### Fighting Fire with Words By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council met on Thursday, August 5, and save for a letter to the Port Orford Rural Fire Board regarding the Pinehurst Boat Dock it was an uneventful meeting.

The council considered a letter written by City Administrator Mike Murphy to the Rural Fire Board and the first paragraph goes as follows:

“The City of Port Orford wishes to install the floating boat docks at the Pinehurst Boat Ramp as soon as funding can be located. This project has been on the Parks Commission agenda several times and has been discussed at the City Council meetings as well. The City wishes to complete this project. There has been a movement to get contributions of materials and labor to get this project completed. This will provide additional recreational opportunities for our citizens. This would also be a good draft point for fire apparatus in the event of a major fire”

Mari Lochass, a member of the Port Orford Fire Department, spoke under citizen’s concerns about the letter written by Murphy to the Rural Fire Board. She referred to the United States Forest Service 2011 Invasive Species

Prevention Guideline in regards to drafting water out of Garrison Lake at the Pinehurst boat ramp. She told the city council the rural fire board had voted in January of 2010 not to draft water out of the lake. Brice Wagner had come to the city council at their June 16, 2011 meeting and offered possible financial assistance from the rural fire board to the city if they would install the Pinehurst floating boat dock footings. The docks have been stored adjacent to the City’s water treatment plant for several years. Wagner made it clear he was speaking for himself and not the board in offering assistance.

Lochass called Garrison Lake the poster child for invasive species and that at the next fire board meeting on August 18 they would have someone from the Forest Service at the meeting to talk about invasive species. There is a small New Zealand mud snail that has made its home in Garrison Lake, Floras Lake and New River. These snails would get in the water tanks if the department did draft out of Garrison Lake necessitating the haz-mat cleaning of the tanks. She said after a fire in which water was drafted out of the lake the entire firefighting apparatus would have to be disinfected. She said it was Oregon law prohibiting the possession, release or transporting of prohibited species. She said if you

draft water from Garrison Lake you will end up with the snails in the tank, they will carpet everything and they are hard to kill and that the fire department has drafting sources for water they can use other than the lake.

City public works director Allan Wagner told the council that the drafting point at the Pinehurst floating boat ramp would be for emergencies only. He said it would be a moot point in an emergency if the city water system goes down. City Administrator Mike Murphy said if the water system goes down it would be an emergency and the drafting point would be another tool in the tool box the fire department could use to put out the fires. He said the drafting point would help in an emergency.

The council took up the issue under new business with Councilor Tim Pogwizd making a motion for the council to approve the entire letter to the Fire Board regarding the Pinehurst floating dock. Councilor Caroline Clancy said it was up to the Fire Board to discuss and deal with the situation. She asked the letter be limited to the first paragraph only and sent to the board in that manner. Councilor Pogwizd said the letter was asking for money and nothing

else. The vote was 4-1 in favor with Clancy voting no.

The issue goes to the Rural Fire Board who will vote to either help support the City financially or not with the installation of the floating boat dock footings.

Mike Murphy and Councilor Bill McArdle recently attended a meeting on water systems. Murphy emphasized that more local funding will be needed for repairing or replacing municipal water systems. He said at most there were grants available for 15% of the total cost but in the future there won't be any USDA grant funding. This means cities will have to rebuild their water systems without help. He described the projects of the future as being piecemeal with the city paying the cost alone.

Not all is lost in the world of independent one of a kind restaurants as She She's in Gasquet, California on Highway 199 is going strong this summer. My friend Rick and I took a Sunday drive to Cave Junction via Highway 101, 197 and 199 and stopped in for lunch at She She's, owned and operated by Al and Sheila (She She) Leverett. She She's serves basic American food like hamburgers which Sheila, who is the cook, hand forms. Their French fries are made from whole potatoes that are peeled and then sliced into fries. ## Free Astronomy Presentation

Dr. Reginald J. Dufour, Professor of Astrophysics at Rice University, has scheduled a presentation at Southwestern Oregon Community College (SWOCC) to discuss the birth and life cycle of stars, focusing on how they end their lives. The August 12 event, titled "Fantastic Ways Stars Die and What They Leave Behind," will be held at 7:00 p.m. in Eden 1 on SWOCC's Coos Campus.

Dufour will use photographs taken with the Hubble Space Telescope and large Earth-based telescopes to give attendees of his presentation a colorful tour of stars and their remnants throughout the Milky Way Galaxy, followed with an opportunity for people to ask questions. The public is invited to the free presentation.

Astronomers have shown that stars are born in the gas formed after the Big Bang. These stars change remarkably as they evolve and die in cataclysmic events. Massive stars create the brightest flashes seen in the universe when they explode, leaving behind remarkable objects like black holes and pulsars.

By contrast, lower mass stars like our own sun live much longer and turn into red giants. The sun will one day grow enough before it dies to consume the Earth. Only a tiny Earth-sized white dwarf star will remain, surrounded by a beautiful planetary nebula. These various features contain the key elements of life that enable new stars with planets to form.

Dufour has been studying these stellar remnants from Earth and space telescopes for the past 35 years. He was notified June 8th he was awarded 32 orbits of Hubble Space Telescope time to study planetary nebulae. The 32 orbits of the space telescope is roughly equivalent to 50 hours valued at about \$1 million.

### **This Week In The Garden By Jennifer Ewing**

Last week we talked about using and preserving basil so this week I'd like to mention a few other herbs and how to save them for later use.

Seems like everybody has a rosemary plant in their yard, either upright or creeping. Rosemary along with oregano, thyme and sage are herbs that have more powerful flowers when used dried. Easily done! Anytime they are not blooming, cut little bunches of these herbs, wrap their stems tightly with rubber bands and, using reconfigured paper clips, hang these bouquets somewhere to dry out of the sunlight. If you wrap the stems with string, as they dry and shrink, the herbs will fall to the floor! When they are crispy dry, you may store them in jars, preferably brown or green jars like vitamins come in, to keep the sunlight from degrading the flavor of the herb. Here's a hint for stretching the life of your herbs stored in jars: keep them in a dark cupboard away from the heat of the stove.

I touched on not cutting herbs for use when they are Not blooming because when they are in bloom, they are in another stage of growth that changes their chemical makeup and this affects their volatile oils. These oils are the very reason we use them for flavoring. When they are in bloom, it changes this flavor, usually not the taste we are after.



If you care about: Blacklock Point, Floras Lake, migratory birds, or noise and pollution from jets flying low over Port Orford, then please attend the town hall meeting on Aug. 16 at 5:30 pm in our library.

We are very familiar with Hailey, Idaho which sits about a dozen miles south of Sun Valley and is the airport for that resort destination. Hailey's airport resembles the setting of Cape Blanco in ways. On any given day, it is common to see anywhere from 10 to 35 private and corporate jets parked in Hailey. Many of these are the size of standard commercial passenger jets. These large jets however arrive with a mere handful of passengers at most, carried in the height of luxury and evidently caring little about their carbon footprint.
