

Water Election Results

Emergency Election Results By Evan Kramer

The votes have been counted and they results are in and both City of Port Orford water bond ballot measures went down to defeat. City voters had to vote up or down on a \$6 million general obligation bond and a \$4 million revenue bond which would have paid for a complete overhaul of the City's water infrastructure including all water lines and pump stations.

What's next for the city isn't known but they will have to continue fixing the system one leak at a time for now with the excellent Public Works Department crew they have on staff.

In other news the Fourth of July Jubilee schedules have been printed and are now being distributed up and down the coast. The theme of this year's Jubilee is "American as Apple Pie". The Jubilee

will have events running from Friday, July 1 to Monday, July 4.

Some of the many highlights of the Jubilee this year include the opening day ceremony on July 1, 9:30am with the flag raising and Pledge of Allegiance led by the Boy Scouts at Battle Rock Park. Chetco Federal Credit Union hosts their annual hot dog lunch that day from 11:00am to 2:00pm with all proceeds going to the Driftwood School Smart Reading program. Chetco and their employees are a strong supporter of this program./

Saturday, July 2 features a pancake breakfast at the Beachcomber's Square Dance Club on Nicholson Drive at Milepost 298 from 8:00am to 11:00am. Most of you aren't square dancers so this is a good opportunity to visit and have breakfast at one of Port Orford's most historic and interesting buildings. The Port Orford Arts Council hosts a "Kiss it Goodbye" art sale of works by local artists at a reduced rate taking place at Driftwood School. Later on that night Theater 101 features the "First Lady Diaries" play at 7:30pm.

Sunday, July 3 you can take part in Beach Golf between Battle Rock and Hubbard Creek; the keg toss at Dock Beach at noon and the all you can eat

crab feed at the Port of Port Orford put on by the Shallow Bay Club to raise money to spruce up the Port. The cost is \$25 and includes all the fresh Dungeness crab you can eat, coleslaw, baked beans, and rolls. The crab feed takes place in what is known at the Port at the Boneyard storage area for boats. There's a pancake eating contest at the Paradise Café at 3:30pm with prizes for first and second biggest eaters of pancakes. Spectators are encouraged to show up and cheer on their favorite pancake eater.

Monday, July 4 features 19 events beginning with the sandcastle sculpture at Dock Beach beginning at 7:00am while over at the American Legion Hall the Port Orford Rotary Club puts on their annual pancakes, ham and scrambled eggs breakfast. The money raised by this breakfast goes to the Rotary Club Scholarships and community projects. Those people wanting to make a donation to the Common Good and get something back for their money can buy some homemade baked goodies in front of the Downtown Fun Zone from 9:30am to 1:00pm. The much anticipated Jubilee Parade starts at 11:00am at City Hall and winds its way down Highway 101 to Battle Rock Park

Letter To The Editor,

Port Orford's water system is failing. The pipes are old and the valves are corroded. A city water-system should last forever if it is properly maintained, repaired, and upgraded. Why did ours fall into such disrepair? Now city hall has declared an emergency. Do the citizens of Port Orford wish to pay for a water-system 20 times as large as the one we have now (the one we can't keep working?)

Our current water-system serves about 700 meters. The Port Orford Public Works Department has the skills and knowledge required to keep in good repair and upgrade a system of this size. Let's make sure the "Water Enterprise" of Port Orford is given the funds and personnel to keep what we have flowing before we talk about expanding to 15,700 meters.

Letting its water-system fail, for whatever reason, is evidence of poor city management. Maintenance of what we have by repair and upgrade is crucial. If the City Fathers (and Mothers) continue

to under-fund Public Works, then the water-system will fail.

This is a wake-up call to people in this town. The citizens must ensure the City's governing body allocates funds to maintain and upgrade our water-system. If not, the people will have no one to blame but themselves when their taxes are raised to pay for someone else's urban dream.

We will be taxed out of our homes if the "Expansionist's" policies are followed. This town does not need nor want 15,000 additional properties. There are plenty of properties for sale within the city limits. When these properties are occupied we can talk about expanding. Let's keep the water-system we have now working.

Letter To The Editor,

In response to Tim Palmer's letter to the editor I find it interesting that he is defending Jim Rogers' education and profession when no one questioned it. The question at issue is: does the Elk River need more micro-managing by a handful of environmental groups who have their own agendas? I worked for the Forest Service from 1963 - 1972 out of the Gold Beach Ranger District, with a break in service for military service. I know that the timber management guys set up the timber sales in units; I know that bids were submitted by mills and logging companies for these units; and, the winning bid logged the unit with supervision from the Forest Service. Incidentally, this is the how the counties were able to have roads built for recreation. As far as I know, Jim Rogers didn't manage any Forest Service timber on the Elk River, he may have bid on the timber sale for Western States Plywood and most likely would have been employed there another 25 years had the mill not gone belly up. However, this isn't about Mr. Rogers, its about land use for recreational purposes. The Forest Service mission statement at one

time was: "The wise use of our natural resources," which includes quality land management under a sustainable multi-use management concept. [Not the preservation of our natural resources, that is the national park service.] Conversely, it is National Park Service mission "*to conserve the scenery and the natural and historic objects and the wild life therein and to provide for the enjoyment of the same in such manner and by such means as will leave them unimpaired for the enjoyment of future generations.*" (National Park Service Organic Act, 16 U.S.C.1.)

In regard to Mr. Palmer's letter: what is a salmon emphasis area; what organizations are behind it; what is the agenda in the future? There is no need to try and micromanage the Forest Service, they have professional people that are capable of protecting the Elk River watershed.

Additionally, the national forest belongs to all the citizens of the United States. Some citizens, such as we senior citizens, can't walk the trails any more but we do enjoy driving the forest roads; this includes what is called a spur road to an old landing, which allows for wildlife

watching. Are my grandchildren and great grandchildren going to be allowed to pan gold for recreation? I have walked all the country From Grassy Knob to the north fork of the Elk, Mulberry Creek, Blackberry Creek, Panther Creek, Bald Mountain Creek, Anvil Creek and have walked most of the southern area of the Elk River, I can't anymore but do enjoy driving the forest roads, let's keep all the roads open in the national forest allowing us seniors to still explore and enjoy. Let's be sure what this Salmon emphasis area is all about before we jump on the band wagon to support a program that may end up biting us.

Free Fishing Weekend

Elk River Fish Hatchery will host the 16th annual Free Fishing Weekend event on Saturday and Sunday, June 11th and 12th, 2011. Each fishing day will begin at about 8:00 am. Young anglers will be allowed to fish for rainbow trout in a special hatchery pond that is stocked with 800 legal size fish (8-12 inches) and 400 whoppers that will weigh from 3-6 pounds each. The hatchery will provide rods, reels, bait and tackle for the kids to fish with. The bag limit is the first three fish caught. There will be no "catch and release", so please bring a large plastic bag to carry your catch home.

The event is limited to the first 100 children 10 years old and younger that sign up in person on each day (100 for Saturday and 100 for Sunday). Sign ups will not be carried over from one day to the next. Upon sign-up, participants will be advised of the approximate time when it will be their turn to fish. To provide a more quality fishing experience we will only fish two kids at a time. Each young angler will be welcome to fish on one day only (either Saturday or Sunday, but not both). The event will be held rain or shine, so be ready for the weather. Each child on the sign up sheet will receive a free starter kit (hooks, sinkers, lure and bobber). Additional prizes will be given away, including mail boat trips, tackle boxes and rods and reels. This event is provided free of charge, so we

Curry County News

The Curry County Commissioners (George Rhodes, Bill Waddle and David Itzen) hold a town hall meeting at Port Orford City Hall on Monday, June 13, from 5:30 – 7:00pm. This will give people an opportunity to both hear from our commissioners and ask questions on subjects ranging from the County reorganization to the plans to take over ownership of the Cape Blanco Airport from the Oregon Department of Airports. Let's have a good turnout for this meeting.

Susan Brown, the Curry County Economic Director, has sent out

her final Economic and Community Development Newsletter as her department is being eliminated as of June 15, 2011, in the County restructuring and she will lose her job. As for Susan Brown as the old saying goes: No good deed goes unpunished.

The Chrysler Corporation has replaced at no cost a Dodge Charger "Pursuit" that the Curry County Sheriff's Department lost when it caught fire and burned earlier this year near Humbug Mountain on Highway 101 while the deputy was involved in a search and rescue. The Sheriff's car, which only had 6,000 miles on it, was completed burned up; this according to a news report on jalopnik.com. The Chrysler Corporation was not obligated to replace the \$35,000 fully equipped police vehicle. The County self-insures their vehicles and would have had to pay for a replacement themselves but for the generosity of Chrysler.

June 11-12 is Free Fishing Weekend and on those two days Oregonians won't need a fishing or shellfish license to fish, crab or clam anywhere in the state.

"Free Fishing Weekend is a great time to take your spouse, kids or friends on the fishing trip without having to buy a license," said Rick Hargrave, Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife deputy administrator for information/education.

During Free Fishing Weekend, fishing licenses and tags are not required, although all other regulations apply

including bag limit and size restrictions. People who already have a combined tag for salmon, steelhead, sturgeon and halibut are required to use it.

To help beginning anglers get started, ODFW and its partners are offering over 35 free fishing events throughout the state. At most events there will be free loaner equipment for novice anglers, special events for children, and lots of volunteers to help. CCEC News

Wholesale power was the topic of discussion once again at the Coos-Curry Electric Cooperative, Inc. (CCEC) board of directors regular meeting held May 26th. “Power generation is very different this spring than it has been in the past,” general manager/CEO Roger Meader explained to the board. The vast majority of the power the cooperative purchases from the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) is hydropower, which typically peaks in May and June as a result of the spring water runoff. “This year, we have more water in the river system than we have had in years and we have wind generation peaking at the same time so it becomes a delicate balancing act,” Meader said.

Meader went on to explain that BPA recently issued an interim policy that defines how the agency will operate during situations that could temporarily push generation or power supply beyond the region’s spring electricity needs. In a typical year, coal, natural gas and other thermal plants shut down or have their output reduced in the spring because temperatures are more moderate and the need for electricity is lower. The hydropower plants use the spring runoff to generate clean, renewable energy and to maintain appropriate water levels for fish. Regulations for water quality to protect endangered fish limit the ability of BPA to simply spill extra water over dams rather than use the water for generation. According to a recent BPA press release, rising runoff has pushed dissolved gas levels at most of the eight federal dams on the Lower Snake and Columbia Rivers above 120 percent, exceeding Washington and Oregon water quality standards and threatening protected salmon and steelhead. Reducing hydroelectric generation in this case would send more water through spillways and could push gas

levels higher for longer periods, further endangering fish. The policy gives BPA the tools to match power generation to demand, which is necessary for reliability and to protect fish.

“BPA immediately took the steps necessary to protect fish and system reliability,” Meader said. Coal, natural gas and other thermal generation was first reduced to minimum levels required for grid stability and safety and then some wind generation was curtailed. All generation was replaced with clean, renewable hydropower at no cost. BPA also provided free or low-cost hydropower to other power producers as an incentive to substitute it for their own power generation.

“Some wind companies have opposed BPA’s interim policy because they may lose tax credits and other revenues when their wind turbines do not actively generate power, even though they receive free replacement hydropower,” Meader continued. BPA has said they will not reimburse wind generators for lost tax credits in the event of over generation because this would unfairly shift those costs onto ratepayers of utilities who purchase power from BPA. “Electric ratepayers in our region have spent billions of dollars on programs designed to mitigate the effects of hydropower generation, improve fish and wildlife habitat and increase the numbers of fish returning to or living in our river systems,” Meader continued. “The whole idea of exceeding water quality standards, ignoring a court order to manage spill levels to protect fish and reimbursing lost tax credits would add undue pressure to wholesale power rates and just doesn’t make sense.”
