Vicki Courtright Wins Award

The Port Orford and North Curry County Chamber of Commerce held their annual awards dinner last Saturday night at the Port and Starboard Restaurant with some 40 people in attendance. The Chamber handed out six major awards starting with the lifetime achievement award which went to Vicki Courtright. Vicki has been in Port Orford around 40 years now and at one time she and her husband Bob Courtright, a marine biologist, owned an art gallery in Port Orford called The Art Hatchery. Their building is the one that now plays host to the Downtown Fun Zone. The Courtrights made many major improvements to the building at 832 N. Oregon Street and for that we thank them! Vicki now works at McNair True Value Hardware Store on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays. She has been there for 17 years at what some people call "the girl's hardware store". Vicki knows more about hardware than most of us will ever know and is a big help to people coming in the store with questions about how to get something done.

The Special Achievement Award went to Ronn Kerr. Ronn served as president of the Chamber of Commerce in 2002 and 2003 and was one of the original

ten directors of the America's Wild Rivers Coast organization when it was founded in 2002. He currently serves as the president of the Port Orford Rotary Club which is holding its annual crab feed this Saturday night, February 4, at the Community Building. Ronn is also the Pastor of the Zion Lutheran Church in Port Orford.

The Volunteer of the Year award went to Gail Conwell. Gail retired from Chetco Federal Credit Union a few years ago and now is a volunteer at the Battle Rock Park Visitor Center. Gail also helps organize and put on the annual children's free Christmas Bazaar at her church, the Port Orford Christian Center, and the free school supply program held in August of each year at the church. Gail runs the Meals on Wheels program here in Port Orford. Gail and her late husband Bob owned and operated City Subs in downtown Coos Bay before selling it to the current owners. It was and continues to be a very successful restaurant.

The business of the year award went to the Paradise Café owned by Laura Eades. This very popular dining spot in town is known for good quality big breakfasts and lunches and is a big favorite of Valerie's. The restaurant was known as Lura's Galley when we

moved to town in 1990 and evolved into the current Paradise Café under several owners. Laura is like most Port Orford business owners an "owner-operator" as that is what it takes to survive in business in this town.

The Organization of the Year award went to the Port Orford Senior Center. The Center hosts a multitude of activities including the monthly breakfast, classes, the upcoming Senior Prom, and is a place to spend time with friends playing pool or just talking.

The Non-Profit organization of the Year went to Coastal Home Health and Hospice located in Gold Beach but serving all of Curry County and doing a great job of it. Curry Home Health & Hospice was part of the Curry County government structure until a year ago but is now an independent non-profit agency.

The above award winners were all presented with beautiful myrtlewood plaques made by the Wooden Nickel in Port Orford.

CCEC News By Christine Stallard

As an ongoing effort to review and update policies, the Coos-Curry Electric Cooperative, Inc. (CCEC) refined the vision and mission statements that guide the daily operations and strategic initiatives at the cooperative. "Our vision is to exceed member expectations," board president Pete Radabaugh told the board during the discussion. "I

want to be clear, to our employees, our members and others we interact with that our goal is to always be thinking about what we are doing and how those actions are working to make this the best organization possible and exceed the expectations others may have of us." The cooperative's mission statement is to "provide reliable electric service at reasonable rates."

The board of directors will also recommend a change in the board nomination process. According to the existing Bylaws, the board of directors appoints a committee on nominations within each district having a board member with a term retiring at the next annual meeting. Each nominating committee prepares a list of one or more nominations for board positions.

In the proposed changes to the Bylaws, that will be presented to the membership as part of this year's annual meeting, the board of directors is recommending that cooperative members in a district that has a board member's term expiring for that particular year, may nominate a qualified district candidate to represent

that district by filing a written petition signed by at least fifteen qualified cooperative members in the district for which the director is to be elected. This includes the incumbents and is proposed to put all candidates on an equal footing during the nomination process. All qualified candidates, nominated by petition, would then be placed on the cooperative's ballot.

The change would not take effect until after a vote of the membership in May of this year; and if approved by the membership, would be in place to guide elections in future years.

As you all know by now driving and talking on your cell phone without a hands free device is a violation in the State of Oregon. We are going to be working this type of violation here in the Port Orford area and wanted to give you notice that we will be issuing citation for this violation. Here is the statue pertaining to Oregon Law.

811.507 Operating A Motor Vehicle While Using A Telecommunications Device (Cell Phone) D-V \$110.00

You cannot text while driving.

You cannot use a handheld mobile communications device while driving

Exceptions: Drivers of roadside assistance or tow trucks.

Drivers of utility vehicles for the purpose of servicing a utility.

Drivers using a mobile communications device for purposes of farming or agricultural operations.

Drivers in an emergency when no one else is available to make the call.

We also have noticed that drivers are illegally backing out of the parking spots around the Post Office, we have observed near crashes at that location. Please take note of the following statue on this violation in Oregon

811.480 Illegal Backing (D-V) \$110.00

If the person backs a vehicle the person driving when it is not safe to do so or when it causes interference with other traffic upon a highway.

The Port Orford Police and all Law Enforcement Department will be conducting a two week blitz on the "Click it or Ticket" program. Make sure you have your seatbelt on and not talking on your cell phones while driving. You will be cited for these violation during this blitz time.

Letter To The Editor,

Concerning the last Fire Board meeting at Cedar Terrace, January 19, 2012, the proposed policy change presented by Brice Wagner was questioned as to it being an illegal presentation. According to ORS 192.640 and ORS 192.640(1) the public meeting law requires that he notice of any meeting "include a list of the principal subjects anticipated to be considered at the meeting" the fact that three people knew of the presentation before the meeting was in itself illegal, because it was not posted on the agenda for the public and all others to know of the proposed policy change. According to ORS 182.020(1), all members of the governing body should receive actual notice, but was not the case at this meeting. Ken Fliszar and Wade Philips had no knowledge of the proposed policy change, although in my opinion, the chairman, Joe Marsh, Brice Wagner and the secretary, Kim Stang, knew of this matter beforehand.

The law requires a reasonable effort to inform the public and interested persons, including news media, of the nature of the more important issues ("principal subjects") coming before the body.

It was obvious that three individuals knew of this prior to the meeting, especially the secretary as, she didn't even glance at it while others were reading it.

I guess what my concern is, when individuals had known about this proposed policy change, prior to the meeting, then what was the reason for not putting it on the agenda, was this deception on their part? Having attended several meetings, it appears to me that Brice Wagner had something to give to the board at the last minute in most of all meetings, even in the middle of a motion on the floor. Does Brice Wagner not want the board members, Ken and Wade and the public to know ahead of time, as was the case at this meeting, because that is how it appeared to me.

The goal of notice for any meeting is two-fold: to provide general notice to the public at large and to provide actual notice to specifically interested persons, ORS 192.630(1), (2). This was not done. The policy change was basically a done deal, in my opinion, without the input of Ken Fliszar and Wade Philips, two board members. Ken and Wade asked that this be tabled till the next meeting so that they could look it over, and confer with Fire Chief Gayle Wilcox, and get some input from Gayle. On page 115(A) third paragraph states: and I quote "We have acknowledged that strict compliance with the substantive requirement so the Public Meetings Law frequently may "sacrifice speed and spontaneity for more process and formality". Nonetheless, we believe that the law's requirements generally will not interfere with a public body's administration." End of quote. I could go on for pages but you who read this can check it all out on ORS 192.610 to 192.690.

By the way I was present for the whole meeting.

Transparency and honesty leads to a more informed public.

The recent letter from Mayor Auburn stated that I was party to the adoption by the Port Orford Fire Protection District Board of the new policy of automatic mutual aid with Sixes River Fire Protection District. It is important to note that I Did Not vote in favor of this because:

1) I could not vote for or against this because I am not a member of the Board.

2) Additionally, I (and 2 Board members) asked for this issue to be moved to the next month's agenda so all involved (the community, the Fire Department, and the Board) could be well prepared to discuss this issue. This request was not granted.

3) In my opinion, this vote violated Oregon Public Meetings laws (ORS 192.610-690). It was not on the agenda as presented or posted. I would not have participated in this vote.

I am sorry that the Mayor has been misinformed regarding my participation in this vote. He was not there and therefore, whoever provided him with this

misinformation should have provided him with more accurate information.

Most of the Port Orford Fire Department members attended this meeting. We expect the Board to set an example of adherence to the highest standards in all actions. The decision by 3 members of the Board not to follow the ORS requirements for meetings with adequate public notification is of concern.

This Week in The Garden

Last week we mapped out on a calendar when to start seeds you have purchased but I didn't tell you How to start those seeds, did I? Let's do it.

The proper equipment makes it easier but ad-lib where you must. I prefer to start my seeds in six-packs, black plastic squares with six cells in them. Purchase a bag or two of soil-less seed-starting mix. Do not start seed indoors in soil from your garden or in compost. Those choices are too potent and bear too many critters and pathogens for your tender, delicate seedlings to deal with as they start their new life. Moisten this bag of seed-starting mix before filling your six-pack cells with it. (I caution new seed starters to not use peat pots or peat pellets for seed-starting. They dry out incredibly fast between waterings and this is very detrimental to seeds that need to be kept moist in order to swell and germinate.) Sow seeds as instructed on the seed packet and water them in with a gentle spray. Label the six-packs so you know what you've got.

Growing seeds on a windowsill simply doesn't work. Those new babies will only stretch and weaken if trying to find sun on a southern Oregon coast windowsill. If you don't have a greenhouse to use and must start seed indoors, set up a cheap system of shop lights and cool white fluorescent bulbs hung above your flats of seeds on chains so as the seeds grow you can raise the shop fixtures. The heat of your house, laundry room or basement is usually enough to aid in germination. It's easy to do and has always worked well for me when a greenhouse has not been available.

More on seed starting next week. Stay tuned.
