Election Results

Both Measures 66 and 67 won decisive victories in last Tuesday's special election. OF the 2,053,204 voters in Oregon 1,272,855 or 61.99% voted in Tuesday's election. State ballot measure 66 garnered 688,049 (54.28%) votes with 579,538 (45.72%) no votes. Measure 67 won with 678,132 yes votes (53.60%) to 586,964 votes (46.40%) statewide but the story was different in Curry, Coos and other rural counties. Coos County voters turned down Measure 66 (raises tax on household income at or above \$250,000 (and \$125,000 for individual filers) by a 52.68 to 47.32 margin. They also turned down Measure 67 (raised the corporate minimum tax, and corporate profits tax) by a margin of 53.43 to 46.57.

Curry County voters voted down Measure 66 by a 58.13% to 41.87% margin while also defeating Measure 67 by a 58.57 to 41.43% margin. Curry County voters have said it over and over they don't want additional taxes.

Urban Renewal Meeting

The City of Port Orford held a joint urban renewal workshop meeting of the city council and the planning commission last Friday afternoon. The purpose

of the public meeting was to learn about and discuss urban renewal. The city had invited three speakers to the meeting including Kate Porsche, the Urban Renewal Manager for the City of Albany, Gary Milliman, City Manager of Brookings, and Ellen Barnes, City Manager of Gold Beach.

Kate Porsche gave a lengthy overview of how the City of Albany came to get an urban renewal district and the effect it has had on the city and brought along a power point presentation with many photos which had a strong effect.

For a city to develop an urban renewal plan there are many steps that go into it from creating the plan, drafting an urban renewal report, going through the procedural requirements for adoption of an urban renewal plan which includes public notification, reviews and public hearings. This process would take at least one year to complete. An urban renewal district should be considered to have blight which can mean anything from unfit or unsafe structures, to property value depreciation to underutilized property. The city would have to establish that there is blight within its urban renewal district.

Porsche explained how an urban renewal district generates money for the

city and the main point is that property taxes are not raised. When a city incorporates an urban renewal district into its city it "freezes" the tax base at that time. Then the increase in assessed valuation and thus taxes caused by any improvement whether they be new construction or remodeling within the urban renewal district goes to the urban renewal district funds. If you have a home or business in an urban renewal zone and improve your property and the property taxes go up the increase in the assessed value goes to the urban renewal district fund. Because of this the various special districts would all have to agree to this including the Port of Port Orford, Library District, Cemetery District, Curry Health District, and the Rural Fire District. The special districts would have to give up any increases within the urban renewal zone in their tax level for the life of the urban renewal district other than the 3% they are allowed. Porsche couldn't emphasize enough that an urban renewal district will not result in any new taxes to city property owners.

Porsche said that public involvement is critical to an urban renewal district as is the partnership with the special taxing districts. They would need to be shown that the improvements within the

urban renewal zone would benefit them in the long run. Urban renewal districts can constitute no more than 25% of the city's land mass.

Urban renewal money in Albany has been used to provide grants to small business to remodel and rehab their buildings including the local theaters as well as several buildings with vacant second stories. Money can be used for façade improvement, street furniture and sidewalks.

Gary Milliman spoke next and his city holds the distinction of being the city in Curry County with an established Urban Renewal District. Brookings has used its urban renewal money for help paying for infrastructure improvements as well as paying for improvements to private property. Brookings has opted for a seven person urban renewal advisory committee not composed of the city council. Their urban renewal district is the Highway 101 corridor through town. They have used some of the money to pay for

façade improvements to buildings along Highway 101 and are now working on a 3.1 million dollar improvement to Spruce Street which is one block west of Chetco Avenue (Highway 101). Work will include putting the utilities underground, sidewalks and street furniture.

Councilor John Hewitt commented towards the end of the meeting that it was obvious we needed an urban renewal district. Councilor Caroline Clancy advocated that the money raised through tax increments be used for replacing the City's deteriorating water delivery system. Later on Mayor Jim Auburn said that urban renewal money couldn't be used for replacing the water system. One of the rules governing the urban renewal districts and funding is that all money's the city collects from within the urban renewal district has to be used on projects within that district although there is an exception if the city could show direct benefits for the area outside the urban renewal district.

Don't Feed the Wildlife

One of the lessons to be learned from the relocation of Mr. Turkey from Port Orford to the area near Agness is don't feed the wildlife. That was the main message from Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife employee Curtis Edwards. He works out of the Gold Beach office of the ODF&W and it was their responsibility to relocate Mr. Turkey. He said the big male turkey was moved out of Port Orford due to complaints (at least four) from local citizens that he had gotten aggressive towards them. Edwards said people need to quit feeding wildlife. He said it causes disease problems and can become a safety issue. He couldn't emphasize the point enough about not feeding the wild turkeys, squirrels, raccoons, deer, bear and other animals. Once they start getting fed by people they become used to it and then expect it. That's where many of the problems come in like the turkey getting aggressive with people. Enjoy the wildlife, take photos of them but don't domesticate them by feeding them.

High School Teacher Arrested

On January 29, 2010, the Curry County Sheriff’s Office concluded a week long investigation into alleged misconduct occurring by a high teacher at Pacific High School in Port Orford.

Detective Dave Gardiner from the Sheriff’s Office with the assistance of Pacific High School Administration conducted the investigation and interviews of numerous students and faculty at the high school.

The investigation and evidence was turned over to the District Attorney and the case was presented to the Curry County Grand Jury where an indictment was handed down for the arrest of Charles Douglas Klea, DOB/09-26-1961.

Klea was arraigned in Circuit Court on 01/29/2010 for the below listed charges. He was booked and released per judge’s order on the below listed charges:

- Two (2) counts of Official Misconduct in the First Degree
- Two (2) counts of Prostitution

Pacific High School Principal Tony Jones said that Charles Klea has been placed on administrative leave until the investigations are complete. Besides the Sheriff’s Department the school district will also conduct its own investigation. In the meantime the District has hired a substitute teacher for the shop program and there has been no disruption in the classes.

Letter to the Editor,

We all know that Tom Turkey was recently transported to a remote area up the Rogue River. I had called the Department of Wildlife a few weeks before he was picked up and asked if we couldn’t give him another chance, but they felt it was only a matter of time before he might seriously hurt someone. I don’t think that most people in Port Orford realize that Tom had actually begun to physically attack people. It was our own fault because many of us had fed him over the months and he had lost his fear about getting close to humans and expected to be fed whenever he saw you outside your house. It was one thing when he just gobbled when you walked by him to get into your car, be-

cause he wanted you to feed him again and another when he chased the car as you drove away, but when he started to chase people, that became a real problem. He would actually rise up in the air and hit people from behind with his feet and spurs. Some of my neighbors started leaving a broom by their front door to carry if they saw him in their yard and others, who occasionally have small children visiting, began to worry that if he would go after an adult, he might, in the future, seriously injure a child. I can understand their concern and hope we have learned a lesson, myself included, to not feed wild animals, no matter how appealing, when they come around our homes. I also want to thank our Department of Wildlife, rather than having him put down, for making the humane choice and taking the additional effort of moving Tom away from a town.

During this last week, I have been very diligent with the necessary paperwork to hire the two new officers for the Port Orford Police Department. We are moving forward and all seems to be coming together nicely. The reserve officers have continued to work hard to keep the town safe for the community during these trying times. So, if you would please give them a big "Thank You" and a pat on the back when you see them it would really be nice, as this is all they get for doing this job. Without the reserve officers, this community would not be as safe as it has been and I am proud to say they work with me and for this community.

I have been driving around town recently and have noticed that there are many unregistered vehicles parked all over this community. These vehicles are wrecked and not drivable and are causing a nuisance and are an eyesore for some of the residents here in Port Orford. For those of you who may be unaware, the City of Port Orford has an Abandoned Vehicle Ordinance on this type of vehicle. This ordinance is under the Health and Safety section listed in section 8.04. In summary, this section states that no person shall park, store, leave or permit the parking, storing, or leaving of an abandoned vehicle upon private property, including a public right-of-way. An abandoned vehicle is defined as any vehicle which reasonably

appears to be inoperative, wrecked, discarded, displays expired vehicle registration has no vehicle registration plates displayed, or is totally or partially dismantled. I am asking for you to please have this type of vehicle towed, put behind your fence or removed as soon as possible. The police department will be contacting you in the near future if this is not taken care of by the property owners. Thanks for dealing with this in a timely manner.

You should have been there! The City Council met last night January 21st, and folks, that world famous and most coveted "Forest Gump Award" must once again be their goal.

A number of the public spoke in favor of the "Dark Skies Ordinance". One gentleman spoke against it suggesting people go to some mountain top to see stars. He also likes light in town and feels comforted by the Circle K lights. I can't quite follow his reasoning since the ordinance in no way interferes with "down" light -- only "up" light, or "nuisance" light. This fixation on imaginary, intrusive regulation and "light police" measuring lumens is a bit confusing. Regarding the sensation of comfort, however, I would like to suggest a glass of warm milk or a "hot toddy" at bedtime.

Now for the real "kicker". The Mayor announced that the Council refused the "Dark Skies Ordinance" as submitted by the Planning Commission and that the City Hall Staff was going to write one more "acceptable" to the City Council!
