"No" to Land Swap at Airport By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City council agreed by consensus at their June 16 meeting to have City Administrator Mike Murphy write letters to the Oregon Department of Aviation, Oregon State Parks and Recreation Department and the Curry County Commissioners opposing any transfer of ownership of Cape Blanco Airport to Curry County and any land swap between Curry County and State Parks. The council agreed by consensus to write these letters which are now complete and have been mailed.

Here is the text of the city council letter written to the Curry County Commissioners:

The Port Orford Mayor and City Council directed me to write letters to the Oregon Department of Aviation, and to the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department opposing any transfers of property, authority, or responsibility for the Cape Blanco Airport, and any nearby Floras Lake State park lands to Curry County. This was a unanimous decision of the Mayor and City Council and was reached after considerable unanimous public input. The Mayor and City Council feel that the County should not attempt to take control of the

Cape Blanco Airport since it is not able to fund other basic essential services due to financial constraints. Accepting further responsibilities with an already over stretched budget is not sound fiscal policy. The county does not make any money on the Brookings Airport, and in fact, loses money and must subsidize that airport with funds, and personnel to accomplish the County's responsibilities there.

The Mayor and Council also feels that the State Parks and Recreation Department would be much better stewards of the land around Floras Lake, and out to Blacklock Point, than the County. That natural area is very important to many of our citizens and affords recreational opportunities utilized by many of our local residents. The undeveloped natural beauty of the State Park lands IS the attraction for many of the visitors.

Please enter this correspondence and the attached copies of the letters sent to the respective State Agencies into public record.

The two letters to the Department of Aviation and the State Parks are too long to print here. They were signed by Mayor Auburn and Councilors Caroline Clancy, Tim Pogwizd, David Smith, William McArdle and Dianne Schofield. Councilor Scott Luhr is on a three month medical leave of absence.

The following are the ending paragraphs in the letters to The Department of Aviation and State Parks respectively:

"The State of Oregon, through its Department of Aviation, has the responsibility to maintain Cape Blanco State Airport as an airport and to enhance its use when possible as an airport. We are vitally concerned about keeping that facility as an airport that can be used in good times and bad. We know that an airport, once lost, is gone forever. We have no trust that the County wishes to keep this functioning as an airport, despite assurances to the contrary. Please keep the airport in State hands, and under state control."

"We are vitally concerned about keeping State Park land in public ownership, unencumbered by some development scheme done in secret. We have no trust that the County wishes to keep this functioning as a State Park, open for

public access, despite assurances to the contrary. Please keep State Park lands in State hands, and under exclusive State control.”

Next up in this process is the Oregon Parks and Recreation commission meeting scheduled for Wednesday, July 20, 10:15am in Bandon at the Harbortown Events Center, located at 325 Second St. SE. Listed on the draft agenda for this meeting under public comments is item A – Floras Lake Project – George Rhodes, Curry County Commission Chair and item B – Bandon State Natural Area Project, Hank Hickox, Manager, Bandon Dunes Resort. The public is allowed to speak under public comments but is limited to three minutes and is asked to bring 12 copies of their statement to share with the commission. This would be a good time to make any comments if you are, like me, opposed to trading any of our State Park lands adjacent to Cape Blanco Airport to Curry County.

**Marine Spatial Planning?
 By Jim Golden**

What is Marine Spatial Planning (MSP)? Is it necessary? How will it be accomplished? How will it affect coastal communities in Oregon? These questions and others are being asked by coastal residents, visitors to the coast, and those with interests in renewable resources such as sustainable fisheries and renewable energy production in the ocean. An upcoming workshop sponsored by Port Orford Ocean Resource Team, The Packard Foundation, and the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife will begin to explore these questions within the community of Port Orford through a series of workshops this summer.

It has become apparent that there are multiple interests in our coastal and offshore waters. The Ocean Policy Advisory Council’s marine reserve process involved gathering input from a variety of stakeholders through the use of community teams. These teams made final recommendations for three more marine reserve / marine protected areas along the coast to create a system of reserves

to study. The recommendations used a process to balance trade-offs between the need to protect species and habitat from disturbance and the need to minimize impact to existing uses in the ocean.

The nation is now seeking alternative and renewable energy resources to reduce our need for non-renewable sources of energy, especially foreign oil imports. In Oregon, wave energy development has potential but the placement of wave energy sites will require planning. The state of Oregon has responded by initiating a review and update of our Territorial Sea Plan and an evaluation ecological, fisheries and other information to identify areas that need protection under statewide planning Goal 19. This process will help protect existing resources and uses while identifying areas for development of new uses such as wave energy, that are compatible with Goal 19’s requirements.

Finally, the Obama administration has initiated a federal MSP process and released an action plan for public com-

ment. Planning under this mandate may involve other uses of the ocean including wave energy, especially in federal waters.

Marine Spatial Planning allows stakeholders and authorities to agree on information or data that will be used in a planning process and provides a measured balancing of interests using special spatial mapping and analysis tools. Good MSP practices utilize a fair process for stakeholder input. The process in Oregon will involve special tools and data sets that will be available to all stakeholders through internet web access.

The Port Orford Ocean Resource Team's first workshop will be conducted with the help of Ecotrust, July 12-13th in Port Orford. The workshop will provide background information on MSP, introduce available MSP data, and will help prepare participants for future ocean planning.

Redfish Rock News

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife announced on July 1 that it intends to delay until Jan. 1, 2012 the closure of the Redfish Rocks and Otter Rock marine reserve sites along the Oregon Coast to fishing or other taking.

The closure was scheduled to take effect on June 30, 2011.

However, according to Cristen Don with the ODFW Marine Reserve Program, the department decided to postpone implementation of the fishing closure in order to collect a second full season's worth of baseline data -- part of its biological, social and economic monitoring efforts.

"Another year of data will help establish a more rigorous baseline on which to base our future monitoring efforts," Don said.

The Redfish Rocks Marine Reserve and Marine Protected Area near Port Orford and the Otter Rock Marine Reserve near Newport were established in 2009 by the Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission as directed by the Oregon State Legislature.

This Week In The Garden By Jennifer Ewing

If you read last week's article, you know that we are taking on the subject of the winter garden. Start your seeds for the winter garden sometime in July so the seedlings will be ready to go in the ground six to eight weeks later, in August or early September. Root crops can be sown in July or August and can be left in the ground throughout winter and harvested as needed.

If you must buy plants, you should start inquiring about availability now. With nurseries few and far between on the coast, we pretty much have to take what we can get. However, if you ask your favorite plant provider if they can order what you want, they will usually be able to call their grower and get the plants that you need, no extra charge. Locally, ask the people selling plants at the Farmer's Market at the Hawthorne Gallery if they could grow some plants for you or see what Gary Carter has at his nursery on Old Mill Road. You can always direct sow seeds into the garden as long as you take extra precaution to protect the germinating seedlings from those hungry slugs.

Former Deputy Arrested

The Curry County Sheriff's Office received information in May that led to the arrest yesterday of Joshua Andrew Bryant, date of birth 08/01/1971, on charges that Bryant committed numerous sex-related crimes on or about May 21, 2011, at a vacation rental in the Whaleshead area north of Brookings.

Joshua Bryant is a former law enforcement officer, most recently employed by the Klamath County Sheriff's Office as a patrol deputy. Curry County Sheriff's Office worked closely with Klamath County Sheriff's Office in this case. When Bryant was

interviewed by investigators, he had been placed on administrative leave by the Klamath County Sheriff. During the investigation, Bryant resigned and is no longer employed in law enforcement.

The Sheriff's Office was contacted by a Medford Police Department investigator who advised that their office had been contacted by an adult female who reported that Bryant had subjected her to sexual contact that she did not consent to, while she was physically helpless, during a visit to Whaleshead. Detective Dave Gardiner of the Sheriff's Office, with assistance from Medford Police and Oregon State Police, continued the investigation that resulted in Bryant's arrest for alleged crimes to that victim, on two counts of Unlawful Sexual Penetration in the First Degree - A Felony, two counts of Sexual Abuse in the First Degree – B Felony, and three counts of Sexual Abuse in the

Third Degree – A Misdemeanor. During this investigation a second adult female victim was identified who reported that Bryant subjected her to unwanted sexual touching on the date in question at the same location. Bryant was subsequently charged and arrested on one count of Sexual Abuse if the Third Degree and one count of Harassment, both alleged A Misdemeanor crimes.

The investigation was presented by Curry County District Attorney's Office to Grand Jury on June 23, which handed down indictments for the above crimes. On June 24 an arrest warrant was issued for Bryant, which included a security release requirement of \$345,000.00.

Bryant was subsequently located and arrested by United States Marshals in the Hood River area on June 27. Federal, state, and local law enforcement officials were on the lookout for Bryant,

as information had been received that he might leave the country and had financial means to do so. After Bryant's arrest he was lodged at the Northern Oregon Regional Corrections Facility (NORCOR) in the Dalles, whereupon he posted the 10% of security required and was released from custody. Bryant was ordered to appear for arraignment on these charges in Curry County Circuit Court at 9:00 am today.

Currently there are active criminal investigations regarding Bryant in other jurisdictions around the state concerning the possibility of similar crimes by Bryant. The Oregon Department of Justice Criminal Division has agreed to assume prosecution of this case. Anyone who believes they may have information about these crimes, or crimes not yet reported, should contact Oregon DOJ Criminal Division at 503-378-6347.

Marvin Daniels Sentenced

On June 14, 2011 Circuit Court Judge Martin Stone sentenced Marvin James Daniels to 121 months in prison for two counts of Sodomy in the First Degree. Daniels was also given 20 years of post-prison supervision, (parole), minus the time he will serve in custody. Those convictions arose after a jury verdict in Circuit Court following a five day trial in the Gold Beach Courthouse which ended on June 1, 2011. Daniels had previously been convicted in 2007 of one count of Sexual Abuse in the Third Degree, two counts of Encouraging Child Sexual Abuse, and Invasion of Privacy. Those convictions arose as a result of a stipulated bench trial by District Attorney Everett Dial. In that case, the defendant was represented by Frank Roberts. When the 2007 case broke, the Port Orford Police Department discovered that Daniels, a Port Orford resident at the time, had videotaped many of his crimes. The police had been notified by an adult daughter of Daniels who called them from Montana. She had become alarmed when she learned that a teenage girl was living with Daniels.

In the current case, the People of Curry County were represented by Deputy District Attorney Robert Meyer and Daniels was represented by defense attorney James Gardner. The case centered round sexual abuse of a five year old child who had been in Daniels care approximately six years ago. The abuse occurred in the Port Orford area. The investigation was conducted by Detective David Gardiner of the Sheriff's Office. Also working on the case was a former Brookings Police Detective, Barbara Palicki, who now works as the child abuse interviewer for the District Attorney's Office. They were assisted by the Port Orford Police Department. The jury in the current case was not allowed to know about his prior convictions under the Oregon Rules of Evidence. "Fortunately, Deputy D.A. Meyer did an excellent job in trying this case," Dial said. Judge Stone is normally a Circuit Court Judge in Coos County. He came down specifically to try this case. Daniels was remanded to custody after the verdict to serve his sentence.

Vehicle Rollover Crash

On July 3rd at about 10:34 am the Curry County Sheriff’s Office Dispatch Center received multiple 911 calls regarding a vehicle rollover crash near milepost 292 on Highway 101. Curry County dispatch contacted Oregon State Police dispatch who advised no OSP Trooper was on duty and requesting Curry County Sheriff’s Office handle the crash. Deputy Jesse Lorentz, the only Patrol Deputy for the county on duty at the time, responded to the scene from Gold Beach. He was assisted by Chief Marvin Combs of Port Orford PD who responded per our request for outside agency help.

The vehicle had crashed into a telephone pole, nearly severing it, but no one was around when police arrived,

although callers described a male subject bleeding from the head and arm running from the accident scene into the adjacent woods. On scene an EMT crew member recognized the vehicle as belonging to Ronald Dale Adams, dob 01/17/1948, of 46570 Highway 101 in Langlois. Deputy Lorentz attempted to locate Adams unsuccessfully at multiple locations. Curry County Search & Rescue (SAR) personnel were called in to assist in the event the injured subject may have been disoriented and become lost.

At about 1:55 pm a resident in the area called the Sheriff’s Office and reported that she just returned to her residence and found Adams inside the residence. Deputy Lorentz responded to the location and arrested Adams for DUII, Reckless Driving, Criminal Mischief in the First Degree, and Failure to Perform Duties of a Driver.

Attention Music Lovers

Have you heard about the Oregon Coast Music Festival which is in its 33rd year here on the southern Oregon coast? If not, this is one of the best music festivals in the country and this year will run from July 16th-30th. Venues are in Coos Bay, North Bend, and Charleston Shore Acres. The Bay Area Concert Band opens the event on July 16 with a free concert in Mingus Park at noon. As the festival progresses, there is a wide variety of music which ranges from acoustic rock, fusion, folk and Americana, blues and jazz, to orchestra concerts (both pop and classical). The orchestra has been touted by many as the best little orchestra in America (if not "the best orchestra, period"!), and is an assembly of regional, national, and international musicians. James Paul, the Music Director and Conductor of the Festival insists that the acoustics in Marshfield Auditorium are as good as anywhere in the world. Art And Nature Workshop

Halibut Fishing Update

With only about 1,000 pounds remaining in the harvest quota, fishery managers today closed the spring all-depth Pacific halibut fishery for the central Oregon coast.

The spring all-depth Pacific halibut fishery for the central coast subarea (from Cape Falcon south to Humbug Mountain) was open 15 days, resulting in the harvest of approximately 115,000 pounds of Pacific halibut. After the most recent opening on June 23-25, only about 1,000 pounds remained in the quota. Not enough to have another spring opening, according to Lynn Mattes, ODFW halibut fisheries project leader.

Instead, remaining quota will be transferred to the summer all-depth fishery, which opens on Aug. 5. The summer all-depth quota will be approximately 43,500 lbs.

Anglers are allowed to harvest one halibut per day of any size. The possession limit is one daily limit at sea and three daily limits on land. The annual limit is six fish per angler.

Letter To The Editor,

In his letter last week to Port Orford Today Mr. Rogers states: "The hatchery essentially artificially replaces the lower river spawning lost to logging and livestock." According to the Elk River Hatchery operations plan 2011, under program type: " The ODFW Hatchery Management Policy defines hatchery programs as either harvest or conservation programs. Harvest programs operate to enhance or maintain fisheries without impairing naturally reproducing populations. Conservation programs operate to maintain or increase the number of naturally produced fish without reducing the productivity of naturally reproducing populations. Elk River Hatchery programs are harvest programs, used for the augmentation of fishing and harvest opportunities." The Elk Hatchery is not a conservation hatchery and was not placed there to replace those fish spawning areas supposedly "lost to logging and livestock in the lower river".

Krieger Delivers on Promise

The Oregon Legislature concluded its 2011 session on Thursday, June 30 and on Friday July 1 Representative Wayne Krieger came home from Salem via Port Orford with an important announcement. Krieger appeared at the Port Orford Ocean Resource Team office at about 2:00pm and told Director Leesa Cobb and several POORT board members that he had included \$425,000 in House Bill 5508 for POORT to use for establishing a science and research center in Port Orford. This building would also include the POORT's offices and room for Port Orford Sustainable Seafood. This money is not a grant but an earmark and does not require matching funds. This money has nothing to do with the proposed \$2-3 million dollar Marine Interpretive Center at Battle Rock Park though Krieger said the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife had dedicated \$35,000 for the Center. Krieger said funding had been approved for 5 marine reserves and emphasized the importance of establishing basic fish stock assessments. The POORT science and research center and office will not be located at the Port of Port Orford nor will they have enough money to build a new building but will look for an existing one to buy and remodel.
