

### Library Endowment Fund By Evan Kramer

Port Orford doesn't have a gathering spot like the Pony Village Mall in North Bend nor a town square like in Arcata nor does it have weather that is always or almost always conducive to being outdoors. We have some excellent places to gather outdoors like Battle Rock Park and Tseriadun State Park. But for year round activity nothing compares to the Port Orford Public Library. The new library opened on July 5, 2008 and replaced a cramped 2,200 square foot library at Port Orford City Hall with a building five times that size.

The Port Orford Public Library has become the place to go for using the Internet, for meetings in the Howard Lichtig Freedom of Speech room and the smaller meeting rooms where people play bridge and get their food handler's permit among other things, read magazines, books, and newspapers in comfortable chairs and of course a place to check out books, CDs, movies, and books on tape. The library is also an art gallery with rotating shows that last about three months. The current one features artwork by two of my favorite people and artists – Richard Yarnell and Ginelle Weber. Richard Yarnell's beach debris collages are not only as colorful

as you can get but just a load of fun to explore each time you look at them you see something new. A third and upcoming young artist named Jenie Covey is also part of this fine show.

The Port Orford Library funding comes from the Library taxing district and that amount comes to 49 cents per thousand dollars of assessed valuation. The Library District collects around \$100,000 a year in taxes with increases in their tax base limited to 3% by law. The Library makes extra money to fund operating services, pay for employees and materials in a variety of ways outside the tax base. The money raised by the Friends of the Port Orford Library books sales goes to pay for some materials and it just so happens there is a library book sale this Saturday and Sunday in the free speech room. The library raises additional money with room rentals, gifts and donations and library services which include photo copies.

The library opened on July 5, 2008 debt free and all paid for thanks to the generosity of local residents, grants, and many people from outside the area. It cost over \$1,700,000 to build and didn't cost the taxpayers one cent which is almost unheard of in Oregon.

I didn't understand what the library needed an endowment fund for or even what one was, so I spent some time last Friday with Librarian Tobe Porter getting it all straightened out. The library foundation has a goal of raising \$500,000 for the library endowment fund and then using the money earned off that nest egg to help fund library services. The Library Foundation has started on its goal of raising \$500,000 and has \$18,000 so far. They need another \$7,000 to make \$25,000 and thus have enough money to qualify for putting their money into the Oregon Community Foundation and establishing an endowment partners fund with that group. Once they have their first \$25,000 in the Foundation and become a member that non profit group will go to work providing "high quality, diversified investment management" helping the library earn the most on its money and offer advice as well.

Tobe Porter said one of the goals of the library is to remain forever debt free and not have to go the taxpayers with levies to pay for services. We all know that in Oregon most of the time tax levies are voted down though in Port Orford we have voted yes for our Port, police department and library in the past.

The Library functions so well because in addition to our full time librarian and three paid members of the library staff (who don't get many paid hours), there are many volunteers who help keep it open seven days a week. Tobe Porter said the volunteers are the key to keeping the library open seven days a week. It is estimated that the volunteers put in \$32,000 worth of hours assuming they would paid minimum wage but of course the volunteers do not get paid. The total personal expenses for the proposed 2010-11 library district budget is \$69,496. By comparison that wouldn't pay for salary and benefits of one of the City of Port Orford's department heads yet that total of \$69,000 in wages and benefits funds Port Orford's single most important asset and one of the main reasons to live here.

Costs have gone up in some areas a lot from the days at city hall including the electric bill which comes to nearly \$7,800 a year and money for maintenance of the building, water and sewer

fees and landscaping and the tax base isn't enough, thus the endowment fund.

Elaine Owen is one of many volunteers at our library and also serves as the president of the Library Foundation. She and her husband Ted are leaving 30% of their estate to the library endowment fund. This is one way people can contribute to the endowment fund. Tobe Porter told me that down the road in November of this year the Library Foundation will begin a major fundraising effort for the endowment fund.

The Port Orford Rotary Club has a very successful endowment fund established to help pay for scholarships for graduating seniors at Pacific High School. It's the same principle as the Library Endowment fund except the Rotary Club has been at it for years and from 2001 had awarded over \$60,000 in scholarships including \$15,700 in 2009. The club doesn't touch the principle but only draws on what their endowment fund earns each year for the scholarship awards.

In the meantime enjoy the library and all it has to offer. It's our town center, mall, town square, gathering place all rolled up in one.


**Letter to the Editor,**

**Sex Offender Released**

The Curry County Sheriff's Office is releasing the following information pursuant to ORS 181.592, which authorizes the Sheriff to inform the public when the release of information will enhance public safety and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of a sex offense that requires registration with the Oregon State Police. The individual's name is Gary Douglas Caughey, and he is being released from Oregon State Penitentiary on 03/19/2010, and is scheduled to be on post-prison supervision until at least 03/18/2011. Caughey is required by state law to reside in Curry County, and will be supervised by the Curry County Parole & Probation Department. His Parole Officer is Deputy Kris Bishop 541-469-4732.

Caughey is being released after serving the last 23 years in prison for Kidnapping in the First Degree, after forcing a 17-year-old girl at knife point into his vehicle. At the time he committed that crime, Caughey had recently been released from prison after

serving over 8 years for kidnapping two children in Nebraska. In that case Mr. Caughey abducted two children from a parking lot, tied one of the children to a tree and choked the other. Prior to that crime Caughey had been convicted of another Kidnapping and Rape in 1973.

When sentenced for his most recent crime, Caughey was sentenced as a Dangerous Offender. Upon release from prison this Friday, Caughey is designated as a Sex Offender, but not Predatory.

Sheriff Bishop disagrees with the state Department of Corrections in their assessment of Mr. Caughey and not labeling him as a predatory sex offender, but understands that by state law they have done what is required in their assessment.

Sheriff Bishop is committed to working closely with the community to ensure that public safety is maintained while the Parole & Probation Department works with Mr. Caughey to see that he is safely integrated into society. This notification is not intended to increase fear; rather, it is our belief that an informed public is a safer public.

Gary Douglas Caughey was born Feb. 22, 1941. He is a white male, brown hair, hazel eyes, weighs 190lbs and is 6 ft 2 in tall.

1959 Arrested for Auto Theft. 1971 Arrested for Aggravated Assault and Battery, Was committed to State Hospital, released as "No Longer Sexually Dangerous" 1973 Arrested for Rape in First Degree, Kidnap in Second Degree, was again committed to State Hospital as "Sexually Dangerous Offender" 1976 escaped from Hospital. 1976 Arrested for 2 counts of Kidnapping. 1986 Arrested for Kidnapping in First Degree

Between 1968 and 1986, there were other arrests and contacts which include Indecent exposure, Sex abuse of a child, Vagrancy, Kidnapping, Attempted Murder, and Attempted Rape.

Conditions and Restrictions: No drugs or alcohol; no contact with victims; no contact with minors; no entry where children congregate; mental health evaluation; sex offender treatment; curfew. This does not convey authority to stop, arrest, or detain

**And The Kitchen Sink**

On a beautiful but windy first day of spring on the Oregon coast, nearly 4,200 volunteers headed to the beach to clean much of the 362 miles of Oregon coastline earlier today. Volunteers found the beaches covered with large amounts of trash and debris that had washed ashore during winter storms, and removed an estimated 70,500 pounds of trash from the coast.

“Oregonians came out in force today to help protect the incredible Oregon coastline, the ocean, and the many ecosystems it supports” said SOLV’s new Executive Director, Melisa McDonald. “It is truly inspiring to see Oregonians, particularly the youngest volunteers from our next generation, learning the value of stewardship for our beautiful state while working to keep the beaches clean and free of harmful debris.” The dry weather on the coast made the

cleanup a perfect way for many families to kick off their spring breaks.

Some of the most common items found on the beach included Styrofoam, plastic caps, lids, bottles and cigarette butts. While these are often small items, if they accumulate they can do big damage to marine wildlife and the environment, particularly the plastic debris that never fully degrade or disappear. Data from past cleanups report that nearly 80% of ocean trash comes from land-based activities, meaning that the majority of trash in the ocean could be preventable if we all did more to reduce, properly dispose of, or recycle trash in our daily lives.

In addition to the typical beach trash and debris, volunteers found a wide selection of household fixtures and items, including aluminum siding, a freezer, a mattress, a cooler, and a full kitchen sink. Coordinators suspect that winter

storms caused unusual ocean currents that brought in items from across the ocean and deposited items that had been at sea for a long period of time onto Oregon beaches. Volunteers reported large amounts of rope and many bottles and glass floats from Asia at multiple beaches up and down the coast. On a positive note, the Yachats Fire Chief reports that for the first time in many years, they did not find a single six-pack yoke on the beach, which pose a significant threat to marine wildlife.





Public Works found and repaired a serious water leak. The Chili Cook-off is coming up as is Whale Watching. Tsunami preparedness was mentioned. Obtaining a grant for funds to research points of pollution in our lake was suggested. Another city right-of-way was turned over to a private business. A lot of "thanking" went on from time to time ... Councilors to each other and private citizens and vice versa and warmth and fuzziness sorta ebbed and flowed.

Two important points were made, however, which merit a great deal of attention. A concerned citizen asked for some type of guidelines to govern the City turning over a public right-of-way to a private enterprise. **Suspect Released on Bail**

A bail reduction hearing was held for Timothy Maynard last week in Curry County Circuit and the bail amount was reduced. Maynard, age 19, has been in Curry County Jail awaiting his jury trial on April 13 and 14 on the following charges related to criminal incidents at Pacific High School on October 5-8, 2009. He is charged with arson in the first degree, two counts of burglary in the second degree, and aggravated theft. Maynard had been held in jail with bail set at \$100,000. It was reduced to \$25,000 by the judge and the bail was posted with a payment of 10% or \$2,500.

The terms of the bail reduction include Maynard released into the custody of his grandparents in Port Orford and being required to live with them until the trial in April. He is not to associate with any-


one involved in the October 5-8 criminal activities which took place at Pacific High School. Maynard pled not guilty at his pre-trial conference on February 9 and at that time requested a jury trial.

**City News Beat**

The Public Works Department reported that they treated 4.653 million gallons of water at the water treatment plant in Buffington Park in February. They metered 2.259 million gallons to customers for a loss rate of 51% or 2.394 million gallons of water. The loss rate is down from previous months.

The wastewater flow to the wastewater treatment plant was 3.761 million gallons in February.

The Public Works Department fixed one large water leak after losing 4 feet of water at the reservoir.

The proposed site for the Port Orford Community Garden has been cleared. It is at Buffington Park on the Arizona Street right of way adjacent to the baseball field. The city council is considering granting a right of way permit to the Rotary Club for the garden but did not take action on this matter at their March 18 meeting. The council wanted to take a look at the area after it was cleared so they could better understand the location. It has now been cleared.

The City Council granted a right of way permit to Jack Lewis to relocate Siren's Café drive up window at Seaside Plaza to the Thirteenth Street side of the building.

The next council meeting is on Thursday, April 1, 3:30pm in the Gable council chambers.

It is recommended you contact the Curry County Sheriff's Department if you receive this letter.

Letter states:

A. Property Tax Adjusters shows the property at XYZ Address may be over assessed for property tax purposes.

B. Your property may have an over assessed value of \$100,000 and a request for property tax reassessment is available to you.

C. Due to this estimated decline in market value, Property Tax Adjusters shows an estimated property tax savings of \$1,500.00 annually.

D. To complete your property tax reassessment, detach and mail the coupon on the reverse side with your service fee of \$189.00, on or before 4/16/2010. Property Tax Adjusters will prepare and submit all necessary documentation to the County Assessor's Office and Assessment Appeals Board, and will act as your agent in all dealings with the County Assessor's Office.
