### School District News

The following report was presented to the Port Orford/Langlois School District Board of Directors at a special meeting on May 3. Most school districts across the State face similar financial crises, but for small school districts like 2CJ the impact on the students, staff, and community can be devastating, and if support is not forthcoming from the State and Federal governments we will be faced with more reductions in spending in a budget that has been cut to the bare essentials.

The 2CJ District is facing significant reduction in funding for the 2010/11 school year. We have been waiting for the latest State School Fund estimates with which to formulate next year's budget. Two main factors added to the impact of falling enrollment on District funds.

1) In 2009/10 the District received additional one-time funding from ARRA and School Improvement grants totaling \$366,000. These timely funds financed the majority of the much needed renovation and repair of Driftwood School. More importantly, these monies allowed us to move salaries from the general fund into the grants, and thus maintain the high level of staffing we enjoyed.

We will not receive federal assistance of any such amount to fund these positions and they must now be brought back into the general fund for 2010/11. These grants essentially gave us one more year of strong staffing. These grants are gone.

2) Many small districts are provided additional ADM (average daily membership) under a formula called the Small School Correction. This means we receive money for more students than actually attend school. This provided the District with significant funds because both Driftwood and Blanco were included in the formula. Over the years, enrollment declined to the level that it was a financial loss to keep both schools operating, and Blanco was closed last year providing a large cash savings, but also reducing our state funds by \$300,000. On March 1st, we received our monthly State School Fund Report (SSF). It indicated that the District would receive approximately \$651,000 under the Small School Correction. Brenda, while reviewing the numbers, discovered that the State had not taken Blanco School out of the calculations and our correction would only total \$280,000. If this had not been discovered, the District would once again have been in the position of having to return money to the State. We also would have built the bud-

get on inflated numbers, so the estimate was reduced by an additional \$370,000.

In order to balance the 2010/11 budget, cuts are necessary.

Holding safety and instruction as the top priorities, and with input from the staff, hours of Department / Administrator team collaboration, and budget analysis by the Superintendent and Business Manager, a recommendation is submitted to the Board, by the Superintendent, for reductions in spending in the following areas:

- Personnel 5.5 (FTE) – 2.5 of which are leaving open positions vacant
- Administrative costs
- Board Expenses
- Athletics
- Co-curricular
- Technology
- Transportation
- Maintenance
- Professional development
- Travel
- Substitutes
- Texts
- Discretionary spending

The current revision of the 2010/11 draft budget totals \$3,505,733, and reflects cuts of \$794,318.

### Wildfire Awareness Week

Wildfire Awareness week this year is from May 2nd through May 8th. According to State Fire Marshall Randy Simpson most frequently, human caused Wildfires in Oregon are caused by escaped burning debris. Please make sure you follow all regulations for burning. In the City Limits, you must have a current permit for open burning and for burn barrels. The Fire Department would like to remind you to begin preparing for the Wildfire Season now. The following are some tips and guidelines to help you think about how to make your home safer.

Make sure the access to your home/property is adequate for our equipment. Trim overhanging branches and brush that has narrowed your driveway over the years.

Make sure your address is visible from the road at all times (day and night).

Clean your gutters and roof of debris.

Remove all dead plants, trees, debris and brush from the area surrounding your home (at least 100 feet is you home is on level ground, 200 feet if sloped.).

Box in your eaves and screen any vents.

Keep your firewood stored well away from your home and on the uphill side of your home.

Dispose of any hot ashes (from your fireplace or barbecue) in a SAFE manner.

Make sure that trees limbs and branches do not extend over your roof or close to a chimney or stovepipe.

Keep water hoses preconnected to a working outside outlet.

Store flammable liquids in a safe manner, well away from your home.

Mow your lawn regularly, keep it short and remove all dead grass.

If you are updating/remodeling your home, use noncombustible building materials.

Landscape with fire resistant plants.

Follow all burning regulations.

Plan ahead for an Emergency.

Call 911 IMMEDIATELY if you smell smoke, see flames or believe that there is a fire. Your Fire Department would

much rather respond to a false alarm than a fire completely out of control because you waited too long.
