

Summer means County Fairs and both the Coos and Curry County Fairs open in two weeks. The Curry County Fair runs from Thursday to Sunday, July 29 to August 1 at the Fairgrounds in Gold Beach. The theme of this year's Fair is "Wild Berries & Critters & Rides, Oh My!"

Admission to the Curry County Fair is \$7.00 for adults. Children 6-12 admitted for free on Fridays while on the other three days it will cost them \$2.00 to get in. A season pass for all four days for an adult is \$20. Seniors get in on Thursday for \$3 and Friday through Sunday for \$5 while children under six years of age are admitted free all four days. Sunday is family day where admission runs \$15 for the family.

Every year one of the most popular parts of the Fair is the midway and this year the Curry County Fair features the Paul Mauer Show with a variety of carnival rides including a 90' Drop Tower, The Big Wheel, and the Tornado. The Fair features presentations by Great Cats of the World Park in Cave Junction. They are bringing over a leopard, ocelot and caracal which will demonstrate some of their skills for the public. And our friends from Wildlife Images in Merlin

will also be at the Fair again this year with several birds of prey. If you can't get over to Merlin or Cave Junction this is the next best way to see some of the birds and animals on display at either park.

The Grand Marshal for this year's Curry County Fair parade is Meryl Boice. She is being honored for over 50 years of community service in the Gold Beach area and worked as a nurse at Curry General Hospital for nearly 40 years. The Fair Parade will be held on Saturday, July 31 10:00am, in downtown Gold Beach on Highway 101.

One of the featured events at this year's fair is the Bulls and Barrels on Thursday, July 29, 8:00pm, in the indoor arena.

The Fairgrounds in Gold Beach is also known as the Event Center at the Beach and last Sunday hosted a free admission crafter's fair.

The Coos County Fair is held at the Fairgrounds in Myrtle Point. This year's Fair overlaps the Curry County Fair and runs from Tuesday, July 27 through Saturday July 31. It's much bigger Fair than the one in Gold Beach but further away as well. The theme of this year's Fair is "Carnival Night, Carnival Lights" and in 2012 Coos County

will be celebrating the one hundredth anniversary of their fair.

Admission fees are \$8 for an adult Tuesday through Thursday and \$10 on Friday and Saturday. Children 6-12 are admitted for \$2 Tuesday through Thursday and \$3 on Friday and Saturday. Seniors get in for \$4 Tuesday through Thursday and then move up to \$10 for Friday and Saturday so the lesson to be learned here is go to the fair the first three days before all the flowers in the horticulture building wilt and the admission prices go up. Vehicle parking at the Fair will cost you \$5. Box seats for the Friday night rodeo go for \$30.

The 4-H program is an important part of all county fairs and is where young people get some of their most important agricultural experiences raising pigs, sheep, llamas, cows and other animals and then putting them on display at the fair. We enjoy going to the commercial exhibit buildings at county fairs and seeing if we can get talked into buying something we don't need, but really the heart and soul of the fairs resides with the 4-H programs. Many young people stay at the fairs for their duration and are the future of agriculture in this country. The 4-H pledge and motto goes as follows:

Sandra Johnson, FNP, (family nurse practitioner) has resigned from her position at Curry Family Medical Clinic in Port Orford effective July 2. She and her husband Stan Johnson are moving to Idaho to be closer to their family. Stan Johnson is a member of the Port of Port Orford Commission and it is expected he will resign at the next Port meeting on Tuesday, July 20.

Dr. Tom Pitchford has agreed with the Curry Health District to see all of Sandra Johnson’s patients and will now work at the Clinic Monday through Thursday from 8:30am to 5:00pm.

Curry Health District is recruiting for a replacement for Sandra Johnson and has assured us that they will definitely replace her but there is no timeline for her replacement. Many, but not all, of Sandra Johnson’s patients at Curry Family Medical were sent a letter explaining the situation and notifying them of her departure from the clinic and explaining the health care provider opportunities now available at Curry Family Medical.

Gold Beach Shooting

On 07-11-10 at about 4:24am, the Curry County Sheriff Office received a 911 call from 72 year old Arthur Harkey (DOB/10-30-1938), stating he had accidentally shot his grandson at their residence located at 95750 Jerry’s Flat Road, Gold Beach, Or.

Patrol Lieutenant John Ward was called out and responded to the residence and found 22 year old Raymond Murray, (DOB/05-08-1988), on the floor in the hallway of the residence with a single gun shot wound to his lower abdomen. Cal-Or Ambulance arrived and with the assistance of Gold Beach Fire Department, put Murray on a back board and transported him to Curry General. After initially being treated at Curry General Hospital, Murray was flown to Bay Area Hospital in Coos Bay and was reported as in critical condition.

Curry County Sheriff’s Detective Dave Gardiner also responded to help investigate the shooting. Arthur Harkey told authorities he was awoken by a noise and grabbed his gun from his nightstand. Harkey said as he started to walk out of his bedroom, he was startled by a figure in the hallway and the gun discharged at close range. Harkey realized he had shot his grandson and called 911 for help.

The Curry County Sheriff’s Office is continuing the investigation.

Animal Abuse Arrest

On July 4, 2010, at about 7:51 Curry County Sheriff's Dispatch received a report from a citizen that his five (5) cats had been killed. Sheriff's Deputies responded to 98128 Olsen Lane in Harbor, Oregon and contacted resident Gary Richard who took the Deputies out to his burn pile in his back yard and showed them the lifeless bodies of one (1) adult cat and four (4) kittens. The cats appeared to have been intentionally killed by blows to the heads.

Salmon Poisoning Disease

Salmon Poisoning Disease is a potentially fatal condition seen in dogs that eat raw Salmon or other anadromous fish. The fish are harmless but may harbor a parasite, Nanophyetus salmincola, which in turn may be infected with Neorickettsia helminthoeca which is harmful to dogs (and only to dogs.)

Symptoms usually appear within six days and can include vomiting, lack of appetite, fever, diarrhea, weakness, swollen lymph nodes, and dehydration.

Contact your vet if you think your dog may be affected.
