Remember The Silver Door By Evan Kramer

This past Saturday afternoon the Port Orford Public Library held a very merry unbirthday party and cake auction and drew a nice crowd of people. Port Orford Librarian Tobe Porter got things underway with a brief talk about the library which is of course now open seven days a week – in itself quite a feat. Our library was recently selected by the Library Journal as one of America's Star Libraries. The data on our library was collected in 2009 and we received our excellent score in July of this year. The scores were based on circulation, visits, public internet use and program attendance. We were rated with libraries in the \$100,000-\$199,000 budget range.

The Library Journal article about the Port Orford Library noted that donations, government grants and private grants paid for the entire cost of the \$2.2 million project and that a voter approved bond measure was not needed though it did pass. The library opened in July of 2008 debt free and has stayed that way. One thing that worked out to Port Orford's benefit is our library is not county funded like those in other Oregon counties like Josephine and Jackson where libraries were forced to close due to budget cuts. They may

have reopened but either with volunteer labor only or as in the case of the big downtown Medford library only open 24 hours a week and they are not open on Thursday, Friday and Sunday at all. Our library has its own taxing district and has had one since the library district levy passed on March 29, 1983; the voters having approved the formation of a library district on November 2, 1982. (thanks to Shirley Nelson and her book "Home at Last" which is a history of the Port Orford Library. At one time Curry County's libraries were county funded but with the county now facing bankruptcy that would have been a catastrophe for the libraries if they hadn't gotten their own taxing districts.

The cake auction was conducted by Rolando Rodriguez with the first cake going to the winning bidder for \$75. The cakes and pie had all been donated by local people and businesses. Some cakes went for \$75 with others going for prices of \$30 and \$35. The auction raised about \$1,100 for the library. Tobe Porter interrupted the cake auction to talk about the Port Orford Library Foundation Board whose goal it is to be build an endowment fund of \$500,000 so that the library can stay independent and debt free forever. The tax base isn't sufficient to pay people what they are worth and if it wasn't for the large pool

of volunteers the library couldn't be open as many hours as it is. The interest or earnings off the endowment fund will be used to help fund library business from employees to books and supplies.

The cake auction I won was for a coconut cream pie made by Paul and Pat Lee. Pat used to be the assistant librarian under Bonnie Wagner when the library was located at Port Orford City Hall. Her and husband Paul also owned and operated the now legendary restaurant The Silver Door. It was located where the Crazy Norwegian's is now though it was much smaller. The Lee's made a few dishes each day; say Swiss steak and mashed potatoes, lasagna, baked chicken or pizza. They also served homemade pies and coffee and when they sold out of that day's entrees that was it and there was no more food until the next day. They did not fry their food but baked it and the special ingredient always was love of what they were doing and for their customers. The restaurant closed in 1993 and is fondly remembered by many. It was a sign of the changing times that at the cake auction there were many cake bidders who didn't know what Tobe Porter was talking about when she spoke of the Silver Door whose famous slogan was

People were treated to a slice of Happy Unbirthday cake, made by Brenda Dell, in the Freedom of Speech room. It was a huge triple layer vanilla, strawberry and chocolate cake delightfully decorated and now only exists in the photos Brenda took of it.

We all use the library differently. Since we have Internet at home and our store I don't need to use their computers but what I like is their selection of good old fashioned books – no Kindle for me just yet. The Port Orford Volunteer Fire department is delighted to announce the arrival of our "new to us" pumper/ fire engine!!! This is the culmination of years of dedicated work by numerous people. This project began nearly 3 years ago when Port Orford Fire Captain David Johnson alerted us to the possible availability of grant funds for the purchase of a pumper. A grant was written and with great foresight the then seated Port Orford Rural Fire District Board (John Johnston, Edna Auld, Marie Van Aart. Ed Tennant and Rick Hazard), voted to commit matching District funds (a requirement to receive the grant). So much time passed with no notification that we assumed the grant would not happen. Then suddenly, we were approved for the funding. That was August of 2010.

It has taken over a year of constant daily searching to find the truck that met our needs. Hundreds of hours. emails, phone calls ensued during that time. There were many days when we felt we would not find what we wanted for the price we could afford. We had several "almost", many "maybes" and numerous disappointments.

NOW the truck is HERE!!!! It is awesome and all that we had hoped it would be. It is a 2004 Pierce Contender, capable of carrying 8 firefighters. It has fewer than 20,000 miles on it. It has 5 air pack seats, carries 1000 gallons of water and has tremendous horse power for our steep hills. The length and turning radius will allow us into tight areas. It is lime/ safety green with a blue stripe. Rather than spend the money to paint it red, we will spend the money on equipment.... so when you see "The Green Machine", look for the Port Orford name on the side.

We still have many hours to devote to the truck before it is in service. We must outfit it with our remaining grant funds, run it through many trial tests and learn about it. Nonetheless, we are excited that it is here and we are anxious to get it into service for you.

Many thanks to those who have worked so long and hard on this project. Our community will benefit for many, many years to come. David Johnson, Assistant Chiefs Wade Phillips and David Duncan deserve special recognition as does Edna Auld for their incredible time commitment and attention to detail. We also wish to thank Bruce Curtain with the USDA for his steadfast support help and encouragement.

Community Co-Op Meeting

A meeting to update citizens about the progress of the Port Orford CommUnity Co-op is scheduled for November 30th at 6:00 pm in the Port Orford City Council Chambers. Everyone is encouraged to attend this meeting and learn about the co-op's progress and how they can become involved. The Port Orford CommUnity Co-op steering committee members are committed to launching a store that will enhance the community by establishing a year-round market to showcase local/regional food, crafts, and services.

The concept of a local co-op began early this year when local citizens saw a need and an opportunity to invest in Port Orford through local food and products. The committee has worked diligently with project manager, Susan Brown, and Northwest Cooperative Development Center to build a solid foundation for the co-op. There are still many areas of research and planning that need to be completed. The scheduled community meeting will highlight the progress of the co-op and present the work that still needs to be accomplished.

The Port Orford CommUnity Co-op committee applied for grant funding through USDA, supported by the City of Port Orford, and received a grant award of \$15,000 to develop all of the planning documents and business structure plans. The grant will fund the development of

these documents by contracting with Northwest Cooperative Development Center for the feasibility study and marketing analysis, and Susan Brown Project Development for the business and marketing plan, business and board of directors structure, strategic planning, membership drive, website and project management. The committee will donate hundreds of hours of volunteer time towards the grant funded project, and it is important to note that the City of Port Orford is not expending any of its financial resources, but will assist in non-financial ways.

A cooperative (also co-operative or coop) is a business organization owned and operated by a group of individuals for their mutual benefit. A cooperative is defined by the International Cooperative Alliance's Statement on the Cooperative Identity as "an autonomous association of persons united voluntarily to meet their common economic, social, and cultural needs and aspirations through jointly owned and democratically controlled enterprise". A cooperative may also be defined as a business owned and controlled equally by the people who use its services or by the people who work there.



Box 1268, Port Orford, OR 97465. A member of our staff will contact you as soon as possible. Capital credits not claimed 6 months after the last published notice, scheduled for January 2012, will be forfeited.
