Port Orford Demonstration By Evan Kramer

Over 100 people turned out on Saturday, October 15, in Port Orford as people in cities and countries all over the world demonstrated in support of the one month long Occupy Wall Street movement. The Port Orford participants started gathering at 11:00am in front of the Driftwood School athletic field armed only with banners, posters, signs and musical instruments. It was a colorful group and as peaceful a gathering as can be – much more so than the average Port Orford City Council meeting. Since we don't do photos in this paper I'll simply quote from many of the signs that people held in front of Driftwood School that pleasant sunny morning. "Enough We R the 99%, Tax the Rich, Cut Military Spending, Too Big to Fail is too big to allow, We are the one!, Cake and Cadillacs for everyone, Health Care for all a civil right, Change the System, Wake up America, Stop Wall-shington, Too big to fail is too big to bail, We cannot afford endless war, Veterans for Peace, I'm with the 99% who prefer democracy, Tax the filthy rich, End the Fed, and We Support the 99%. After spending about an hour waving their banners and signs at people driving and walking by the group headed down Highway 101 to Battle

Rock Park where they reassembled for more music, sign waving, a group photo, conversation and music. Most of the response from people driving by was enthusiastic though not all were positive but things stayed calm no matter the differences of opinion were between people. There seemed to be no police presence and there was none needed.

People attended the Occupy Port Orford event from Gold Beach, Brookings, and Bandon, Langlois and Port Orford. By 12:30pm some people took off while others stayed and kept up the conversation and made their presence at Battle Rock Park. There were similar demonstrations of support for Occupy Wall Street in other parts of Oregon including Roseburg, Portland and Eugene. One of the few places the demonstrations got violent was in Rome but in Port Orford and the rest of America it was people expressing their first amendment rights peacefully.

Skate Park Update By Brenda Dell

The skate park had a complete clean & paint job thanks to Lori Linville and Jason Shumaker of Liquid Stone Designs, LLC.

They deserve Huge KUDOS for a job well done. Port Orford was lucky to have them come in to do the job.

In a statement from Lori she says: "We appreciate the opportunity to keep the skate park safe and functional for the kids and all park users."

They cleaned the entire surface of the skate park, painted the small bowl, the coping and painted the large bowl blue with a white trim around the top. A total of 12 cans of paint were used (down to the last drop) plus materials and labor for a total of just over \$1200 in costs. This was paid for out of the Skate Park Fund. These monies were available thanks to the community's support and generosity.

The Skate Park needs to have this done on a regular basis to keep the surface in shape, also it needs to be repaired/repainted when someone uses it to write or paint graffiti on the surface. At a cost of approximately \$50 per can of paint plus labor it is costly.

With this latest clean up our coffers are low, so once again I am asking for the communities support and help to keep this park in shape. Your donation of any size is greatly appreciated. You can donate directly to the PO Skate Park

Letter to the Editor,

Former Mayor John Roorbach's recent letter proposed new taxes to improve our local economy. Our region's traditional primary businesses are logging, lumbering, and fishing. They generate the wealth that supports many Oregonians not dependent on unemployment insurance, pensions, annuities, or Social Security. Our Federal Government's environmental and trade policies already cripple those industries. New taxes would kill them.

Maybe Mr. Roorbach believed that General Custer needed more Indians.

Instead, we need to junk many Federal policies. We need to junk "environmental" laws and agreements that kill jobs to save allegedly endangered wildlife. We need to junk trade treaties that kill American jobs while rewarding foreign companies for undermining our economy.

Mr. Roorbach's last sentence says, "Support the US Congress in going after currently nontaxable overseas U.S. corporate funds and in bringing back our out-sourced jobs." U.S. corporations send money overseas to earn higher profits than our domestic tax structure allows. Abolishing those taxes will bring that money back. And, companies export American jobs partly to earn tax breaks, and partly to enjoy foreign labor's supposedly superior net value.

American companies are beginning to see not only that "cheap" foreigners cost extra money to train, but have costly work habits. Abolish the tax breaks that made hiring them attractive, and many American companies will hire at home.

Regulation reduces jobs. Taxation reduces pay. Smash those shackles, and we will earn more shekels.

HPV Immunization

For a limited time, the Curry County Health Department is offering females

age 19-26 the opportunity to receive the HPV (Human Papillomavirus Vaccine) injection free.

The HPV vaccine is a series of three shots over a six month period costing \$450. Through the Department of Human Services State Vaccine Program and a grant from OAIC (Oregon Adult Immunization Coalition) the cost is free for a limited time.

Gardasil (HPV) injection helps to protect against two types of HPV that causes about 75% of cervical cancer and two types that cause 90% of genital wart cases. It also helps to protect you from 70% of vaginal cancer cases and up to 50% of vulvar cancer cases.

Common Murres Dying

Recently there have been hundreds of dead birds found on the sand at Battle Rock Beach and Port Beach. These birds are common murres. They live on the rocks and off shore islands off the coast and have been seen in all too big numbers washed up on the beaches.

A leading Port Orford birder believes that the murres washing up were from some big storm events—in particular, big waves—that separated adults from young. The young cannot dive and so the father dives and feeds them; in the big waves they can get separated from their dads. Because storms came a little early this year, the juveniles weren't quite ready to go it on their own yet and thus many of the perished.

Common murres live on small fish known to fishermen as bait fish like anchovies and sardines. According to a couple of local fishermen the murres have died off because of the lack of bait fish off our coast but the ones which have been found dead on the beaches are the young ones and not the adults. The common murre's backside plumage is black which contrasts with their white

chest. When a murre is in the standing up position is looks like a small penguin. A long time ago harvesting murre eggs was common along the coast but it is no longer legal for the public to access the offshore islands.
