its medicinal properties.

When she "discovered another way to live," upon moving to Bandon after working in the big city corporate world, Merritt began her organic lavender farm, which currently offers 800 plants from four different hybrid varieties. In addition to growing lavender, she also started to experiment with it in cooking and soon produced many lavender-inspired recipes, including ones from the kitchens of friends and family, which together constitute her cookbook.

Harvest season for lavender is just beginning and runs through October; in the past, the harvest scent has caused small planes to buzz her farm's fields to experience the pleasant cloud of lavender aroma.




