### Planter Goes Back To Council By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford Planning Commission meetings are usually lightly attended but not last Tuesday night as a large crowd showed up for the Commission discussion of the ROW (short for City Right-of-Way Usage License) for the Triangle Square Planters. This ROW had been dealt with at the July 21 city council meeting and on a vote of the council sent back to the planning commission with a request for "correct dimensions, the drawings and more information on the size, height, traffic access, visibility and parking. The ROW has been revised and now has adjacent property owners Ed Beck and Russell Ucolano signed onto it. The ROW was originally turned into the planning commission on their meeting date of July 12 by Karen Auburn though by then the planter had been built. This under the assumption it was built on ODOT right of way and that ODOT had given permission for the project.

Planning Commission chairman Dave Holman began the meeting after the minutes were approved by letting people speak for three minutes on the planter at Triangle Square. Paula Cracas read a statement in which she reminded the commission this issue was about the

"rules" which weren't abided by in this case. The original ROW applied for by Karen Auburn for the planter was for one four feet by two but Cracas said it ended up being over twice as big. She said the planter was illegal from the moment it was built and it ended up being 7 feet by 9 feet. Cracas said the planter should be removed.

Councilor Caroline Clancy told Chairman Holman he should recuse himself from the discussion as he is an employee of ODOT and ODOT has been involved in this planter situation. Holman said he worked in the ODOT office next to Jeff Waddington but he, Holman, had nothing to do with the decision to approve this planter and that this wasn't an official land use hearing. He did not recuse himself. Gary Robertson is also on the planning commission and designed the planters and rock wall for Triangle Square working pro bono. He made a point of telling people the design he came up with was not the one that was followed by the builder. He said he had checked with the city attorney and online about his participation and based on that information did not need to recuse himself.

Elaine Roemen who is partners with Karen Auburn in the TriSquArt art

gallery said the discussion about the planter had become unreasonable and that the negative accusations were preposterous. Ed Beck told the commission the planter would not inhibit trucks getting into and out of the Pitch's Tavern parking lot. Beck said he now parks his truck adjacent to the planter and it blocks RVs from taking up that space prohibiting them from parking in the middle of the street. Police Chief Marvin Combs spoke on the safety issues of the planter telling the Commission the height was fine and there shouldn't be a problem with trucks getting into the Pitch's parking lot. He said he saw no issue safety wise. Jack Pruitt called the look of the planter sleazy construction and urged the commission to get in touch with someone to clean it up. Karen Auburn is on the planning commission but had recused herself from this issue and thus spoke from the floor. She said she wanted to be a good neighbor to Pitch's and was sorry the builder of the planter had been subjected to so much abuse. Commission member Carolyn LaRoche asked when the two additional signatures had been put on the ROW and was told by Auburn between the last council meeting and this evening.

The commission closed off public comment and went into deliberations. It was up to the commission to look at the ROW license and decide whether or not to send it to the city council with a recommendation or a lack of recommendation. Gary Robertson said he wanted the plants in the planter to be no more than three feet tall. When discussing whether this was a legal planter or not Dave Holman said the ROW process was attempted correctly with ODOT having given their verbal approval for it. Along the way ODOT decided the planter area on Sixth Street was a city street and not part of Highway 101. Holman made a point that an ROW license can be revoked by the city at any time. He said he didn't see a problem with parking or visibility with the planter.

Commission member Sam Scaffo said the planter project was not adjacent to the three property owners' properties but across the street. He said it was removed from their properties by the

street. Dave Holman said removal of any project done by an ROW licensee is their responsibility to remove.

Gary Robertson made a motion the commission approved the ROW and that the planter not exceed 18" in height and that the plants inside it not to exceed 30 inches in height and that a maintenance agreement needs to be entered into with the ROW licensees with the property owners to maintain the plants and planter. After a bit more discussion Gary Robertson made a second motion that the commission approves the ROW with the stipulation that the planter be no higher than 18 inches and the plants no higher than 30 inches and that the licensess be responsible for the maintenance. This time Sam Scaffo seconded the motion. Scaffo again mentioned his concern that the project is across the street from the three businesses noting the precedent of that situation. He joined with Carolyn LaRoche in voting no on the motion with Kuhn, Holman and Robertson voting yes and the motion carried. The planter issue now goes back to the city council this Thursday night, August 18

with a recommendation of approval from the planning commission.

### Letter To The Editor,

This week the City Council once again takes up the issue of granting a Right of Way usage license to the Mayor, his wife and a few of their neighbors at the corner of 6th Street and Washington (Dock Road) to allow the completion of the planter and wall complex began without clear permissions earlier last month.

First, the request deviates from the typical ROW request in that the property requested is across the street from the parties wishing to use it, and not directly adjacent as is the usual case. The usage is on city property directly bordering the ODOT Highway 101 & 6th Street parking area boundary.

Secondly, the current request is now from multiple (three) property owners. This means that any maintenance or other requests from the city must be addressed to and shared by multiple individuals, making these simple tasks much more complicated.

However, as this ROW license is not a recorded document, and does not commit or encumber the actual properties in any way, once the properties are sold, or transferred to others, the city has no real recourse for performance of maintenance or other duties. Even with the inclusion of a 'maintenance agreement' by the parties to the city, the legal recourse is very limited.

Finally, when it is time to remove the project the original requestors will have likely moved on and the city will have to remove the project at its own expense.

It seems much more practical that if is such a benefactor exists that wishes to pay for this planter project, that the money be donated to the City of Port Orford directly as a grant, and have it done properly by the Parks, or Public

Works Departments. This way it's done correctly, with full city control, as it should be on city property.



### Man Drowns On Sixes River

On August 14, 2011 at about 2:27 pm, the Curry County Sheriff's Office received multiple 911 calls reporting there was a possible drowning victim on the Sixes River and that CPR was in progress. The incident location was reported to be near Edson Creek Campground, located approximately 4 miles up Sixes River Road from Highway 101 in north Curry County.

Ambulance, fire rescue and Sheriff's Deputies were dispatched to respond, with assistance from Port Orford Police Department. People on scene reported that a man was found underwater and pulled to the shore where CPR efforts were begun. Emergency medical responders arrived on scene and took over the revival efforts which were eventually unsuccessful and the man was determined to be deceased.



### Sheriff's Rescue

On August 10, 2011 at about 9:20 pm, the Curry County Sheriff's Office received a telephone call from Langlois Oregon resident, Katherine Phillips, reporting that her ninety-three year old brother-in-law, Norvel (Sarge) Phillips had apparently walked away from his residence on Kerber Lane sometime in the late afternoon or early evening and they could not find him. It was reported that Phillips was dressed warmly. Friends and neighbors started searching for Phillips while Sheriff's Deputies responded to the area. Deputies arrived and assisted in searching the roads and surrounding neighborhood properties. These initial search efforts were suspended after midnight. A call-out for all SAR personnel was made and plans for a thorough daylight search were formulated. As searchers were re-deploying, at about 7:50am, Langlois resident Tom Sheppard found Phillips in the brush not far from Phillips residence when Phillips yelled out. Phillips had walked out to Highway 101 and then down a driveway behind the residence of Ellen Tomaschewski. Phillips apparently had fallen asleep and could not hear searchers during the night.
