New Officer Takes Oath By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council met last Thursday afternoon with Mayor Jim Auburn and Councilor Scott Luhr absent for medical reasons and the other five councilors present.

The meeting began with Police Chief Marvin Combs going up to the front of the room and asked three of the city's police reserves to step forward including Ty Breuer, Derwin Boggs and Levi Easlon. Chief Combs said the reserves had put in a lot of hours and he wanted to thank them. The large crowd at the meeting gave the officers a warm round of applause for their efforts. Then Chief Combs announced that Levi Easlon would be sworn in as the town's newest full time police officer. He took the oath of office from acting Mayor John Hewitt and was greeted by more applause. The City recently hired two new police officers including Levi and when the second one is sworn in will have three full time paid officers plus several reserves.

Chris Marko and Jake Salcone from RCAC (Rural Community Assistance Corporation) gave a presentation regarding the city's water and wastewater system. RCAC is an organization that receives funding from federal sources

as well as private funding. They have worked with the City before and they offer assistance to rural communities for help with their infrastructure improvements. They are currently studying Port Orford's water and wastewater systems at no cost to the city. Marko and Salcone spoke of the city getting grant funding for raising the impoundment level at the city's drinking water source on the North Fork of Hubbard Creek. They noted that some of the wastewater lift stations need major repairs. And said they would present the City with a rate scenario for the water in April.

They presented some startling statistics on the potential costs of upgrading the city's infrastructure including \$10 million for upgrading the city's water distribution system, \$2 million for water source improvements and \$4 million to replace several of the sewer lift stations for a total of \$16 million in needed improvements. Divide that amongst about 600 ratepayers in the city and you'll see it's only going to get done with massive federal and state grants and of course lots of studies.

There were nearly a dozen people who spoke under citizen's concerns and their comments were in the main part directed toward the proposed Dark Sky Ordinance 2010-01. To set the stage

the City Planning Commission has devoted many hours to this ordinance and recently came up with revised version which went to the council. The council then took it under consideration and revised it but not at a public meeting but in private conversations with City Administrator Mike Murphy.

Linda Tarr spoke in favor of the Ordinance and placing sky caps on the mercury vapor lights. John Leuthe asked for a show of hands on how many people supported the Ordinance and most raised their hands. Wendy Thomas spoke in favor of the Ordinance and being able to see the shooting stars at night but reminded the council the number one priority was dealing with the water loss. Al Geiser gave a timeline of the Dark Sky program leading up to the Ordinance. He urged that all the mercury vapor lights be retrofitted with sky caps or decommissioned. He said the Transient Lodging Tax funds would cover the cost of the sky caps. Geiser presented a paragraph he requested be added to the ordinance as newly revised by the council and it goes like this: 1.

Any and all mercury vapor style security lights; franchised or leased by CCEC (Coos Curry Electric Cooperative) or privately operated in the public, private, or commercial sectors, inside the city limits of Port Orford must be retro-fitted with skylcaps or replaced with a full cut-off fixture, or decommissioned within 18 months after the effective date of the Ordinance."

Ann Vileisis called the revised Ordinance a good compromise but that it didn't address the mercury vapor lights. In addition to those who spoke at the meeting City Administrator Mike Murphy said he had received seven letters of support for the Dark Sky Ordinance. Acting Mayor John Hewitt read the Ordinance by title for what constituted the first reading. It had been scheduled as the second reading of the Ordinance. Hewitt said the city attorney instructed the council that there had been so many substantial changes since the first reading of the Ordinance two weeks ago that the newly revised one was basically a

new Ordinance so therefore a first reading. The council will take up the second reading of the Ordinance at their February 18 meeting and possibly vote on it. The newly revised Ordinance includes a "grandfather" clause stating that "outdoor light fixtures installed prior to and operable on the effective date of the requirements codified in this Ordinance are exempt from such requirements" and then listed three minor exceptions.

Dark Sky's over Port Orford are intended so people can enjoy the night sky, the Milky Way, the shooting stars by getting property owners to direct their night light down on their property rather than up at the sky. If done right everyone can win.

The council approved the consent calendar by unanimous vote. It included the Mayor's appointment of Councilor David Smith as the council liaison to the County Emergency Services.

There was a brief discussion by Councilor Bill McArdle about the proposal of a community garden in Buffington Park at the site of the BMX track (off road bicycles). He said the parks commission

had decided on placing it at the BMX track. A few weeks ago the commission was considering either putting it in the park or at the Episcopalian Church. The Parks Commission is holding a special meeting on February 15, 6:00pm at city hall to discuss the issue before voting on it and is asking for citizen input before making their decision. The BMX course is located near the skateboard park and adjacent to the parking area next to Mill Pond.

Letter to the Editor,

The City Council met at 3:30 on Feb 4th and the audience filled the chamber to within 8 or 10 seats of its capacity. The crowd was there for the first reading of the long awaited and much anticipated "Dark Skies Ordinance". There were, I believe, 11 public speakers in favor and none against it.

I guess it was assumed we had gotten our own copies because only the title of the ordinance was read. Had it been read in it's entirety we would have needed the Mormon Tabernacle Choir to sing "Goom bai ya "softly in the background. Why? "Why would I say that?" you ask. Folks the answer to that lies in a line by line comparison of the ordinance properly compiled and drawn up by the Planning Commission with the cobbled together amateurish attempt submitted by the City Hall Staff (the type of thing that usually happens when too many people put their own personal agendas into the mix).

What they came up with might charitably be called Dark Skies "Lite" (no pun intended). They may have honestly attempted to address the issue of new

lighting for dwellings. The rest of the ordinance is not only an insult to the Planning Commission but also to every responsibly thinking resident of Port Orford. It is full of useless "suggestions" and "encouragement" and ambiguous guidelines. It pretty much "grandfathers" all existing lighting thereby effectively eliminating any eventual compliance except for replacements when it seems to rely on some sort of "honor" system. It dropped any reference to exterior neon lighting, and the need for shielding on 60 watt bulbs etc, etc. It seems the Councilor's business with the only operable neon light in town is not going to have any changes to make on any of its lights. What a coincidence.

I could go on about this travesty but I guess a badly flawed ordinance is better than no ordinance at all. Let's hope they can improve it in the next 2 weeks and pass it at the next meeting.

PHS Student Sentenced

Dayland Wagner was sentenced in Curry County Juvenile Court on Monday,

February 8, in a case that came out of a burglary charge at Pacific High School the week of October 5-8. Wagner had previously admitted to the charge of burglary in the second degree and his case did not go to trial.

Wagner was placed on an indefinite period of probation with the juvenile department. The issue of restitution of damages to the school district was not resolved and an additional restitution hearing will be held within 30-90 days. Wagner was ordered to serve 80 hours of community service. He will serve 8 days of detention. He was ordered to be actively involved in a school program and complete his skill building process as assigned by his probation officer and participate in victim offender mediation. Wagner was expelled from Pacific High School after being arrested in October but can be reinstated after one year.

Wagner is the first of three young men to be sentenced in the series of incidents which included burglary, vandalism and arson (two of whom were students at Pacific High School at the time) and one adult who was a former student of the school.

Letter to Editor,

The City Council has accepted in principle, the revised version of the Dark Sky Ordinance written by the City Staff. “At least it’s a start”, said Wendy Thomas at the last City Council meeting. Wendy’s right, it’s not what the Planning Commission presented to the City Council, but a beginning, and it does protect the future growth.

Just for the record, it’s the process I’m concerned with. I understand that the City Council has the right to make changes to any ordinances or concepts submitted to them by the Planning Commission. And no, this is not an ego trip;

I know City Council members have the final word. However, that final word should be achieved using the same format of debate the planning members are required to use. It’s called an open forum. All it takes is one or two words to completely change the meaning of a paragraph, or in this case, an ordinance.

Why weren’t the changes discussed in an open forum? Did one council member have the opportunity to yea or nay or discuss another counsel’s proposal? Who on the council did the changes benefit? Were these procedures legal? Who made those changes? If members of the city staff, who directed them? Are the City Council members restricted in dis-

cussing issues privately as the Planning Commissioners are? Don’t we deserve to know who voted for and against, who made the changes and for what reason?

Before I joined the Planning Commission, I discussed my personal beliefs on certain issues, with Mr. Dave Holman. His answer was clear; I can’t vote based on my personal judgment, or agenda, regardless of the issue. I realized the law is more relevant in the planning commission discussions that relate to the issues. Doesn’t the City Council consider the law equally? In other words, if we can find a law that would legally prevent the passing of a judgment, so be it, otherwise it’s approved.

This was a tough concept to follow, but I accepted it. Are the City Council members adhering to the same reasoning? Are they voting with prejudice? Are some obligated to recuses themselves due to conflict of interest? Are the voters entitled to answers to these questions?



It's a Whopper

Valerie recently had the pleasure of eating at Fely's Café at the Port of Brookings. We travel occasionally and are always on the lookout for new places to eat that are unique and good quality. She raved about Fely's so much that we took off on Saturday afternoon to try one of their burgers. They have two sizes, regular and what they call the quarter pound burger. Though Valerie warned me the quarter pounder was huge I didn't quite believe just how much of a whopper it would be so ordered that one while she ordered the regular cheese burger. Fely's "quarter pound burger" filled the regular sized plate and was so large the bun was buried underneath it as well as the tomatoes, pickles and lettuce with only the grilled onion showing on top of the burger. It's more like a one pound burger. I decided to eat the cheeseburger with a knife and fork until I could get to the bun but by that time was too full.

Fely's is the first place serving hand formed hamburgers we have been to since we ate at the Clyde Diner in Clyde Ohio four years ago. Hand formed burgers are pretty much a thing of the past and unusual enough that it deserves at-

ention. The giant cheeseburger was delicious though easily big enough for two meals so I took half of it home. Fely's serves other foods including breakfast and is open from 7:00am to 4:00pm. It is in a non-descript blue building which also houses a Laundromat. It is adjacent to the south side of the Port of Brookings jetty and less than 50 feet from the sea wall protecting you from the ocean. As you eat you can watch the waves all but rolling up to the restaurant counter. Fely's is open seven days a week with a friendly owner and staff and is worth the drive. 
**Thank You

ODOT Construction Update

Starting Monday, February 8, motorists should expect weekday lane closures and delays of 20 minutes south of Port Orford at mile point 310.3 due to rock scaling work. Great Backyard Bird Count

This year's Great Backyard Bird Count will take place from Feb. 12-15. Everyone with access to the internet can participate. It takes as little as 15 minutes. It's free, fun, and easy, and it helps birds.

You can count birds for as little or as long as you want to during the 4-day period, then tally the highest number of birds of each species seen together at any one time. To report your count, fill out an online checklist.

As the count progresses, you can explore what is being reported all across the U.S. and Canada. You can also see how numbers compare to previous years.

There's a photo contest, too. (In 2008, Port Orford's own Lois Miller won 4th place!)

This year nearly 100,000 bird watchers of all ages and abilities are expected to help create a real-time snapshot of where birds are all across the continent. This citizen science effort aids Cornell and National Audubon Society researchers to understand more about birds.
