Eco Day Camp

Here's to our local McNair's True Value Hardware store for donating 5 gallon buckets for Port Orford's Eco Day Camp sponsored by the South Coast and Lower Rogue Watershed Councils.

The buckets were used to sort garbage, learning what can be reduced, reused, or recycled. We also used buckets to make worm farms, minimizing the food scrapes we dump in our garbage, and turning it into rich soil for our gardens. The buckets came in handy as we picked up trash in our local park on our way over to the nature trail, where we learned what lives beneath the surface of the ground. We examined a decomposing log, heard a tale about what a shrew's life might be like tunneling through the forest, and used a soil probe to examine the different layers of soil.

Back at the A-Frame we created many useful items including fish printed re-

usable canvas bags, horns made out of bull kelp; which we painted, we also decorated rocks for our gardens. A big attraction was the 16 foot long stream trailer, where we learned about a watershed, and how our behaviors can affect water quality in our rivers, streams, which eventually drain into the ocean. We talked about the amazing Salmon Life Cycle and how important fresh, clean water is to their survival.

Our last day of camp was spent up in our local watershed, the Elk River. Camp participants invited siblings, parents, grandparents, and even our bus driver joined in the activities. We caught aquatic insects in the river, and learned how they tell us about the health of our watershed. We then took a stroll up the road, and using our senses, we noticed the environment of a healthy watershed.

Wholesale Power

Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) representative Rod Aho conducted a workshop last Friday on the process utilities and ratepayers have used to define the energy picture post 2011 and the structure of the new BPA contracts at the Coos Curry Electric Co-op board meeting.

Aho began with a general description of BPA's role in the region. "BPA has a statutory obligation to serve the net requirement of public power entities in the region," he said. As a consumer-owned cooperative, CCEC has the right to purchase BPA power. "The only question is at what rate," Aho continued. The BPA cannot own generation; they sell the power generated at 31 hydroelectric dams and a nuclear plant that were built and are operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Bureau of Reclamation. In addition, the BPA owns the majority of the transmission system that is used to move power from generating stations to an individual utility's distribution system. As such, the BPA plays a major role in the price and reliability of the wholesale power public power utilities purchase for their consumers.

In providing background, Aho described the "regional dialogue" process the region has been engaged in for the past six years to determine a way to divide the low-cost power BPA supplies in the new contract period beginning 2011. "In these discussions, some people did not want the BPA's footprint to grow while others wanted BPA to have the ability to acquire new resources on their behalf," Aho explained. "We believe we have reached a compromise that is acceptable to our customers in the Pacific Northwest and policy-makers in Washington, DC."

In describing the compromise, Aho explained that BPA cannot own generation. Their statutory authority only allows them to buy generation output for their customers. The power is sold at cost, not at market rates; a significant difference in the way power is sold in most places. In the new 20- year contracts, BPA will divide, or allocate the system under a tiered structure, which Aho described as an accounting procedure where Tier 1 is the existing system and Tier 2 becomes the additional resources BPA has to require to meet load. "That's different than today where BPA blends the cost

of new, often more expensive resources with the low-cost federal system already in place to keep costs down," General Manager/CEO Roger Meader added. While the new contract period is 20 years, BPA will have a rate case to determine rates under the contract every two years. BPA has no requirement to purchase renewable energy; but Aho indicated they would work with individual utility customers to make sure each is meeting state renewable energy portfolio requirements. CCEC must have 5 percent of its total load in renewable energy, which by definition does not include hydropower, by 2025.

Wholesale power supply will be a topic of discussion at the next Town Hall meeting to be held July 3rd at 7:00 p.m. in the cooperative's Port Orford office.

Edward Arthur Hinkle

Edward Arthur Hinkle, 81, a resident of the Port Orford, Oregon community died June 20, 2008 while hospitalized after a fall at home. Ed was born July 21, 1926 in Jacksonville, Oregon where he grew up and graduated from high school (his diploma was awarded to him after World War II). In July 1943, just following his 17th birthday Ed enlisted into the United States Navy and went to Farragut, Idaho for boot camp.

He was assigned following boot training to Camp Pendleton near San Diego, California for training as a Hospital Corpsman. Following his medical training Ed was reassigned to Hawaii for troop training prior to the invasion of the Japanese held islands in the Pacific. Ed was reassigned to the Headquarters Company, 27th Regiment, 5th Marine Division and served March 26, 1945; he was wounded during the invasion. After the end of the war, Ed saw service as part of the Japanese island occupation force in Sapporo, Japan and later in Puerto Rico until he ended his service in 1947.

Ed was involved in many activities related to young people as a Scout Master in the Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, and Explorers, as well as, a leader in the Sea Scouts. Ed was considered an adviser, mentor and friend to all who knew him. He had wonderful sense of humor, was honest in his dealings with

everyone, and demonstrated work ethics that were part of his generation. Ed was also a member of the Southern Oregon Iwo Jima Association, Odd Fellows Lodges and the American Legion.

Ed worked for Cascade Wood Products for 27 years, retiring in 1981 and moved to the ocean, in 1998, that he so loved in Port Orford. Ed is preceded in death by his brothers Ernie Hinkle and Robert Doty, and grandson Edward C. Hinkle.

Ed is survived by his children William Hinkle of Santa Cruz, CA, Janie Hinkle Clayton of Portland, OR, Linda Nelson of Port Orford, OR, and Daniel Hinkle of Eagle Point, OR; 15 grandchildren

Edward Lear and Lewis Carroll come to mind.” The contest’s intent, according to Champneys, was to help people feel comfortable expressing themselves poetically in a time when poetry seems difficult or removed.



Home Rule Charter Proposed

A group of people from the Brookings/Harbor area of Curry County have filed a prospective petition for a home rule charter in Curry County. The chief petitioner is Ralph W. Martin. They are attempting to get this petition on the November general election ballot but need to gather a certain amount of signatures first.

Key differences if the home rule charter passed in Curry County would be that the county government would be composed of five non partisan elected commissioners who would not be full time paid county employees. Instead the county would be run by a full time county manager or administrator. There would be five geographical districts in the county including one the Port Orford-Langlois School District (excluding that area within Coos County). The boundaries for three of other districts would also correspond to the school districts in those areas. There would also be one district composed of all of Curry County.


